1. Summary

To consider an application for a full variation to a Premises Licence.

Premises: Mytton and Mermaid, Atcham, Shrewsbury, Shropshire, SY5 6QG

Shropshire Council being the authorised licensing authority for the above premises has received an application for a full variation. (A location map and location photographs are attached to the report as **Appendix A and B**).

The application has been accepted as a valid application and during the statutory consultation period relevant representations were made. The application is therefore required to be determined by way of a hearing of the Licensing Sub-Committee.

In determining the application the licensing authority must give appropriate weight to:

- the steps that are necessary to promote the licensing objectives:
- the representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties;
- Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003;
- Shropshire Council's Licensing Policy 2019 2024.

After considering all the relevant issues the licensing authority may grant the application in full or in part, subject to such conditions that are deemed necessary and appropriate. Any conditions imposed must be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Alternatively the application can be refused if it is considered appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. Following a hearing, the licensing authority should give its decision and provide reasons to support it. This will be important if there is an appeal by any of the parties.

All parties are required to be notified of a decision and that decision should be accompanied by information on the right of the party to appeal.

2. Recommendations

That the Sub-Committee determines the application in accordance with the Statutory Guidance issued under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the information contained within this report, supporting documentation and having had due regard to the applicant and the parties/authorised bodies making relevant representations.

That the Sub-Committee determines the application in accordance with the options in paragraph 9.

That the Sub-Committee provides the reasons for its decision.

REPORT

3. Human Rights Act Appraisal

5. Purpose of Report

To consider an application for a variation at Mytton and Mermaid, Atcham, Shrewsbury, Shropshire, SY5 6QG.

6. Background

6.1 Brunning & Price Limited have made an application for a variation of the premises licence. The premises operates as a hotel and restaurant.

The current premises licence covers the ground floor of the building, except for the bedrooms and function room. The premises is situated off the B4380 in Atcham, adjacent to the River Severn and opposite Attingham Park with residential properties to the East.

The current licence was granted in November 2005. Brunning and Price Limited transferred the licence in June 2022 and subsequently undertook a complete refurbishment. From a Licensing perspective there are no historic

complaints. However, a previous review hearing has been heard and Annex 3 conditions added to the licence in relation to noise control measures.

During consultation, amendments have been made by the applicant due to representations received off the Police and Trading Standards.

6.2 The existing premises licence (**Appendix C**) and Plan (**Appendix D**) permits the following:

Opening hours

Monday to Sunday 10:00 – 02:00

24 hours for hotel residents

Supply of alcohol (both on and off sales)

Monday to Sunday 10:00 - 01:00

24 hours for hotel residents (End time 02:00 1st March till 30th September)

Late night refreshments (indoors)

Monday to Sunday 23:00 – 01:00

Live music (indoors)

Monday to Sunday 10:00 - 01:00

Recorded music (indoors)

Monday to Sunday 10:00 – 01:00

Additional non- standards hours for all activities and sales on Christmas Eve, New Year's Eve and New Years' Day.

- 6.3 The variation application (**Appendix E**) and proposed Plan (**Appendix F**) seek to amend the following:
 - The whole building is to be included within the demise of the licence including the bar/ restaurant, external dining terraces and all bedrooms (to cover the provision of mini bars)

- Adjacent grounds also to be included within the licence so portable bar serveries can be located within the area, weather permitting, to provide the sale of alcohol to customers that wish to use the grounds.
- It is proposed that the hours for the sale of alcohol will commence from 08:00 hours daily to tie in with the company's breakfast offering. Alcohol sold before 10:00 hours to non- residents will be ancillary to food.
- Remove all conditions contained within annexes 2/ 3 and replace with new conditions as per operating schedule.
- There are no proposals to change the nature of the premises which will continue as a hotel and restaurant.

Opening hours

Monday to Sunday 00:00 - 23:59

Supply of alcohol (both on and off sales)

Monday to Sunday 08:00 - 01:00

24 hours for residents and bona fide guests

End time 02:00 1st March till 30th September, Christmas Eve and New Year's Day

New Year's Eve: 08:00 – start of normal hours on New Year's Day

6.4 The applicant has requested to remove all current conditions within Annexes 2 and 3 of the current licence:

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

- 1. Entrance/Exits would be well illuminated;
- 2. Good visibility of the public areas from the bar areas would be maintained.
- 3. Regular checks would be made of the toilet and outside areas;
- 4. The premises would not be targeted to attract the 18-25 age group.

Public Safety

1. Firefighting and smoke detection equipment would be maintained annually.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. Customers would be instructed to leave quietly with signs being displayed at exits that effect;
- 2. Firework displays would be arranged through the hotel to finish prior to 22:15 and the Parish Council would be notified of such events.

Protection of Children From Harm

1. Staff would be trained to refuse to serve alcohol to anyone who appears under 21 arid cannot prove that they are over 18;

2. Only a drivers licence or passport would be accepted as proof of age.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

- 1. Firework displays would be limited to ten in number in any calendar year except that in addition there may be a firework display on New Year's Eve between 00:00 and 00:30 the following morning;
- 2. All amplified music would be controlled through a noise limiting device set by the Environmental Health Officer:
- 3. All doors and windows would be closed in any part of the premises in which regulated entertainment is taking place;
- 4. No regulated entertainment would take place in the courtyard area after 23:00.
- 6.5 The applicant has identified new conditions to promote the four licensing objectives. The operating schedule details that the following steps would be taken:

6.5.1

- The sale and supply of alcohol before 10:00 hours for non-residents will be ancillary to breakfast/table meal.
- Alcohol and hot food will be available 24 hours a day to residents and their bona fide guests.
- CCTV will be installed and maintained within the premises to the satisfaction of the police.
 Images will be retained for a period of 31 days and made available to any of the responsible authorities upon request.
- All members of staff engaged in the provision of licensable activities must receive training in relation to:-
 - The licensing objectives contained in the Licensing Act 2003
 - Responsible retailing of alcohol, and the law
 - Protection of children from harm and this must include how to competently check customers identification where necessary
 - Authorised hours for licensable activities and the conditions attached to the premises licence
- The staff training records will be maintained at the premises and made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.
- The use of the external areas for licensable activities will cease at 23:00 hours.
- Portable bar serveries may be used within the external areas. The location of which will be risk assessed prior to use and a copy of the risk assessment kept on the premises during the period of use, copies of which will be made available for inspection by any of the responsible authorities upon request.
- A fire risk assessment will be carried out and a copy available on the premises for inspection by any of the responsible authorities upon request.

- Clearly legible notices shall be displayed at all exits from the premises requesting
 patrons to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area
 quietly.
- Fireworks displays will be limited to 10 events in any calendar year and will finish by 22:15 hours except, in addition, on New Year's Eve there may be a fireworks display between 00:00 and 00:30 the following morning.
- Any amplified music will be controlled through a noise limiting device set in agreement with the Environmental Health Department.
- All ground floor doors and windows within the premises will be closed while regulated entertainment is taking place.
- The premises will operate a challenge 25 scheme. Acceptable forms of identification will be photographic such as a photo driving licence, passport or PASS accredited proof of age card, etc.

7. Representations received (Responsible Authorities)

- 7.1 Representations were received off the Police and Trading Standards. These have both been withdrawn following an agreement of additional conditions.
- 7.2 Police requested a drugs policy and additional CCTV conditions. The following were proposed and agreed with the applicant:
 - 1. Colour digital CCTV, with a picture quality capable of being used for evidence, will be installed to cover all internal areas of the premises, including point(s) of sale and all entrances/exits, and any external areas used for licensable activities or where outside seating is provided. The CCTV will be operational at all times the premises is open to the public.
 - 2. CCTV recordings will be retained for a minimum of 30 days and made available in a viewable format to any authorised authority on request.
 - 3. When the premises is open to the public there will always be a member of staff on site who is trained in the operation of the CCTV system and is able to provide recordings in a viewable format to any authorised authority on request.
 - 4. There will be signage in the premises, clearly visible to members of the public, which states that CCTV is in operation.
 - 5. The Premises will have a zero tolerance to drugs policy. Drugs found will be placed in a suitable locked receptacle kept for that purpose. Means for securing and unlocking the receptacle will be held by the Premises Licence Holder or a nominated responsible person. A record shall be made of the date and time of the find, the person who made the find and the person who secured the found item(s). This record will be made available to any authorised authority on request.
 - 6. The Premises Licence Holder shall make suitable arrangements with the police for the collection of any found items as soon as possible after they are found.
 - 7. There will be a duty of care policy formulated towards persons who are refused admission or ejected from the premises

- 7.3 Trading Standards requested additional conditions in relation to the challenge 25 scheme: The following were proposed and agreed with the applicant:
 - Challenge 25, proxy sales and individuals' responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 (Added as an addition condition within the staff training section)
 - Refresher training to be provided on an annual basis (for all staff training)
 - Challenge 25 condition amended to include 'with appropriate signage displayed at the points of sales'.
 - New condition, A refusals log will be maintained and made available to any responsible authority upon request. The refusals log can be kept either electronically or in a hard backed/bound book.
- 7.4 There are no outstanding representations from Responsible Authorities.

8. Representations received (Other Persons)

- 8.1 Two objections have been received off other persons, who have concerns in respect of the four licensing objectives. The representation map displays the location of representations in relation to the premises. (A copy of the 'other persons' location map can be found at **Appendix G**).
- 8.2 Principally the concerns relate to the additional times, outside alcohol sales and regulated entertainment due to the removal of trees having changed the sound attenuation of the venue. It is also claimed that there has been a previous noise abatement order at the venue and a previous licensing hearing to control noise elements, as per the current Annex 3 conditions. (Representations can be found at **Appendix H I**).
- 8.3 All aspects of representations have been accepted, for consideration, giving the benefit of the doubt to the person/s making the representation to allow them to amplify or clarify at the hearing.
- 8.4 There has been negotiations during the consultation period in order to remove the need for a hearing, but representations have not been withdrawn and the applicant has indicated they wish to continue with the application as submitted and accordingly amended.

9. Options for Consideration

- 9.1 The options available to the Licensing Sub-Committee having considered all the relevant information are as follows:
 - To refuse to grant the application
 - To grant the application with (or without) conditions in full (or in part)
- 9.2 If the application is to be granted in line with the submitted operating schedule as detailed in paragraph 6 and amendments/additions/conditions as agreed

- with authorities detailed in paragraph 7 of this report would need to be included in the licence, if deemed necessary, with an appropriate decision.
- 9.3 Additional conditions or restrictions to licensable activities and/or times should only be imposed if considered appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. If other law already places certain statutory responsibilities on a premises, it would not be appropriate to impose similar duties.
- 9.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should be advised that the applicant or any other person who made relevant representations in relation to the application may appeal against the decision made to the Magistrates' Court within 21 days of the date on which they were notified.

10. Standard of Decision Making

- 10.1 In accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's scheme of delegation, all applications where a relevant representation has been made need to be determined by this Sub-Committee.
- 10.2 When determining the application, the Sub-Committee should only consider issues, which relate to the four licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - The prevention of a Public Nuisance
 - The protection of Children from Harm
- 10.3 Members of the Sub-Committee must have regard to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy. Members of the Sub-Committee may deviate from the statutory guidance and licensing policy only if they deem that there is good reason to do so.
- 10.4 Members of the Sub-Committee should not allow themselves to predetermine the application or to be prejudiced in favour or opposed to the licence and shall only determine the application having had an opportunity to consider all relevant facts.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

For the supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or their personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Exhibition of films

For all premises licences and club premises certificate authorising the exhibition of films, access will be restricted only to those who meet the required age limit in line with any certificate granted by the British Board of Film Classification.

Admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with the recommendations given to films by a body designated under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification is the only body so designated.

Door Supervision

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Mandatory Drinks Code Conditions

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or,
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); .
- (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the

supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—.
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml.
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Mandatory Price Conditions

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

P=D+(DxV)

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.—(1) Paragraph 2 applies where the permitted price given by sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Embedded Restrictions

Where alcohol is sold for consumption off the premises it shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.







THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE / MYTTON MERMAID / A

As we all know the consumption of alcohol is unfortunately not a licensable activity and I would like to raise the following issues with regards to the consumption, timings and the associated activities that have historically emanated from the Beer Garden and the car parks of the Mytton and Mermaid.

On many occasions the noise levels generated by patrons when entering, socialising and subsequently leaving the premises have prevented us from sleeping and has had a detrimental impact on our our quality of life especially in the Summer Months.

We are of the opinion that the removal of several of the trees that have historically surrounded the front Beer Garden will have permanently changed the sound attenuation of the venue particularly in the area known as the front Beer Garden. Many of the Trees have been removed and we now have a direct line of sight from our property into the Beer Garden. We now fear that we will suffer from the lack of acoustic attenuation and as a result we will be subjected to a much higher level of noise emanating from the activities of Patrons enjoying the venue during the proposed 16 hours of daily alcohol sales. Previously where we as residents were acoustically and visually shielded from the sounds of patrons we now have a clear line of sight into the front beer garden and this is not something that we are relishing as we feel that we will now not be able to enjoy sitting outside enjoying our property in what is a very quiet rural area.

The addition of a rear walled garden will increase the potential for alcohol related unsociable noise levels that will no doubt emanate from the external areas where alcohol is proposed to be sold. Historically there has been lots of audible swearing from the outside areas and associated car parks. This includes domestic arguments as well as unrepeatable acts which we have witnessed in the car parks, particularly late at night whilst customers await for their taxis to arrive and depart.

We would like to know the intended capacity of the associated external drinking areas; the plans clearly show that these areas have the potential to accommodate large groups and gatherings. We would like to know how the exponential levels of external noise are to be managed? We are extremely worried that the levels will have a social, environmental effect on our quality of life and more importantly our mental health. This is due to the close proximity of our property to the external areas of the Mytton and the lack of sound attenuation within the design of the external areas particularly the proposed front Beer Garden.

We feel that the nature of the variation application will have a massive effect on our and fellow residents daily lives. It will cause unwanted anxiety and have a detrimental effect to our Mental

THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

We are concerned that the current application to vary the licence will result in additional noise and other nuisance to local residents. We have lived in Atcham for nearly twenty years, and the Mytton and Mermaid hotel has been a problematic neighbour throughout.

Some years ago, under a previous owner, we were forced to seek the involvement of the environmental health team, and a noise abatement order was issued, and conditions were placed on the licence to deal with severe noise nuisance. While these measures helped to a degree, they could not eradicate the nuisance. Over the years it has become clear to us that, even under more responsible management, the premises are simply not suitable for the playing of recorded or live music, as the historic buildings are unable to contain the noise. Under different owners, windows and doors have generally been left open in spite of the licensing condition. In our experience, the layout of the hotel site and other buildings in Atcham leads to sound being "channelled" towards the cottages on Malthouse Lane. We are therefore very opposed to any private parties or public events involving either live or recorded music on these premises, and we consider that any activity on the site after midnight (and particularly on weekdays) tends to result in unacceptable nuisance.

In addition to any events/functions, we have experienced ongoing nuisance from the sheer volume of customers. This is exacerbated by the location of the hotel in a small rural settlement, which would be very quiet at night without the hotel: the lack of other background noise makes any noise from either customers or music even more intrusive. In the past we have found that customers/hotel guests have tended to gather in large noisy groups outside on the front lawn or car park into the early hours of the morning. We are therefore very concerned that the current owners have made it clear they intend to intensify and expand their operations inside and out, which will only make matters worse. The expansion of the licensed area and the proposal to sell alcohol from outdoor bars seem entirely unnecessary and would inevitably result in additional noise for neighbours. The owners have also recently removed almost all trees and shrubs surrounding the front lawn, and the lack of this barrier will surely result in greater noise nuisance.

There has always been insufficient parking for staff and customers, with the result that Atcham becomes clogged with parked cars at busy times of the day and night (all along Malthouse Lane, which has often been obstructed, and on private land). When these customers leave late at night, we therefore experience the noise from their loud conversations, slamming car doors, revving engines etc in the lane in front of our house, and we experience similar nuisance from the front car park directly opposite our house: there we have also previously often observed arguments, people changing clothes, people playing their own music, drinking their own alcohol, sleeping overnight in vehicles and urinating on the car park. Our relaxation and sleep are inevitably disturbed by these activities, which impacts on our wellbeing. We therefore believe that the sale of alcohol until 1am, and late hours in the summer, at Christmas/New Year and all night on New Year's Eve are demonstrably unreasonable in this location.

Since Brunning and Price acquired the hotel, we have already had a number of issues around noise and inadequate management of the site during building works. This includes noisy vehicles and working from around 7am seven days a week, and the clanking of the site gate opposite our house at all hours. We also had a severe issue when they set up a generator to power the site 24 hours a day, which caused extreme noise and vibrations in our house. It appeared that, had we and our neighbours not repeatedly complained, this was intended to be a fairly long-term solution, which demonstrated a lack of consideration and consultation. This leads us to fear that Brunning and Price are unlikely to manage premises in a way that will minimize nuisance to us and our neighbours.

Over the years it has become evident to us that, given the issues with the fabric, arrangement and location of
the premises, most standard conditions can only somewhat reduce noise nuisance, but not solve the problem.
Therefore, while we would like to see the old conditions retained (ie: a noise limiter to be in place in any space
where music is to be played; windows and doors to be kept closed when music is played) we remain convinced
that these conditions are not sufficient for these premises. Therefore we would ask that you also consider:
No live music.
No music outdoors.
 No live or amplified music in the stables function room, which is a particularly problematic space.
 Reducing hours for entertainment and sale of alcohol to those more appropriate for a hotel/restaurant
(eg to end at 11pm).
No extended hours in the summer/Christmas/New Year.
 No sale of alcohol outdoors, and outdoor areas to be closed at midnight.
