Sevenside Housing offers the following:

+ 1-2-1 SUPPORT

Individual 1-2-1 support to help develop skills and confidence, search and apply for jobs, work on your CV and research training courses that will help you get into work.

+ WORK EXPERIENCE & PLACEMENTS

We can offer work experience placements to people who will benefit from spending time in an office environment. We currently offer either a 2 week or 8 week work placements in an administrative or customer service role. Our 8 week work placements are delivered in partnership with the Job Centre. You will be allocated a mentor to support you through your placement and an action plan will be completed at the start of your placement to identify key areas in which you would like to gain experience. Follow up support is also available once the placement has ended to help you move into work. Please contact your Job Centre Work Coach for a referral to us.

+ GRANT FUNDING – SEVERNSIDE RESIDENTS ONLY

Our grant funding can support you if you are on a low income and are unable to fund training that will help you find employment. If you are a Sevenside resident you can make up to 2 grant funding applications a year. However, funding will be limited to a maximum of £100. To get started on applying for grant funding you will need to have a clear idea of the following: Training course or learning opportunity, cost of training and how the training will improve your chance of finding employment. Contact Sevenside to find out how to apply. We can however support people to apply for external funding if they are not a Sevenside resident.

+ LEARNING PROGRAMME

Sevenside Housing offers IT informal support and accredited training sessions on a wide range of subjects throughout the year through their Learning Programme that can help those looking to get into employment or further their career prospects. Sessions are accessible for anyone interested but there are some costs incurred so please contact us for more details and to request a brochure. 

This scheme offers 15 hours of free early years' education to eligible children.

If you can answer 'yes' to one or more of the following questions your child will be eligible to receive 15 hours of free early years education per week over 38 weeks of the year (or a total of 570 hours), from the beginning of the term after they turn two years old:

- Has your child left care through special guardianship or an adoption or residence order?
- Is the place for a child who is 'looked after' by a local council?
- Do you receive income support?
- Do you receive income-based jobseeker's allowance (JSA)?
- Do you receive income-related employment and support allowance (ESA)?
- Do you receive support through Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act?
- Do you receive the guaranteed element of state pension credits?
- Do you receive child tax credits and have an annual income not exceeding £16,190?
- Do you get working tax credits and earn no more than £16,190 a year?
- Does your child have a current statement of special educational needs (SEN) or an education, health and care plan?
- Does your child get disability living allowance?

The education must be taken over a minimum of two days per week, and between two-and-a-half hours and ten hours in any one day. If the offer is accessed over fewer than two days, then a portion of the offer will be lost. In some cases, the education can be taken flexibly or stretched over the year where the parent has requested this and the provider is able to do it.

Once a place has been agreed for a child, it will remain funded until the child becomes entitled to a free early education place at three years, even where the family circumstances change and they may no longer meet the criteria.

If you meet the criteria you are entitled to the free place from the term following your child's second birthday.

- If your child was born between 1 January and 31 March, you are entitled to the place from the Summer term (after Easter).
- If your child was born between 1 April and 31 August you are entitled to the place from the Autumn term (September).
- If your child was born between 1 September and 31 December you are entitled to the place from the Spring term (January).

TAX FREE CHILDCARE AND 30 HOURS OF FREE CHILDCARE

Tax-Free Childcare and 30 hours free childcare are two separate government schemes, to help parents with the cost of childcare. You can apply for both through one online application – the childcare service. To qualify for either scheme, parents must be working and each earning at least £120 a week (on average) and not more than £100,000 each a year.

Parents can use Tax-Free Childcare alongside the 15 and 30 hours free childcare schemes in England, or any free childcare hours provided by the Scottish, Welsh or Northern Ireland governments. Parents can't use Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as they receive childcare vouchers, Universal Credit or tax credits. However, 30 hours free childcare can be received alongside these schemes. When you apply, you'll be considered for both these services through the same application. You'll only be asked to decide which support you want if you're on tax credits or using a childcare voucher or salary sacrifice scheme. You should check what help you could get with childcare costs, using the childcare calculator. This will help you decide which support is best for you.

PLEASE NOTE: Anyone in who looks after one or more children under the age of 8 years in England, to whom they are not related, on domestic premises, for reward, and for a total of more than two hours in any day must register as a childminder.

NATIONAL SUPPORT AVAILABLE

ACCESS TO WORK GRANTS

Access to work grants can help pay for practical support if you have a disability, health or mental health condition to help you:

- start working
- stay in work
- move into self-employment or start a business

The grant is not for business start-up costs.

How much you get will depend on your circumstances.

The money doesn't have to be paid back and it will not affect your other benefits.

WORK CHOICE

Work Choice can help you get and keep a job if you're disabled and find it hard to work.

It's voluntary - you don't have to do it. The type of support you get depends on the help you need. This is different for everyone but can include:

- training and developing your skills
- building your confidence
- interview coaching
- Work Choice is delivered by different providers across the country. Providers offer 2 levels of help.

LEVEL OF HELP	WHAT YOU GET	HOW LONG IT LASTS
Work Entry Support	Advice on work and personal skills to help you find a job	Up to 6 months
In-Work Support	Help to start work and stay in your job	Up to 12 months

- Work Entry Support can be extended by 3 or 6 months in exceptional circumstances and when there is a clear prospect of a job.

To find out how to join Work Choice, speak to a Disability Employment Adviser (DEA) or Work Coach at your local Jobcentre Plus office.

NATIONAL CITIZEN SERVICE

NCS are a government programme for 15 to 17 year olds (25 if they have a disability) to learn new skills that will help towards employment and general skills (including living away from home).

Part of the programme involves taking part in a project that will contribute to benefiting the community including help with social media, fund raising, general volunteering, workshop delivery, building e.g. raising funds for causes (homeless charities); building raised beds for youth club with wheelchair users; Building a chicken coop at an older peoples home; hosting sports festivals for disabled children.

There are around 490 people enrolled with NCS across Summer in Telford area, with more young people across wider Shropshire. They also have contacts with over 500 graduates that have completed the project over the last two years.

DO YOU CLAIM JOBSEEKERS ALLOWANCE OR UNIVERSAL CREDIT?

Think about your claimant commitment

At your claim interview, your work coach will have a discussion with you so you can agree all the things you will do every day in return for your benefits. This is called your “Claimant Commitment”. It will include all the steps you will take to look for a job.

Your Claimant Commitment may include:

- what you need to do to look for work - for example registering with recruitment agencies, writing a CV
- how many hours you need to spend looking for work each week

What you agree to do will depend on things like:

- your health
- your responsibilities at home
- how much help you need to get work or increase your income

It is therefore important that tell your work coach if there are any reasons why you can't take certain actions. For example, if you are affected by any of the following:

Disclosing any of the above barriers will help you by allowing your Work Coach to identify specific support and refer you to a specialist organisation. This help is non-judgemental and tailored to meet your individual needs and will not affect your benefit.

IMPORTANT

Your Jobseekers Allowance / Universal Credit may be stopped if you don't do what you've agreed to in your Claimant Commitment and you can't give a good reason.
