

- Early years: 4.6% (134 children) of the population were aged 0 to 4 years in March 2011. This compares with 5.1% at County level, 6.3% regionally and 6.3% nationally.
 - School age: 15.8% (458 children) of the population were aged 5 to 17 years in March 2011. This compares with 14.9% at County level, 15.8% regionally and 15.1% nationally.
 - Working age: 56.3% (1629 people) of the population were aged 18 to 64 years in March 2011. This compares with 59.3% at County level, 61.0% regionally and 62.3% nationally.
- Retirement age: 23.3% (674 people) of the population were aged 65 and over in March 2011. This compares with 20.7% at County level, 16.9% regionally and 16.3% nationally.
- Over 85 year olds: 3.4% (98) of the population were aged 85 and over in March 2011. This compares with 2.7% at County level, 2.2% regionally and 2.2% nationally.

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Diversity

- The 2011 Census showed Prees Parish had a black and minority ethnic group population of 65 (2.25%). The largest broad ethnic group is 'Asian' (within this the largest groups are 'Indian' and 'Chinese'). For the first time the 2011 Census showed Prees Parish had a gypsy population of 33.
- When asked about their religion 21.0% (608 people) identified themselves as having no religion or did not state it on the form. The majority of people (78.2%) identified themselves as Christian and 0.8% (23 people) identified themselves as having an alternative religion.
- The 2011 Census showed that 10 people could not speak English well and 1 person could not speak English at all.

Car Ownership

• The 2011 Census showed that 105 households (9.0%) did not own a car and subsequently were reliant on other forms of transport such as public transport services. In total 2,014 cars/vans were owned by households resident in the parish.

Health

General Health

The 2011 Census asked three questions relating to health and the provision of unpaid care. The questions relate to whether people felt their general health was good, whether they looked after or gave help or support to other family members, friends, neighbours or others and lastly whether their day to day activities were limited because of a health problem or disability.

- At the time of the 2011 Census 45% of people in Prees said that they felt they were in "Very Good Health", this compares to 46% for Shropshire as a whole.
- 1.2% reported that they were in "Very Bad Health". This is slightly higher than the overall result for Shropshire (1%).

Provision of Unpaid Care

The question asked "do you look after, or give any help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of either; a long term physical or mental ill health/disability? or because of problems related to old age?


- At the time of the Census 9% said that they were providing 1 to 19 hours of unpaid care a week. This is slightly higher than the Shropshire figure of 7%.
- 2% said they provided between 20 and 49 hours per unpaid care. This is slightly higher than the Shropshire figure of 1%.
- 3% said they provided over 50 hours of unpaid care. This is slightly higher than the figure for Shropshire as a whole (2%) and England & Wales (2%).

Long Term Illness or Disability

The Census asked "Are your day-to-day activities limited a lot due to a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

- 10% said that their day-to-day activities limited a lot due to a health problem or disability. This is higher than the figure for Shropshire as a whole and that of 9% for England and Wales.
- The percentage who reported their day-to-day activities were limited a little was 11%. This is slightly higher than the figure of 10% for Shropshire as a whole.

The lower super output areas that cover Prees Parish fall within deciles 3 and 5 nationally.

Housing

- There were 1161 households in Prees at the time of the 2011 Census.
- The parish had 2895 usual residents and covers an area of 3338 hectares.
- 567 households were owner occupiers (owned outright) equating to 48.8% of all households. There were 382 households (32.9%) who owned their home with a mortgage or loan.
- There were 90 households (7.8% of all households) that privately rented their home from a landlord. There were also 11 households (0.9% of all households) who privately rented from a landlord classified as 'Other'.
- 16 households were renting social housing from the Council totalling 1.4% of all households. There were also 79 households (6.8%) renting social housing from 'Other' sources.
- In Prees there were 816 detached dwellings representing 67.5% of all dwellings. There were also 295 semi-detached and 57 terraced dwellings equating to 24.4% and 4.7% respectively.
- 14.6% of all households were one person pensioner households.
- 26.8% of households in the area had dependent children. The number of married couple households with dependent children was 188 and the number of cohabiting couples with dependent children was 44.
- There were 45 lone parent households (with dependent children), which equates to 3.9% of all households.
- During 2012-2013 there were 8 housing completions (gross) within the Prees Parish. Included in this figure are 3 affordable housing units. During this time 1 dwelling was lost during development.
- At April 2013 there were 192 dwellings with planning permission outstanding, including 42 affordable houses.
- At April 2013, 0 proposed dwellings were part of the current Shropshire Council housing allocations. However, as part of the on-going preparation of the Site Allocations and Management of Development Plan (SAMDev) Plan, the Planning Policy team is now consulting on the 'Revised Preferred Options'.

Unemployment and Labour Market

Unemployment

- At the time of the Census, there were 66 residents who were unemployed but available for work. This is 3.2% of the 16-74 year old population, compared to 3.3% for Shropshire.
- 17 young people (aged 16-24) were unemployed, plus a further 16 who were 50 to 74.
- 53.03% of all unemployed people were classed as long-term unemployed in 2011. This is the equivalent of 35 people.

Labour Force

- 1398 Prees residents aged 16-74 are economically active.
- 24.6% of the Prees population has level 4 or above qualifications compared with 27.5% in Shropshire and 27.4% in England.
- The number with no formal qualifications at all stands at 644 people at 27.0% of the population (aged over 16), this compares with the county average of 22.5%.
- 40.2% of the population work in standard occupation classifications 1-3 (managers, directors and senior officials, professional, associate professional and technical) and 18.0% work in standard occupation classifications 8 and 9 (process, plant and machine operatives and elementary occupations).

Travel to Work (Census 2011)

- 15.7% of the population in Prees are self-employed, and 7.6% work from home compared with 5.6% for Shropshire.
- The car is used as the main means of travel to work for 49.2%, while 1.2% use public transport.
