

- Early years: 5.6% (78 children) of the population were aged 0 to 4 years in March 2011. This compares with 5.1% at County level, 6.3% regionally and 6.3% nationally.
- School age: 15.5% (214 children) of the population were aged 5 to 17 years in March 2011. This compares with 14.9% at County level, 15.8% regionally and 15.1% nationally.
- Working age: 58.1% (803 people) of the population were aged 18 to 64 years in March 2011. This compares with 59.3% at County level, 61.0% regionally and 62.3% nationally.
- Retirement age: 20.8% (287 people) of the population were aged 65 and over in March 2011. This compares with 20.7% at County level, 16.9% regionally and 16.3% nationally.
- Over 85 year olds: 3.0% (42) of the population were aged 85 and over in March 2011. This compares with 2.7% at County level, 2.2% regionally and 2.2% nationally.

#### **Diversity**

- The 2011 Census showed Burford Parish had a black and minority ethnic group population of 22 (1.6%). The largest broad ethnic group was 'Asian' (within this the largest group is 'Asian other'). The 2011 Census showed Burford Parish had no residents who identified themselves as being of the gypsy ethnic group.
- When asked about their religion 22.4% (310 people) identified themselves as having no religion or did not state it on the form. The majority of people (77.0%) identified themselves as Christian and 0.6% (8 people) identified themselves as having an alternative religion.
- The 2011 Census showed that 5 people could not speak English well.

### **Car Ownership**

• The 2011 Census showed that 75 households (13.2%) did not own a car and subsequently were reliant on other forms of transport such as public transport services. In total 837 cars were owned by households resident in the area.

### Health

#### **General Health**

The 2011 Census asked three questions relating to health and the provision of unpaid care. The questions relate to whether people felt their general health was good, whether they looked after or gave help or support to other family members, friends, neighbours or others and lastly whether their day to day activities were limited because of a health problem or disability.

- At the time of the 2011 Census 50% of people in Burford said that they felt they were in "Very Good Health", this compares to 46% for Shropshire as a whole.
- 0.7% reported that they were in "Very Bad Health". This is slightly less than the overall result for Shropshire (1%).

#### **Provision of Unpaid Care**

The question asked "do you look after, or give any help or support to family members, friends, neighbours or others because of either; a long term physical or mental ill health/disability? Or because of problems related to old age?


- At the time of the Census 7% said that they were providing 1 to 19 hours of unpaid care a week. This is in line with the Shropshire figure of 7%.
- 1% said they provided between 20 and 49 hours of unpaid care. This is in line with the Shropshire figure of 1%.
- 2% said they provided over 50 hours of unpaid care. This is in line with the figure for Shropshire as a whole (2%) and the figure for England & Wales (2%).

#### **Long Term Illness or Disability**

The Census asked "Are your day-to-day activities limited a lot due to a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?

- 7% said that their day-to-day activities were limited a lot due to a health problem or disability. This is less than the County figure of 8%.
- The percentage who reported their day-to-day activities were limited a little was 9%. This is less than the figure of 10% for Shropshire as a whole.

### **Index Multiple Deprivation**



The lower super output area that covers Burford Parish falls within Decile 7 nationally.

### Housing

- There were 569 households in Burford at the time of the 2011 Census.
- The parish had 1382 usual residents and covers an area of 603 hectares.
- 219 households were owner occupiers (owned outright) equating to 38.5% of all households. There were 188 households (33.0%) who owned their home with a mortgage or loan.
- There were 73 households (12.8% of all households) that privately rented their home from a landlord. There were also 7 households (1.2% of all households) who privately rented from a landlord classified as 'Other'.
- 9 households were renting social housing from the Council totalling 1.6% of all households. There were also 68 households (12.0%) renting social housing from 'Other' sources.
- In Burford there were 222 detached dwellings representing 37.6% of all dwellings. There were also 242 semi-detached and 102 terraced dwellings equating to 41.0% and 17.3% respectively.
- 14.6% of all households were one person pensioner households.
- 30.1% of households in the area had dependent children. The number of married couple households with dependent children was 105 and the number of cohabiting couples with dependent children was 28.
- There were 20 lone parent households (with dependent children), which equates to
- 3.5% of all households.

### **Unemployment and Labour Market**

#### **Unemployment**

- At the time of the Census, there were 26 residents who were unemployed but available for work. This is 2.6% of the 16-74 year old population, compared to 3.3% for Shropshire.
- 10 young people (aged 16-24) were unemployed. There were no unemployed 50-74 year olds.
- 26.92% of all unemployed people were classed as long-term unemployed in 2011. This is the equivalent of 7 people.

#### **Labour Force**

- 740 Burford residents aged 16-74 are economically active.
- 20.2% of the Burford population has level 4 or above qualifications compared with 27.5% in Shropshire and 27.4% in England.
- The number with no formal qualifications at all stands at 300 people at 26.8% of the population (aged over 16), this compares with the county average of 22.5%.
- 28.9% of the population work in standard occupation classifications 1-3 (managers, directors and senior officials, professional, associate professional and technical) and 23.3% work in standard occupation classifications 8 and 9 (process, plant and machine operatives and elementary occupations).

#### **Travel to Work (Census 2011)**

- 14.3% of the population in Burford are self-employed, and 4.8% work from home compared with 5.6% for Shropshire.
- The car is used as the main means of travel to work for 50.3%, while 0.9% use public transport.
