The Town Council also fund the Beech Tree Community Centre who deliver youth provision through the voluntary sector.
5	Westbury £6000	No provision supported by the Parish Council. The area Youth worker has made contact twice. We will continue to do so on a termly basis.
6	Minsterley £6000	No work commissioned by Parish Council, However area Youth Worker has been in contact with them. The local church in the area is also picking up youth activity work and are starting an after-school club and have undertaken some holiday activity. The Youth Support Team have supported the start of this provision by undertaking some outreach in the area and promoting through school contacts in Mary Webb School.
7	Ellesmere £4000	Town council are continuing to work with TNS to provide activity in the area
8	Sel. Gob, St. Mart £12,000	St Martin – TNS are providing youth activity Weston Rhyn, Gobowen and Whittington.
9	B'North £14,500 pa	External funding to continue youth club. Town council are keen to engage with young people post Covid to understand their needs before they commission any work. The youth club has historically been poorly attended which is why they wanted to understand the needs of the young people before they commission. This can be

		Partnerships. The Parish council have also upgraded the facilities in the areas including resurfacing the skate park. This attracts a lot of young people from across other areas including Church Stretton, Shrewsbury and Ludlow.

All Town and Parish Councils are contacted regularly. We have also had requests for support from other Town Councils and Parish Councils. We have been invited to the Shrewsbury Town Council working groups to talk about our work, SALC – the Shropshire Association of Local Councils and also Cressage, Harley and Sheinton Parish council who were keen to establish work in their community with young people.

We continue to hear that new Town and Parish councils are utilising a hybrid model of Youth provision which includes a paid qualified youth worker and volunteers. A new youth club in church Stretton and Highley is being established using this model with support form their local councils. Bishops Castle Town Council have also allocated funding to support Youth Provision in the area.

The Youth Support Team are currently looking for resources that can support the Town and Parish Councils in the commissioning and delivery of Youth activity and Youth Work.
