## Shropshire Healthy Schools successes

- √ 89 schools, over half of all schools (54%), achieved national Healthy School status by December 2006, exceeding the Government's interim target (50%) for local authority maintained schools.
- √ At the end of January 2007, a total of 94 Shropshire maintained primary, special and secondary schools (57%), the Tuition Medical Behaviour Support Service (Pupil Referral Unit) and one independent school have achieved national Healthy School status.
- √ The number and proportion of schools reaching the National Healthy School standards for each of the 4 themes are:
 

· PSHE	104 (62%)
<i>which includes standards relating to drug education, relationships and sex education and child protection</i>	
· PE & School Sport	128 (77%)
<i>this includes standards relating to physical activity</i>	
· Emotional Health & Well-being	121 (73%)
<i>this includes standards relating to anti-bullying, and loss and bereavement</i>	
· Healthy Eating	115 (69%)
- √ 70 schools are actively working towards Healthy School status
- √ 164 schools (99%) are now either working towards or have achieved Healthy School status.
