44.1 The Chair advised the meeting that Sue Manns had agreed to fill the vacancy for a Vice Chair.

#### 45 Proposal to Transfer Waste Water from the Clun to the Onny

45.1 The meeting received the following updates: -

#### Proposal to Transfer Waste Water from the Clun to the Onny

The Chair advised that following a discussion at the Strategy and Performance Committee it was proposed that he write to Severn Trent expressing concern and seeking more information on the proposals. This course of action was approved by the Partnership.

#### Landscape Connections Project Proposal

The National Landscape Team Manager gave an update on the Landscape Connections project proposal which was being led by the National Trust. He advised members that an expression of interest would be submitted shortly.

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#### Land Use Framework Consultation Launch

The National Landscape Team Manager advised members that the government had recently launched a consultation on a new approach to land use, which was aimed at giving decision makers a toolkit to protect the most productive agricultural land and boost food security. He took the meeting through some of the key points of the consultation and stated that this would be brought back to a future meeting.

#### Test Case On 'Further the Purpose' Duty

The National Landscape Team Manager updated the committee on a recent judicial review where the government had admitted it had acted illegally when deciding on a development in a National Landscape without applying the statutory duty to further the purpose of the designation. He commented that this sets an important precedent for all National Parks and National Landscapes, as it made clear that all public bodies must comply with the new duty to seek to further the purpose of conserving and enhancing natural beauty in these areas.

#### Bishop's Castle Wind Turbine - Planning Application

The National Landscape Team Manager advised the meeting of an application for a single wind turbine situated within the National Landscape boundary near Bishop's Castle as part of the Bishop's Castle Heat and Wind Project and showed some details from the application. Members generally welcomed the project and agreed that the Partnership should not object. A member expressed concern regarding the infrastructure associated with such developments and it was agreed to check about any new overhead cabling resulting from the scheme.

#### 46 Management Plan Review

46.1 The National Landscape Team Manager updated the meeting on the update of the Management Plan. Members then split into groups for a workshop session around recommendations and aspirations.

The National Landscape Team Manager advised Members that it was proposed that a next draft of the plan would be brought to the next meeting for approval to publish for consultation.

#### **Summary**

#### **Background**

Drivers for the proposed updating of the structure include:

- Strengthened legal duty puts more emphasis on Relevant Authorities (RAs),
- Need to increase engagement from key delivery partners (both RAs and wider),
- Broadening participation and opportunities for groups and people to engage being more inclusive and strengthening the 'pathways' in for people's greater involvement,
- Encourage especially greater engagement by Parish & Town Councils (which are RAs),
- More modern methods of working including less in large formal committee format,
- Directions for governance indicated in the Glover Review and government response,
- More efficient use of staff team time and more useful value of meeting reports.

Different main functions which are still needed:

- Broad engagement of interested stakeholders and exploring topics and solutions,
- Co-ordinating delivery among key partners,
- Advisory oversight of work of the team and the National Landscape model,

Partner and stakeholder input to Management Plan review.
