

## **Closure of Shropshire Council Recycling Bring Sites**

As a result of substantial Government funding reductions, Shropshire Council must significantly reduce its budget and make unprecedented changes to its services.

We are therefore consulting on a proposal to close Shropshire Council recycling bring bank recycling sites (typically located in pub, supermarket and village hall car parks.

Bring banks are currently provided at 120 sites across Shropshire and allow people to recycle household waste including paper, cans, glass, clothing, and cartons - items which are collected fortnightly by the kerbside service provided to each household or can be recycled at a household recycling centre.

It is estimated that removal of the sites would result in a saving to the Council of £230,000 a year, money that would then be put towards the provision of other vital services.

Before we make a decision we would like to understand how this will affect you. This questionnaire is an opportunity for you to tell us what you think.
