

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP  
AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980  
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (RESTRICTED BYWAY 3 (PART) AND  
FOOTPATH 3 (PART), PARISH OF CHESWARDINE)  
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2017**

The above named order made on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2017 by the Shropshire Council (“the Council”) under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will **divert**

the full width of that part of Restricted Byway 3 Cheswardine, from point A on the order map (SJ 7075 3082), running in a general south westerly then southerly direction to the southern end of the farmyard at Haywood Farm at point B on the order map (SJ 7075 3037); a total distance of approximately 520 metres, **and** that part of Footpath 3 Cheswardine, from point B on the order map (SJ 7075 3037), running in a general southerly then south easterly direction to meet the boundary of a wood at point C on the order map (SJ 7078 3013); a total distance of approximately 190 metres; **onto a line** from point A on the order map (SJ 7075 3082), that part of Restricted Byway 3 Cheswardine running in a general south-south-westerly direction for approximately 156 metres to a boundary and then following a headland in a general south easterly direction for approximately 153 metres to pass through a gap and continue for approximately 214 metres until it joins a stoned track where it turns to run westerly for approximately 62 metres to point D on the plan (SJ 7092 3041), a total distance of approximately 585 metres with a width of 3 metres throughout **and** that part of Footpath 3 Cheswardine, from point D on the order map (SJ 7092 3041), running in a general south-south-westerly direction following a headland path to meet the continuation of Footpath 3 at point C on the order map (SJ 7078 3013), a distance of approximately 342 metres with a width of 2 metres throughout.

Please state the grounds on which they are made. If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
