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Executive Summary

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 (IMD 2004) is a Super Output Area (SOA) level index and is composed from 37 indicators. It measures deprivation in its broadest sense by assessing indicators relating to income, employment, health and disability, education, skills and training, barriers to housing and services, crime and the living environment.

Local quintiles at SOA level for the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 will be used to monitor health and social inequalities.

The Indices of Deprivation are an important measure of deprivation and should be locally used as an indicator to identify and prioritise services and resources to help tackle health inequalities and social exclusion.

Super Output Area level summary

- At a Super Output Area level only three of Shropshire County's 192 SOAs fall within the most deprived fifth of areas in England. These fall in the electoral wards of Harlescott, Meole Brace and Ludlow Henley and make 2% of the County's population.
- Approximately 26,600 people are thought to be income deprived in Shropshire County. This is 9% of the population compared with 14% in England. At a SOA level, the percentage of people who are income-deprived ranges from 1% to 31%, with 23 of 192 Shropshire County's SOAs having significantly higher levels of income deprivation than nationally.
- 6,960 (13%) children aged under 16 within the County live in families on low incomes, compared with 21% for England. Levels of child poverty within the county range from 1% to 41%, with 15 of Shropshire County's 192 SOAs having significantly higher levels than England.
- Almost 8,700 (13%) people aged over 60 live in households who are income deprived compared with 15% nationally. Levels range from 4% to 33% in Shropshire County, with 30 of Shropshire County's 192 SOAs having significantly higher levels of income deprivation than England.
- The employment domain measures the percentage of people who want to work but are unable to do so due to unemployment, sickness or disability. It is estimated that 13,000 people in Shropshire County are disadvantaged due to employment, making up 8% of the population, compared with 10% nationally. Levels of the percentage of people who are involuntarily out of work ranges from 2% to 23%.

- The health deprivation and disability domain identifies areas with relatively higher levels of people who die prematurely or whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or disability. In Shropshire County, three of the 192 Super Output Areas fall within the most deprived fifth of SOAs in England for health deprivation and disability. These are Harlescott, Monkmoor and Ludlow Henley and make up 2% of the population.
- The education domain measures the lack of qualifications amongst children and adults. 15 of the County's 192 SOAs fall within the worst 20% of SOAs in England making up 8% of Shropshire population. Six of the 192 SOAs fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England for education, skills and training deprivation for the children and young people's sub domain. These are: Battlefield and Heathgates, Harlescott, Meole Brace, Sundorne, Ludlow Henley, and Stokesay. The County is more deprived for the skills sub domain when looking at levels of working age adults with no or low qualifications with 26 SOAs (13% of the population) falling within the fifth most deprived SOAs in England.
- The barriers to housing and services domain is made up of two sub-domains. wider barriers and geographical barriers. The 'wider barriers' sub-domain includes issues relating to access to housing (e.g. overcrowding and affordability) and homelessness. The 'geographical barriers' sub-domain measures poor geographical access to four key services (GP premises, supermarket or convenience store, post office and a primary school for children aged five to seven). For the overall domain, over a third (34%) of the County's population fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England. This rises to 45% of the South Shropshire population. No SOAs in Shropshire County fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England for the 'wider barriers' sub-domain. However, as expected in a predominately rural County, almost half of the population (49%) live in the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England for geographical access to services, again in areas of South Shropshire and North Shropshire this rises to 68% and 60% respectively.
- The crime and disorder domain is new to the IMD and measures the incidence rate of recorded crime for burglary, theft, criminal damage and violence. Only 4% of Shropshire County residents live in the most deprived fifth of SOAs in England for crime.
- The living environment domain is made from two sub-domains: the 'indoors' living environment which measures the quality of housing and the 'outdoors' living environment which contains measures about air quality and road traffic accidents. Nine of 192 SOAs in Shropshire County fall within the most deprived fifth of areas in England for living environment. This accounts for 4% of the population who are disadvantaged when it comes to the living environment. One in five of residents in Shropshire live in a SOA falling within the most deprived areas in England for the indoor domain. Locally there are no SOAs that fall in the fifth most deprived of areas nationally for the outdoor domain.

District and county summary

- Overall, Shropshire County is a relatively affluent area and using the average population-weighted ward score is ranked as being the 111th most deprived County of 145 counties and unitary authorities.
- There are six summary measures that can be used at district level. Oswestry is ranked as the most deprived district in the County using the average ward score and average rank measures. Shrewsbury & Atcham is ranked as the most deprived district in the County using the other four measures: local concentration, extent measure, income scale and employment scales.

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Introduction to the Indices of Deprivation

The Indices of Deprivation are an important measure of deprivation and should be locally used as an indicator to identify and prioritise services and resources to help tackle health inequalities and social exclusion.

The Office for the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) commissioned the Social Disadvantage Research Centre at the University of Oxford to update the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2000 (IMD 2000) for England. Following extensive user consultations, a revised Indices of Deprivation 2004 was published in June 2004. The ID 2004 is composed of the overall Index of Multiple Deprivation Score 2004, along with district and county level summaries.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 (IMD 2004) is a Super Output Area¹ (SOA) level index, composed from 37 indicators measuring deprivation in its broadest sense. The overall IMD 2004 score combines seven areas (called domains), which are weighted as follows:

- Income (22.5%)
- Employment (22.5%)
- Health and disability (13.5%)
- Education, skills and training (13.5%)
- Barriers to housing and services (9.3%)
- Crime and disorder (9.3%)
- Living environment (9.3%)

As well as the addition of two new domains (crime and living environment), the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 has undergone significant changes to its other domain and hence direct comparability to its predecessor, the Index of Multiple Deprivation 2000 is not possible.

As well as an overall multiple deprivation score, SOA scores are available for these seven domains and two income deprivation indices relating to children and older people. Scores for six sub-domains relating to education, barriers and living environment are also available.

¹ Super Output Areas (SOAs) are a new National Statistics geography output intended for use when publishing small area statistics. It is anticipated that these which will eventually replace electoral wards. SOAs are designed to give an improved basis for comparison across the country, as they are more similar in population size than electoral wards. Unlike wards they will be more stable and not be subject to regular boundary changes, enabling improved comparison and monitoring of indicators over time. There are three layers for SOAs, lower, middle and upper layers. The lower layer is the geography used for the IMD 2004. The SOA lower layer (LL SOA) consists of a minimum 400 households or 1,000 people and average 1,500 people. For further information see <http://www.statistics.gov.uk/geography/soa.asp>. In Shropshire County there are 192 SOAs within the lower layer, and their population ranges from 1,005 to 3,250.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004

Overall, Shropshire County is a relatively affluent area. In England there are 32,482 Super Output Areas, of these only three SOAs in Shropshire County fall within the most deprived fifth of SOAs in England. These fall in the electoral wards of Harlescott, Meole Brace and Ludlow Henley, making up 2% of the Shropshire County population. In contrast 16%, of Shropshire County's population falls within the least deprived fifth of SOAs in England (Table 1).

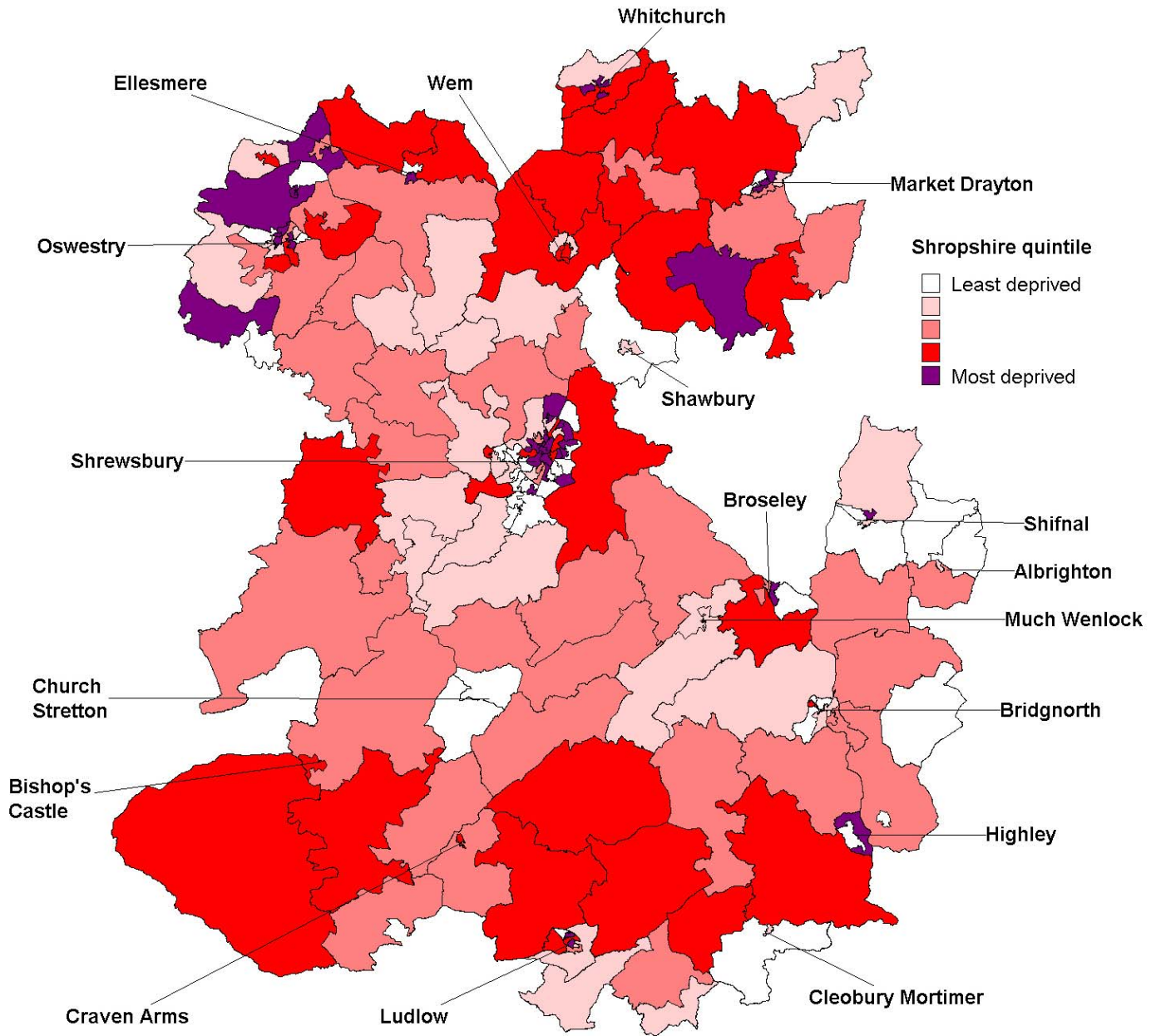

To get a more meaningful local picture, the County has been split into five areas. This has been done by ranking the IMD score for Shropshire County SOAs from one (most deprived) to 192 (least deprived). These SOAs have then been split into quintiles.

Figure 1 shows IMD scores by quintile in Shropshire County. The distribution varies within the County, with almost a third (31%) of the Oswestry population falling within the most deprived fifth areas in Shropshire County compared with only 6% of South Shropshire's population. However, 45% of the most deprived local quintile's population falls within the Shrewsbury & Atcham area (Table 2).

These quintiles will be used for the future profiling and monitoring of health and social inequalities in Shropshire County. The Index of Multiple Deprivation Scores for SOAs are summarised in Appendix 1.

Income deprivation

Income deprivation is considered to be one of the most important aspects of deprivation and subsequently is given a weighting of 22.5%. This domain measures the percentage of people living in low-income families using the following five indicators:

- Adults and children in Income Support households (2001)
- Adults and children in Income Based Job Seekers Allowance households (2001)
- Adults and children in Working Families Tax Credit households whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of median before housing costs (2001)
- Adults and children in Disabled Person's Tax Credit households whose equivalised income (excluding housing benefits) is below 60% of median before housing costs (2001)
- National Asylum Support Service supported asylum seekers in England in receipt of subsistence only and accommodation support (2002)

The income deprivation domain also includes two indices relating to children and older people:

- ***Income deprivation affecting children index (IDACI)***
This index is a subset of the income domain. The IDACI is a useful gauge of disadvantaged children as it measures the proportion of children under 16 who were living in families in receipt of means tested benefits or in families in receipt of working families or disabled person's tax credits but whose income (before housing costs) was below 60% of the median income.
- ***Income deprivation affecting older people index (IDAOP)***
The IDAOP is another subset of the income domain. It measures the percentage of the population over 60 who are living on means tested benefits.

It is estimated that 26,600 people in Shropshire County are income deprived making up 9% of the population compared with 14% nationally (Table 3). At a SOA level, the percentage of people who are income-deprived ranges from 1% to 31%, with 23 of 192 Shropshire County's SOAs having significantly higher levels of income deprivation than nationally. The most deprived quintile for income scores can be found in Appendix 2.

6,960 (13%) children aged under 16 within the County live in families on low incomes, compared with 21% for England. Levels of child poverty within the county range from 1% to 41%, with 15 of Shropshire County's 192 SOAs having significantly higher levels of income deprivation affecting children than England. The most deprived local quintile for child poverty scores can be found in Appendix 3.

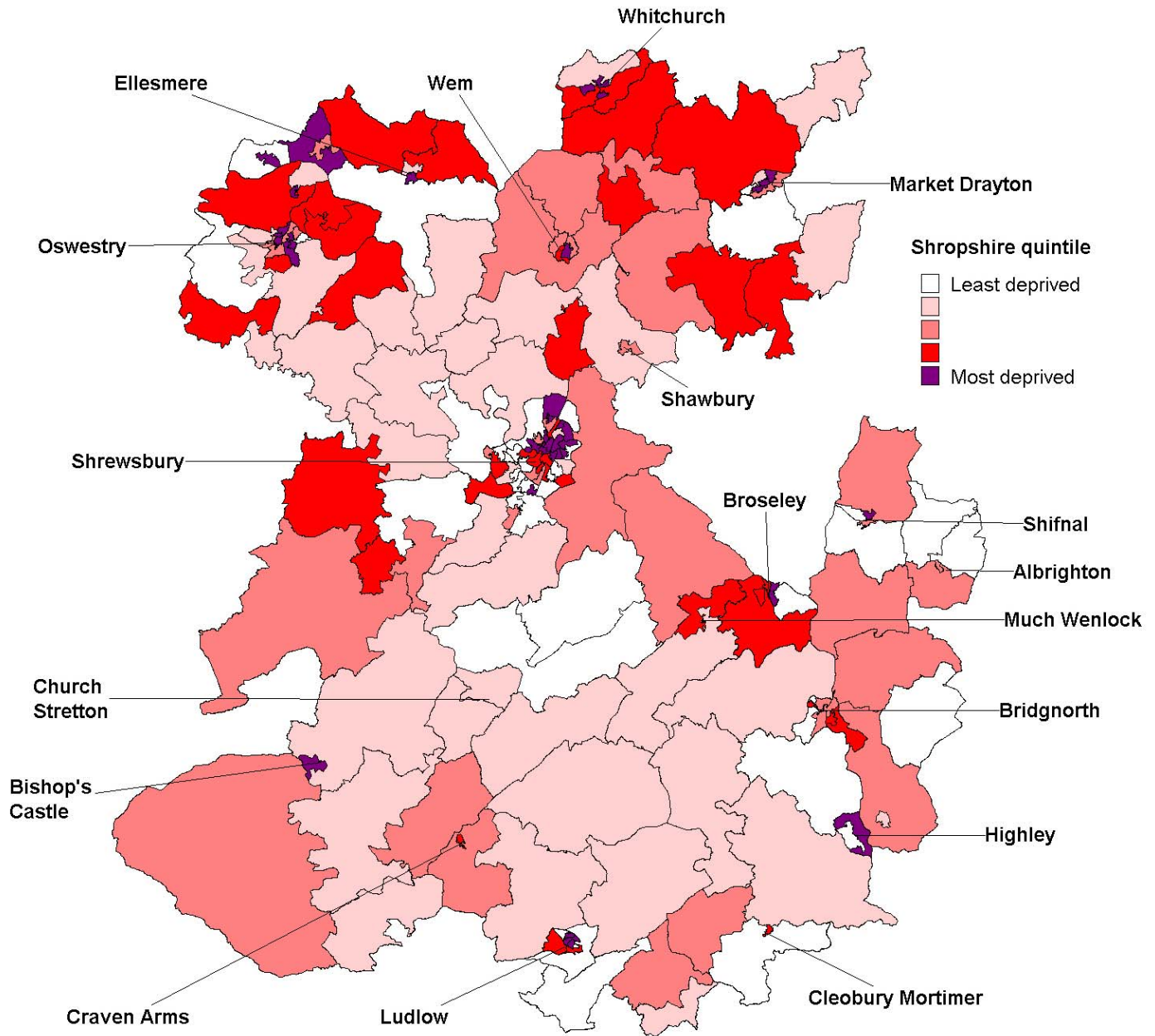
Almost 8,700 (13%) people aged over 60 live in households who are income deprived compared with 15% nationally. Levels range from 4% to 33% in Shropshire County, with 30 of Shropshire County's 192 SOAs having significantly higher levels of income deprivation than England. The most deprived quintile for income scores affecting older people in Shropshire County can be found in Appendix 4.

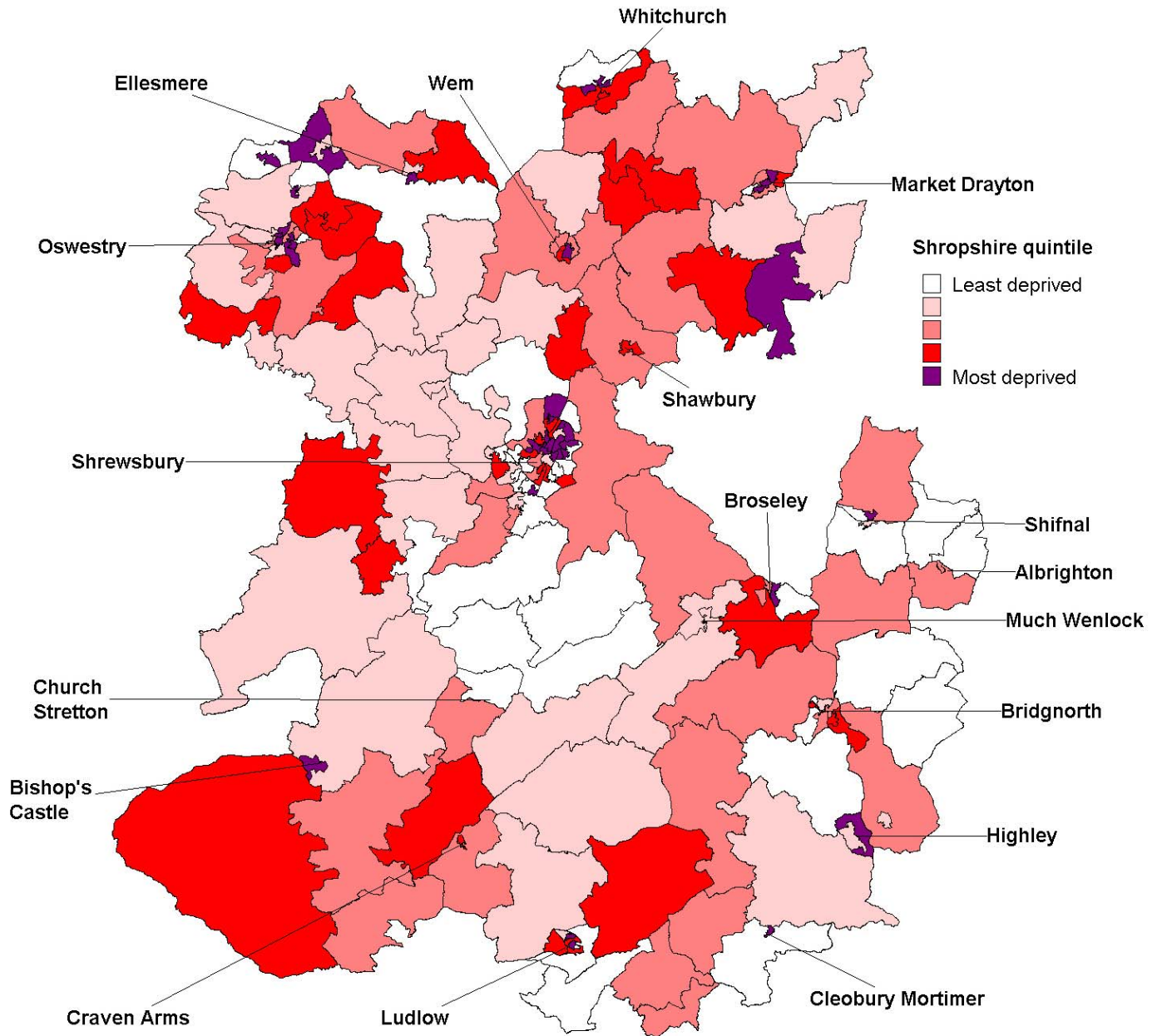

Figure 2 Income deprivation in Shropshire County



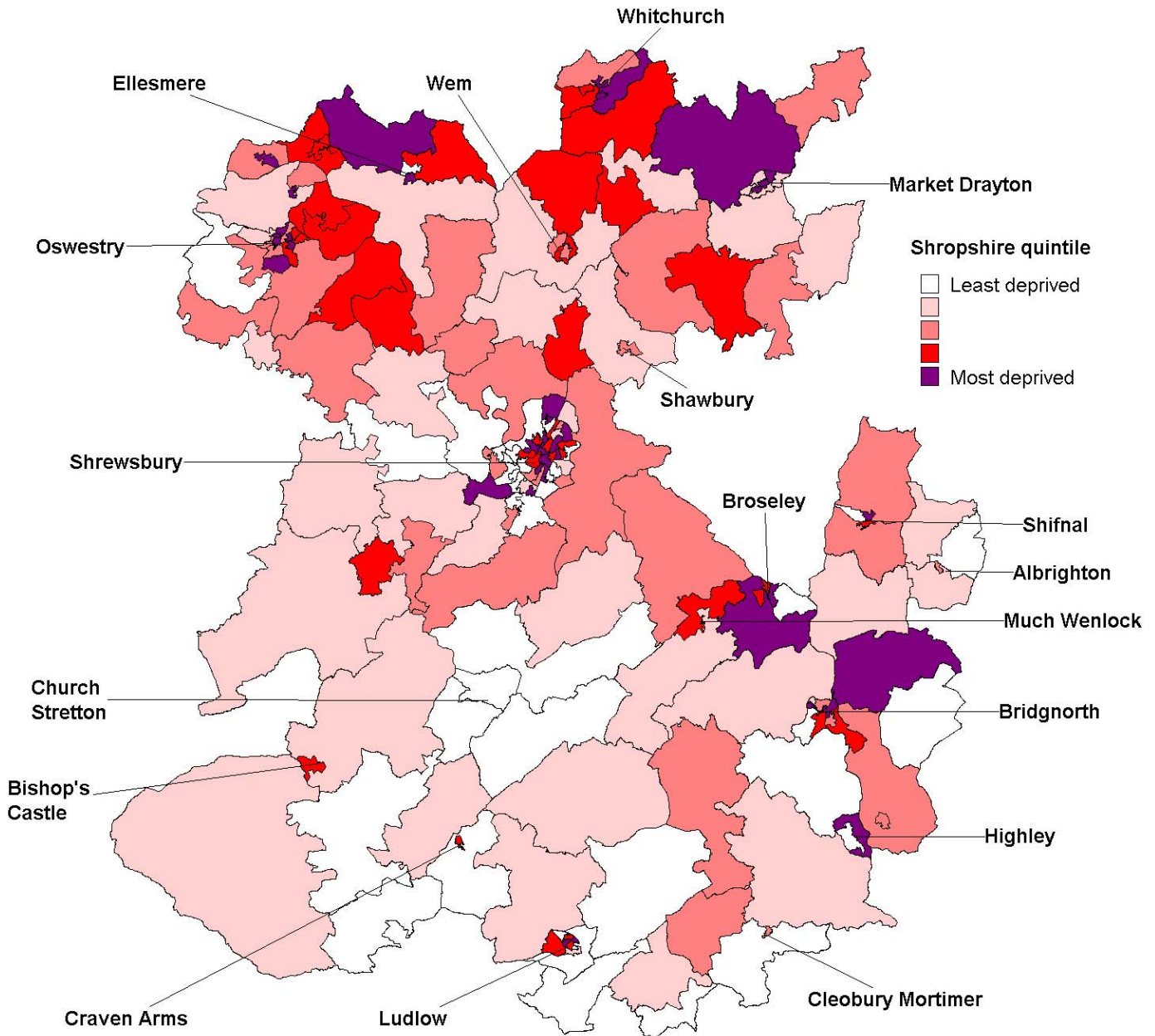

Employment deprivation

Employment deprivation is considered to be another important aspect of deprivation and is also given a weighting of 22.5%. The employment domain measures the percentage of people who want to work but are unable to do so due to unemployment, sickness or disability. It is made from six indicators:

- Unemployment claimant count (JUVOS) of women aged 18-59 and men aged 18-64 averaged over four quarters (2001)
- Incapacity Benefit claimants women aged 18-59 and men aged 18-64 (2001)
- Severe Disablement Allowance claimants women aged 18-59 and men aged 18-64 (2001)
- Participants in New Deal for the 18-24s who are not included in the claimant count (2001)
- Participants in New Deal for 25+ who are not included in the claimant count (2001)
- Participants in New Deal for Lone Parents aged 18 and over (2001)

It is estimated that 13,000 people in Shropshire County are disadvantaged due to employment, making up 8% of the population, compared with 10% nationally (Table 4). At a SOA level, the percentage of people who are involuntarily out of work ranges from 2% to 23%. Figure 5 shows employment deprivation in Shropshire County.

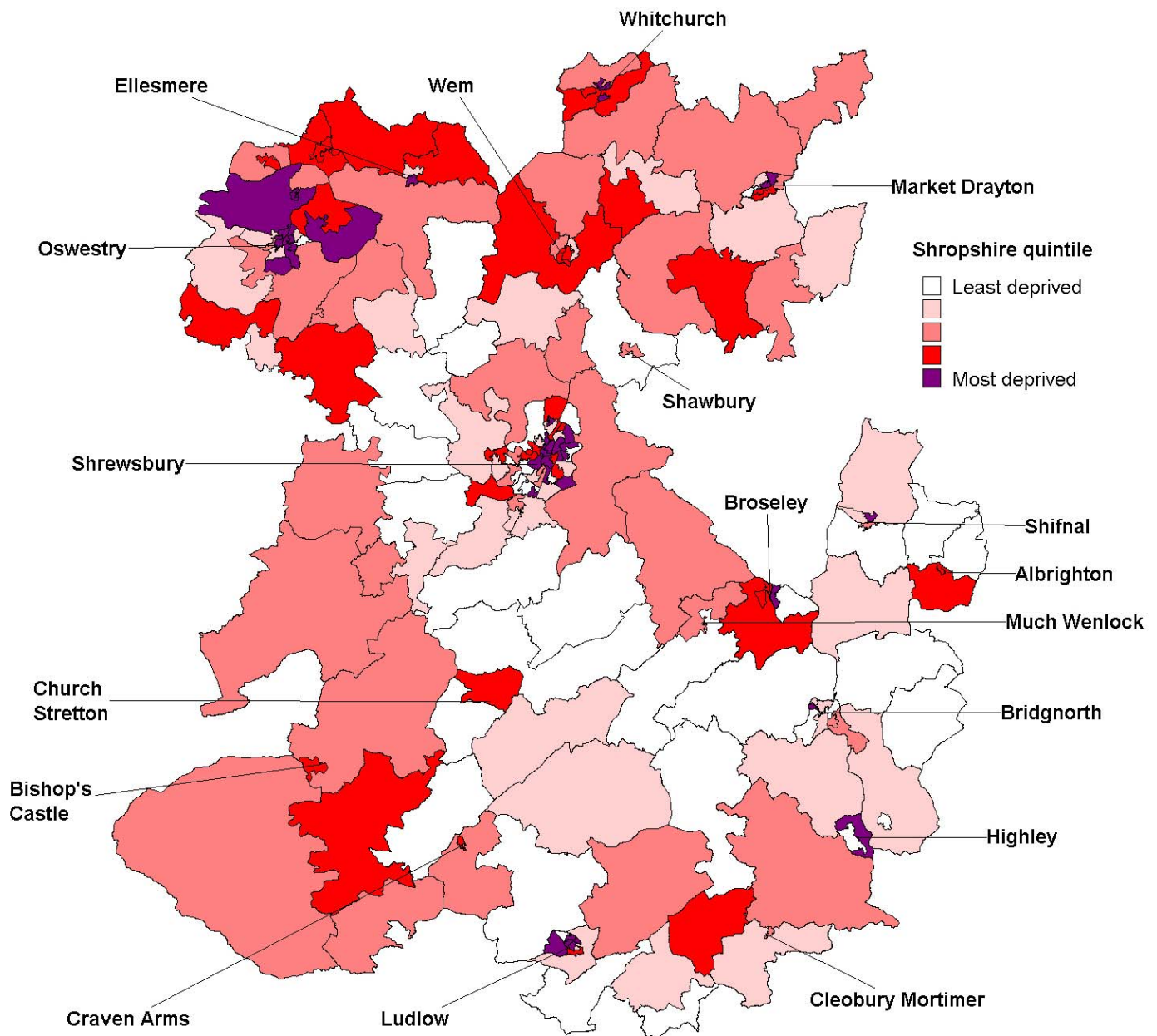

Health deprivation and disability

The health deprivation and disability domain identifies areas with relatively higher levels of people who die prematurely or whose quality of life is impaired by poor health or disability and is composed from four indicators:

- Years of potential life lost (1997-2001)
- Comparative illness and disability ratio (2001)
- Measures of emergency admissions to hospital (1999/00 to 2001/02)
- Adults under 60 suffering from mood or anxiety disorders, based on prescribing, hospital admissions, suicides and health benefits data (1997-2002)

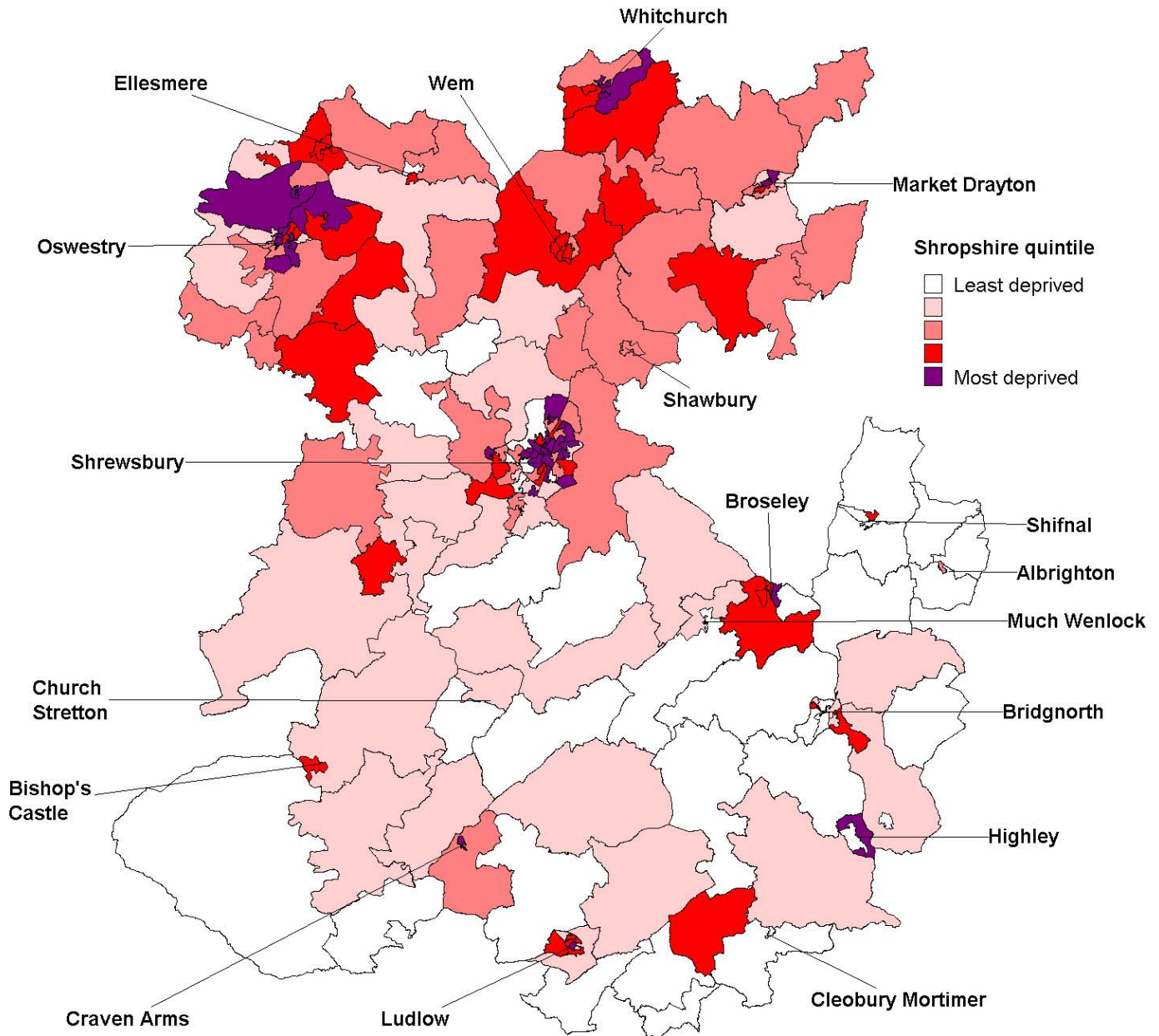
In Shropshire County, three of the 192 Super Output Areas fall within the most deprived fifth of SOAs in England for health deprivation and disability. These are Harlescott, Monkmoor and Ludlow Henley and make up 2% of the population (Table 5). Figure 6 shows the distribution of health deprivation and disability scores in Shropshire County. Health deprivation and disability scores for the most deprived quintile for income scores can be found in Appendix 6.

Education, skills and training deprivation

The education domain measures the lack of qualifications amongst children and adults. The education domain measures the extent of deprivation in terms of education, skills and training in a local area. There are seven indicators, which fall into two sub domains: one relating to children/young people and one relating to the working age adult population.

Sub domain: Children/young people

- Average points score of children at Key Stage 2 (2002)
- Average points score of children at Key Stage 3 (2002)
- Average points score of children at Key Stage 4 (2002)
- Proportion of young people not staying on in school or school level education above 16 (2001)
- Proportion of those aged under 21 not entering Higher Education (1999-2002)
- Secondary school absence rate (2001-2002)

Sub domain: Skills

- Proportions of working age adults (aged 25-54) in the area with no or low qualifications (2001)

15 of the County's 192 SOAs fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England making up 8% of Shropshire population (Table 6).

Six of the 192 SOAs fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England for education, skills and training deprivation for the children and young people's sub-domain (Table 7). These are:

- Battlefield and Heathgates (Shrewbsury & Atcham)
- Harlescott (Shrewbsury & Atcham)
- Meole Brace (Shrewbsury & Atcham)
- Sundorne (Shrewbsury & Atcham)
- Ludlow Henley (South Shropshire)
- Stokesay (South Shropshire)

The County is more deprived for the skills sub domain which reports on levels of working age adults with no or low qualifications with 26 SOAs (13% of the population) falling within the fifth most deprived SOAs in England (Table 8).

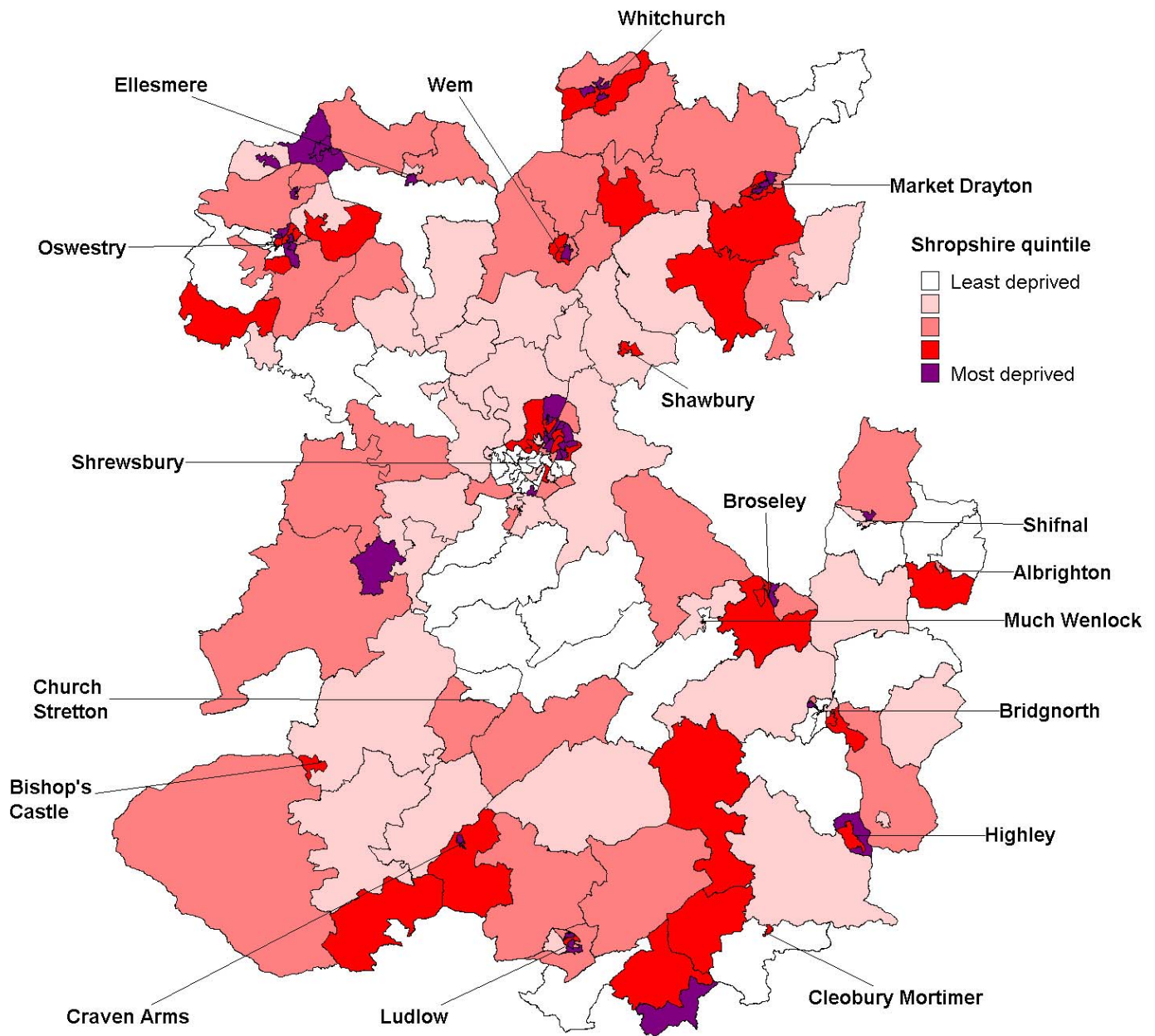

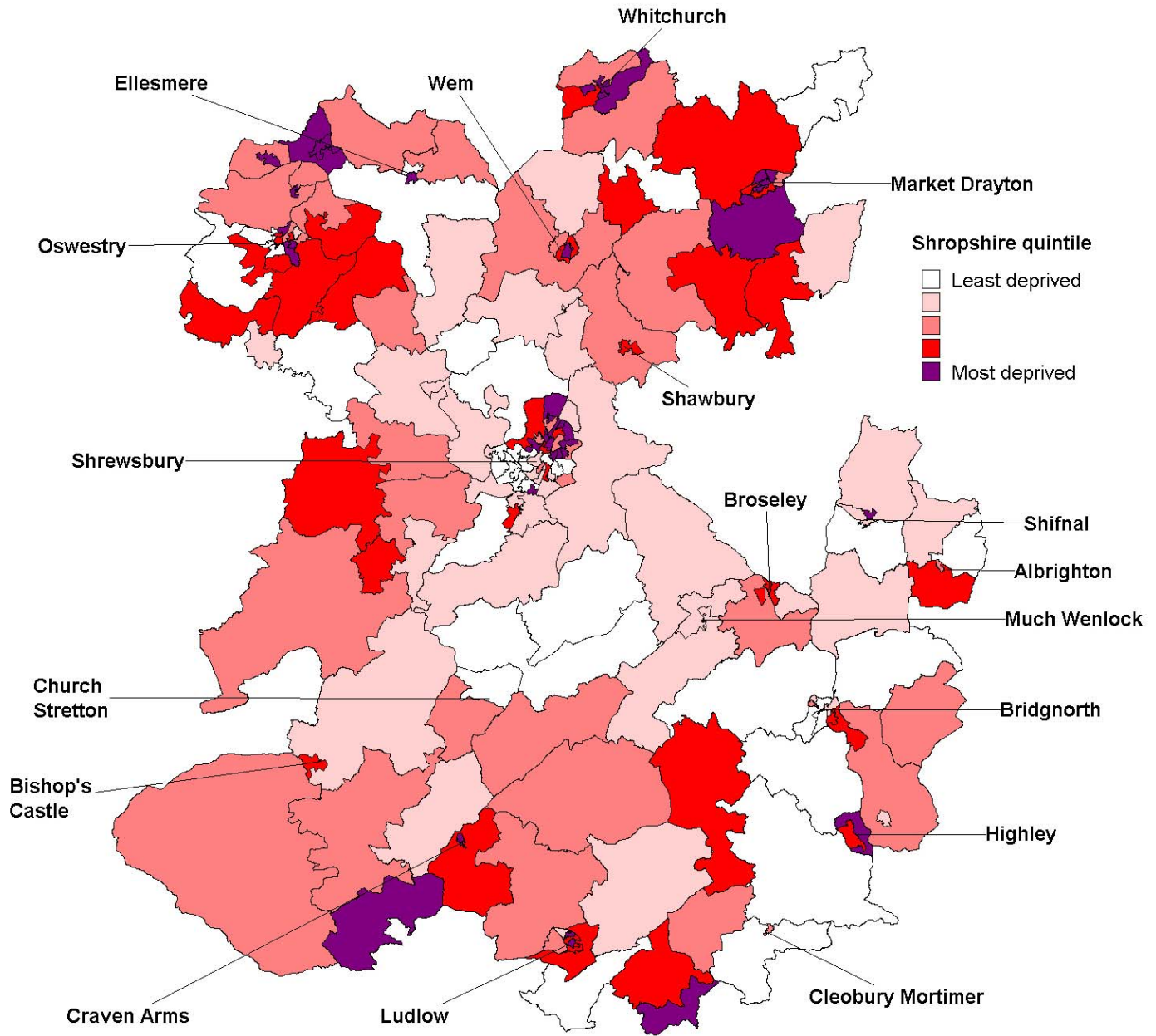

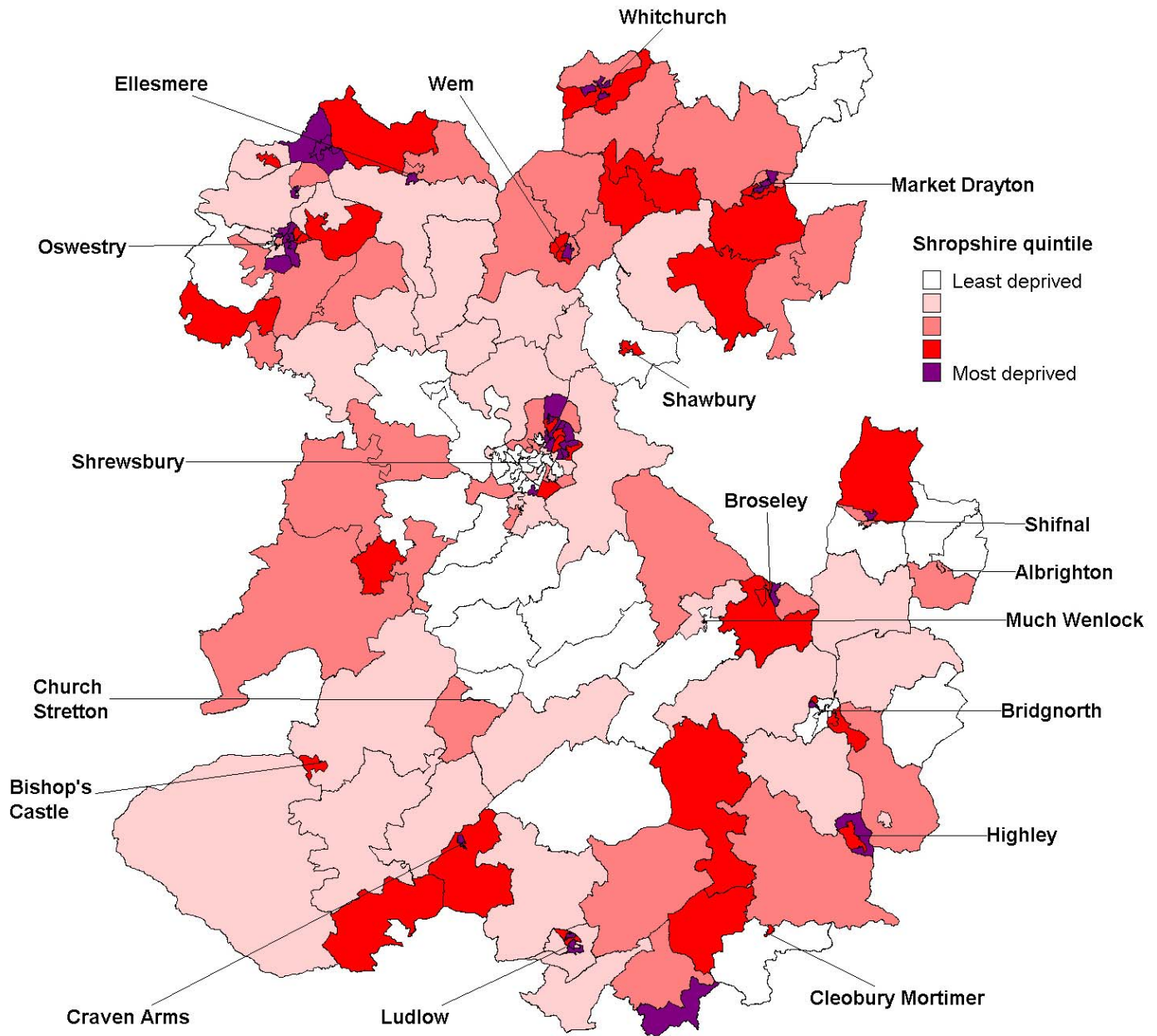

Barriers to housing and services

The domain consists of seven indicators, which measure barriers to housing and key local services. It is made up from two sub-domains: wider barriers and geographical barriers.

The 'wider barriers' sub-domain mainly includes issues relating to access to housing (e.g. overcrowding and affordability) and homelessness.

The 'geographical barriers' sub-domain measures poor geographical access to key services that are important for people's day-to-day life, such as supermarkets and primary schools. In terms of measuring distances, there has been a refinement from the IMD 2000 geographical access domain, which used '*as the crow flies*' distances to road distances.

Traditionally deprivation scores have tended to use indicators that are biased towards urban areas. This 'geographical access' measure is therefore particularly relevant for rural areas like Shropshire County.

Sub domain: Wider Barriers

- Household overcrowding (2001)
- LA level percentage of households for whom a decision on their application for assistance under the homeless provisions of housing legislation has been made, assigned to SOAs (2002)
- Difficulty of Access to owner-occupation (2002)

Sub domain: Geographical Barriers

- Road distance to GP premises (2003).
- Road distance to a supermarket or convenience store (2002)²
- Road distance to a primary school (2001-2002).
- Road distance to a Post Office (2003).

Over a third (34%) of the County's population fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England. This rises to 45% of the South Shropshire population (Table 9).

² The supermarkets or convenience stores include all food retail sites in England, which have five or more sites under the same name in the UK. Unfortunately it was not possible to take into account smaller shops or food outlets at garages at the time of constructing the ID 2004 as there is no national data source available.

None of the SOAs in Shropshire County fall within the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England for the 'wider barriers' sub-domain (Table 10). However, as expected in a predominately rural County, almost half of the population (49%) live in the most disadvantaged fifth of SOAs in England for geographical access to services, again in areas of South Shropshire and North Shropshire this rises to 68% and 60% respectively (Table 11).

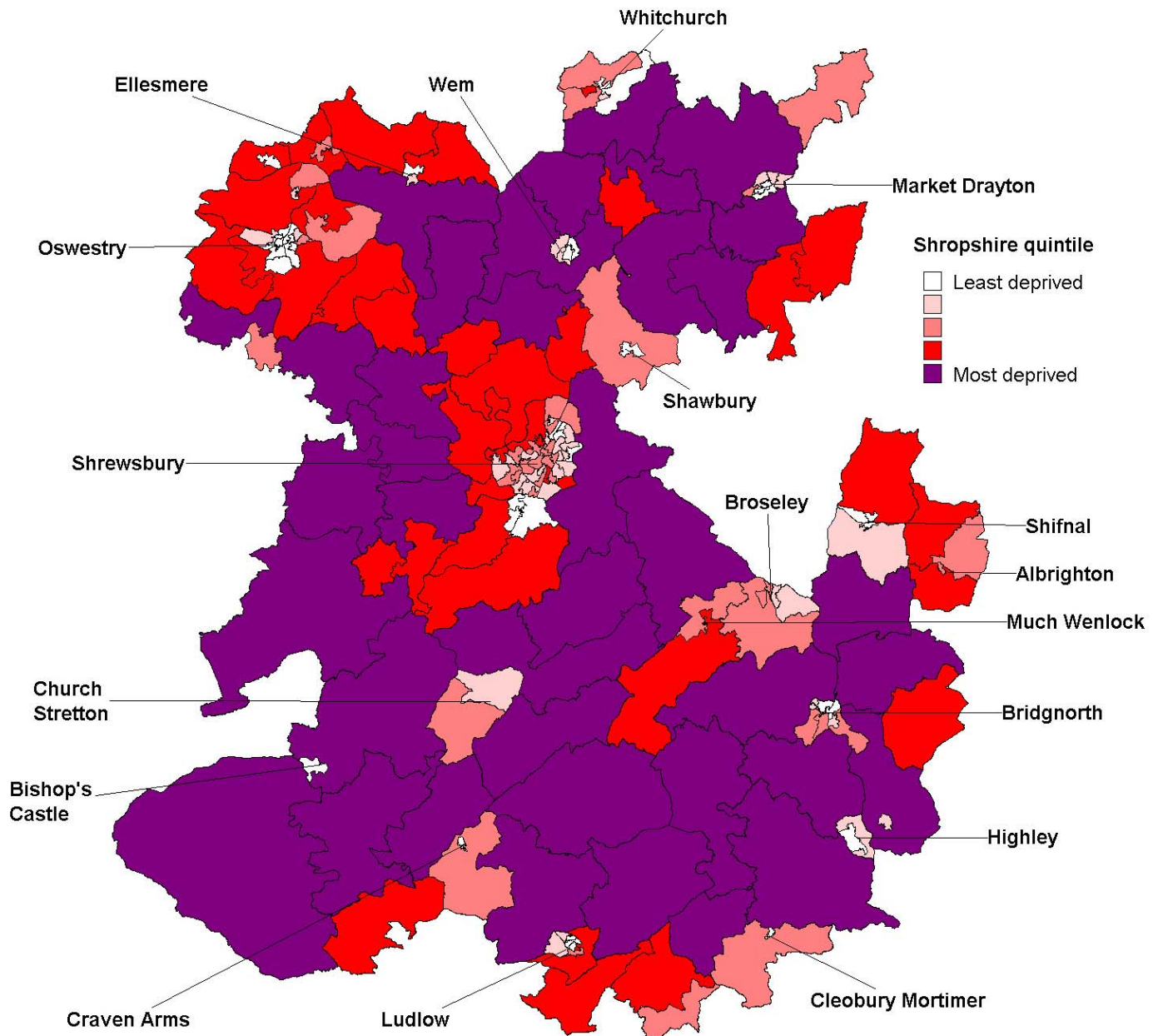

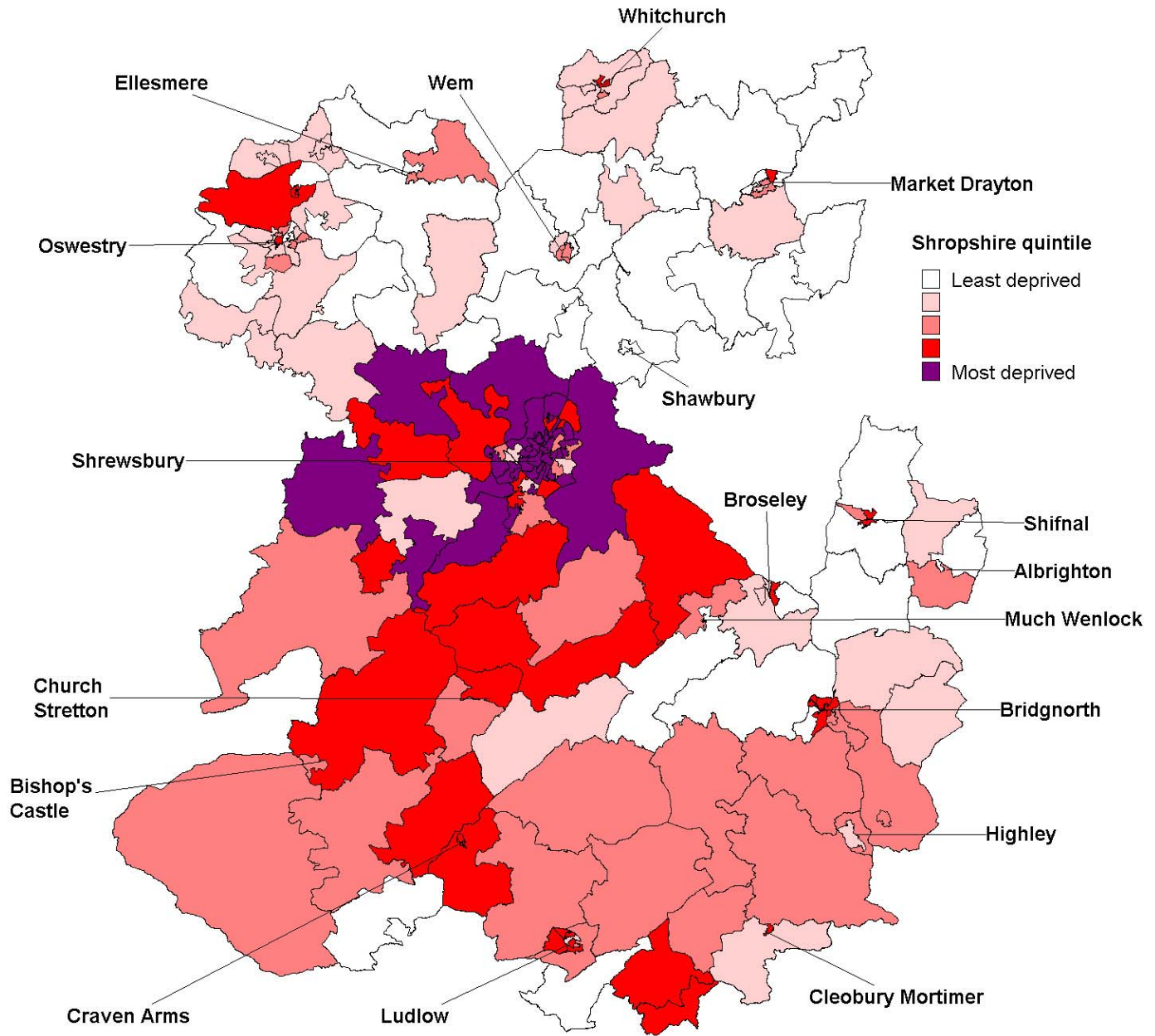

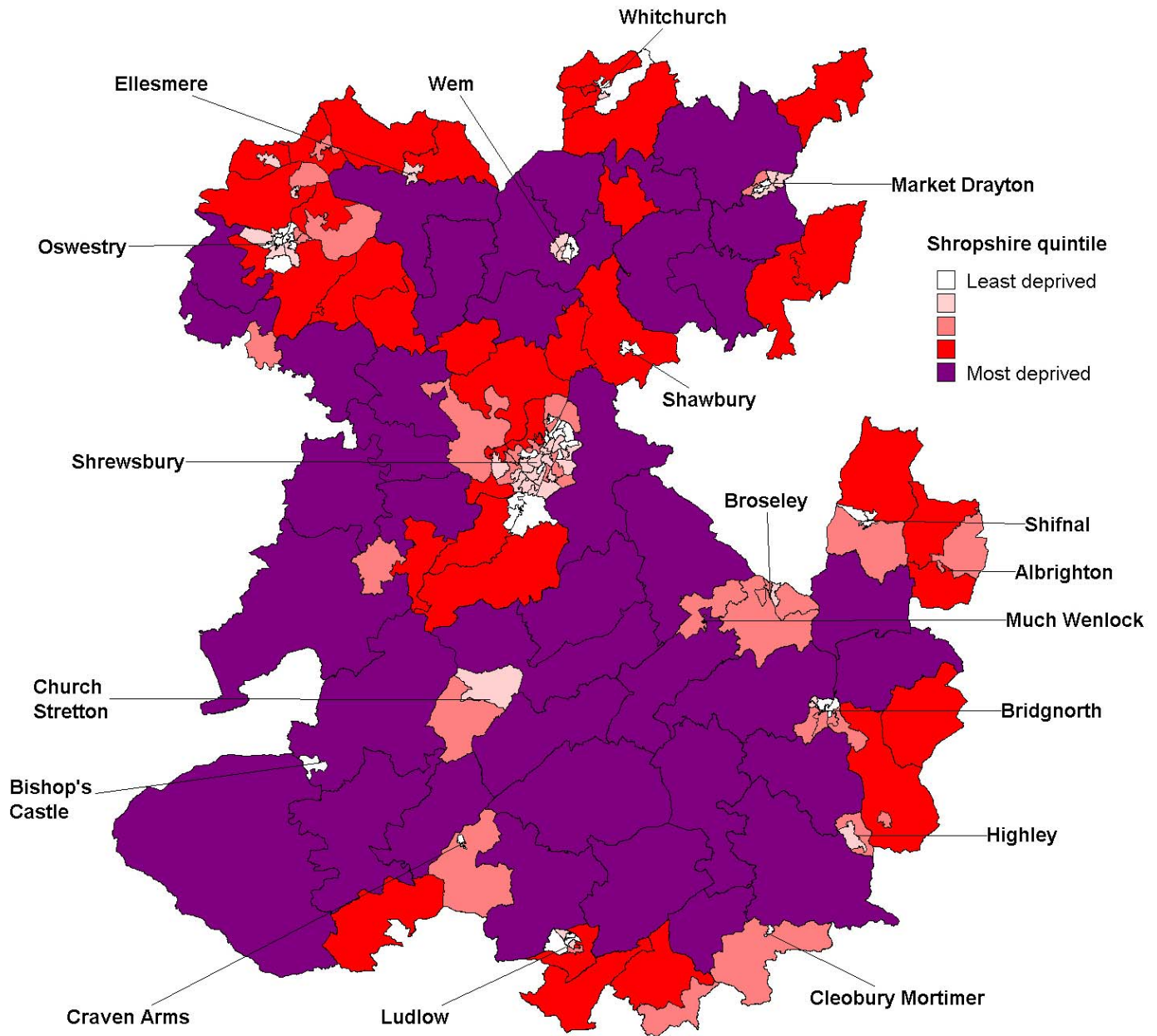

Crime and disorder deprivation

The crime domain is new to the IMD and measures the incidence rate of recorded crime across four major crime themes (burglary, theft, criminal damage and violence), representing the occurrence of personal and material victimisation using police force data:

- Burglary (four recorded crime offence types, April 2002-March 2003).
- Theft (five recorded crime offence types, April 2002-March 2003, constrained to Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership level).
- Criminal damage (ten recorded crime offence types, April 2002-March 2003).
- Violence (14 recorded crime offence types, April 2002-March 2003).

Only 4% of Shropshire County residents live in the most deprived fifth of SOAs in England for crime (Table 12). Figure 13 shows the most deprived and least deprived quintiles for crime in Shropshire County, these tending to fall mainly in the more urban parts of the County.

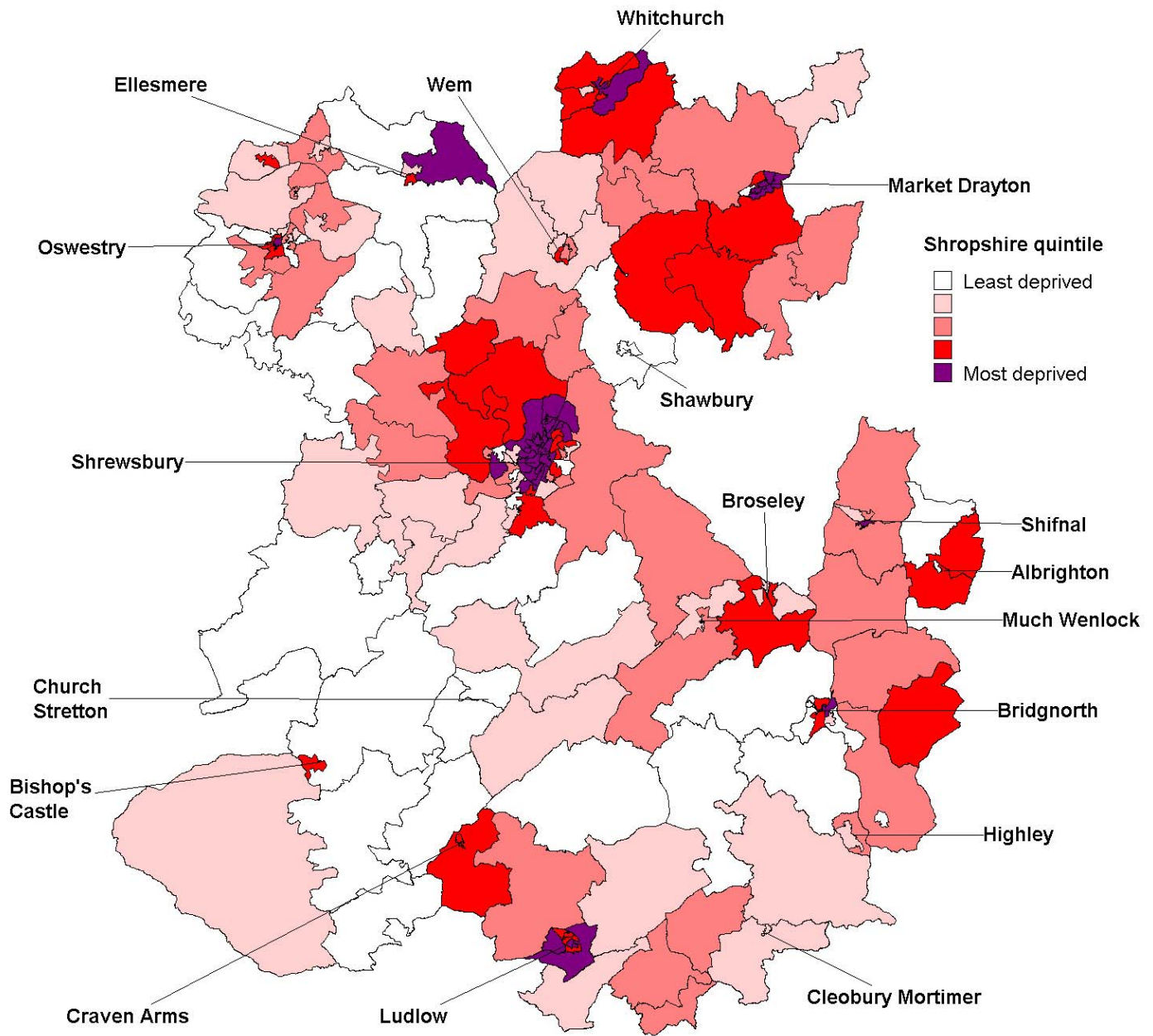

Living environment deprivation

This domain is also new and focuses on four indicators that measure deprivation relating to characteristics of the living environment. It is made two sub-domains: the 'indoors' living environment which measures the quality of housing and the 'outdoors' living environment which contains measures about air quality and road traffic accidents.

Sub-domain: The 'indoors' living environment

- Social and private housing in poor condition (2001)
- Houses without central heating (2001)

Sub-domain: The 'outdoors' living environment

- Air quality (2001)
- Road traffic accidents involving injury to pedestrians and cyclists (2000-2002)

Nine of 192 SOAs in Shropshire County fall within the most deprived fifth of areas in England for living environment. This accounts for 4% of the population who are disadvantaged when it comes to the living environment (Table 13).

One in five of residents in Shropshire live in a SOA falling within the most deprived areas in England for the indoor domain (Table 14).

Locally there are no SOAs that fall in the fifth most deprived of areas nationally for the outdoor domain (Table 15).

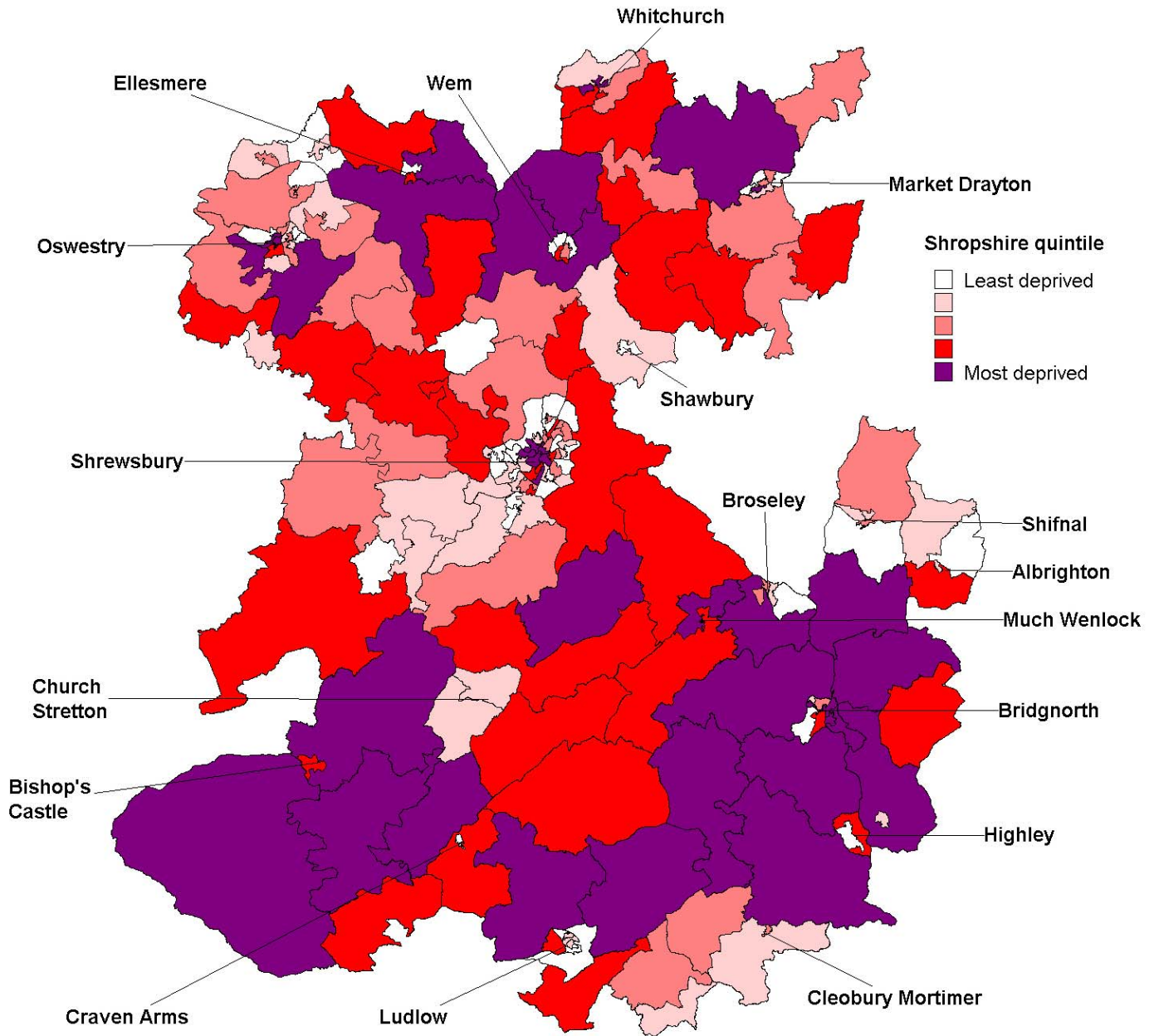

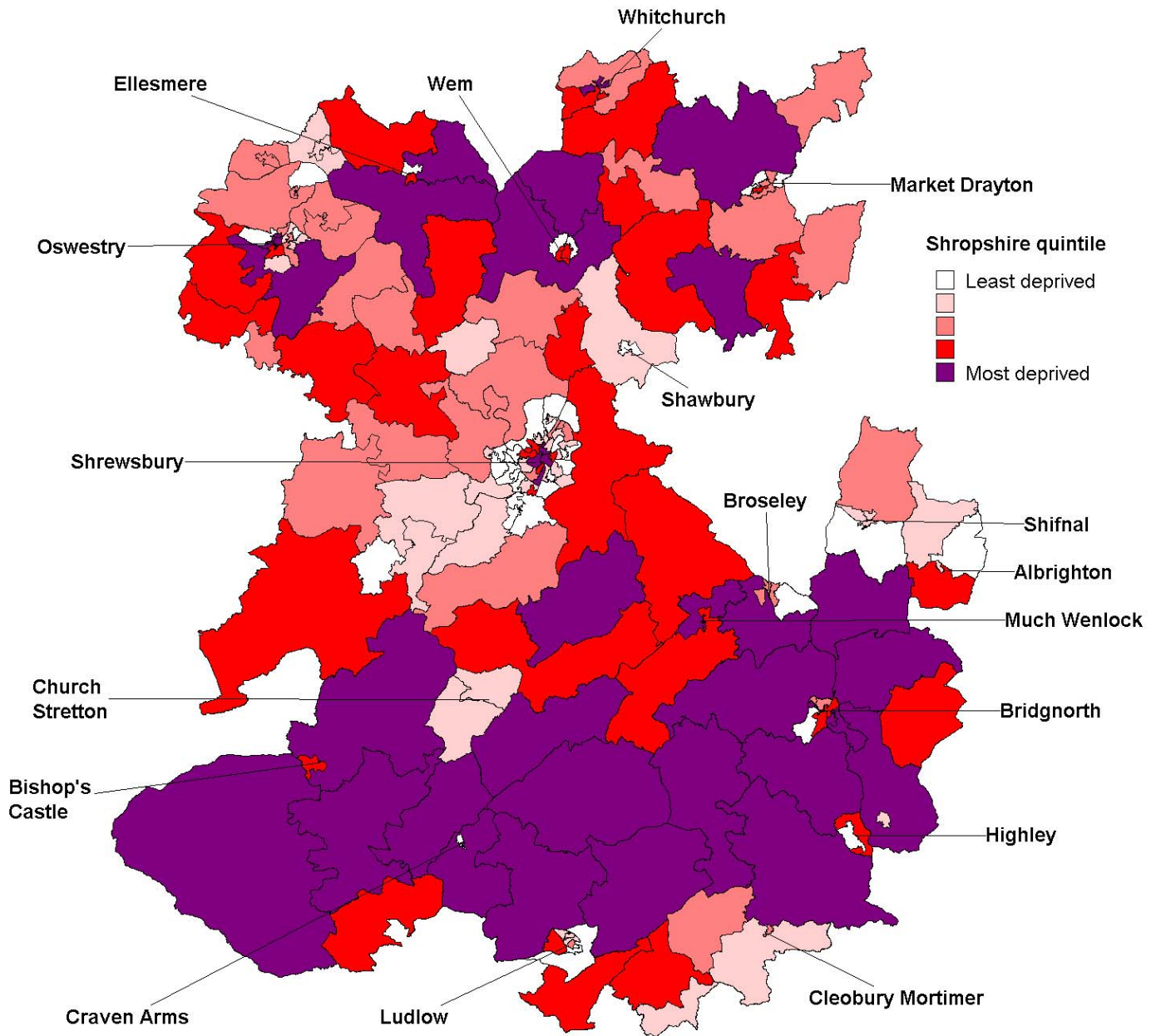

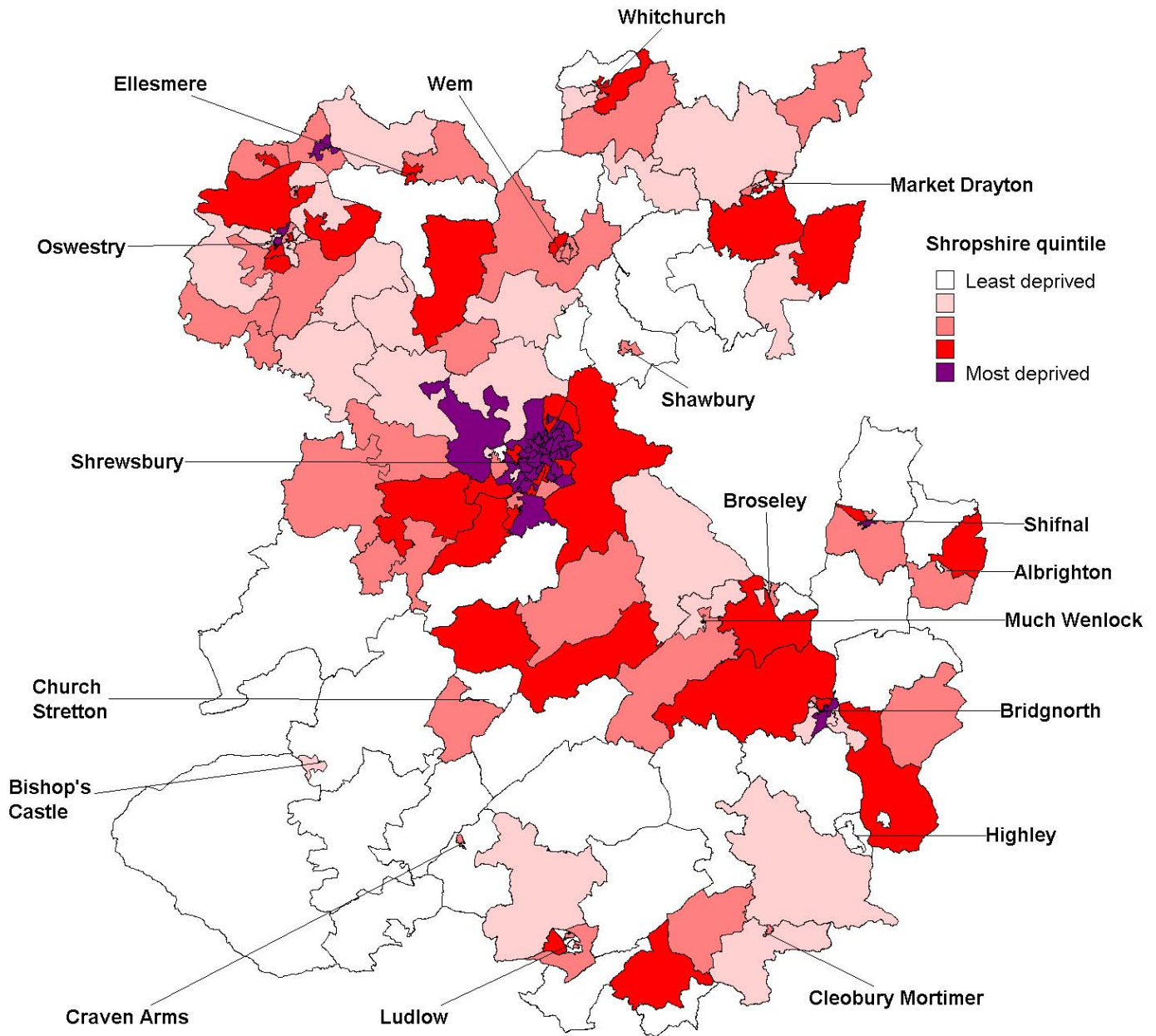

District and County Summary

The Super Output Area level Index of Multiple Deprivation is summarised at district and county level using six different measures allowing us to examine deprivation levels relative to other districts within England. These are defined in Table 16. It is important to note that the Social Disadvantage Research Centre at the University of Oxford state that they *'do not favour any summary measure over another as there is no single best way of describing or comparing districts'*.

Table 16 Definition of summary measures used for districts/counties

The **'average scores'** and **'average ranks'** measures are two ways of depicting the average level of deprivation across the entire district. The average score and rank is the population weighted average of the combined scores and ranks for the SOAs in a district.

The **'local concentration'** measure shows the severity of multiple deprivation in each authority, measuring 'hot spots' of deprivation. Local concentration is the population weighted average of the ranks of a district's most deprived SOAs that contain exactly 10% of the district's population.

The **'extent'** measure is the proportion of a district's population that lives in the most deprived SOAs in England.

The **'income scale'** and **'employment scale'** measures show the number of people experiencing income and employment deprivation respectively.

Using the overall average ward score for the IMD 2004, Shropshire County is relatively affluent with it being ranked the 111th most deprived county of 149 counties and unitary authorities. Using the average rank measure, Shropshire County is ranked at 105 (Table 17).

The five districts in Shropshire are ranked out of 354 local authorities and using the average score and rank measures, Oswestry is the most relatively deprived within the County.

The extent measure only contains districts, which contain SOAs which fall within the most deprived SOAs in England. With the exception of Bridgnorth (thus ranked joint 298), the other four districts all contains a small number of SOAs within the most deprived nationally. Using the extent measure, Shrewsbury & Atcham has the highest proportion of its population within the most deprived SOAs in England.

Local concentration helps us identify hot spots of deprivation within districts. The weighted rank for local concentration shows the average rank for the most deprived 10% of the district's population. For the purpose of this measure the most deprived SOA is given the rank of 32,482 (this mirrors the average rank where the most deprived SOA is ranked one). Using this measure the rankings show Shrewsbury & Atcham to contain pockets of relatively high deprivation within the County.

Using the income and employment scales, 26,600 and 13,000 of people living in the County are income and employment deprivation respectively. These scales show **numbers** of individuals living in income or employment deprivation and not the proportion of the total populations, which show a different picture (these have been calculated locally and are shown in the income and employment sections of this report). These scores and their respective ranks will therefore show more deprivation in more populated districts.
