

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP
AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981
THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 9 (PART), TOWN OF WEM)
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2019**

The above named order made on 7th February 2019 by the Shropshire Council (“the Council”) under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will **divert**

the full width of that part of Footpath 9, Town of Wem, from point A on the Order Map (SJ 5080 2881) where it leaves Bankhouse Lane, running in a general south easterly direction for approximately 94 metres to meet an existing gate at point B on the Order Map (SJ 5072 2877); **onto a line** to be created from a pedestrian gate at point C on the Order Map (SJ 5080 2879) where it leaves Bankhouse Lane, running in a general south-south-westerly direction on a natural surface and alongside a pasture field boundary for approximately 59 metres. From here it turns to continue along the field boundary in a general north westerly direction for approximately 56 metres to meet an existing pedestrian gate at point B on the Order Map (SJ 5072 2877); a total distance of approximately 115 metres with a width of 2 metres throughout.

A copy of the order and the order map and an explanatory statement have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the Council offices at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours or via the Council’s website at <https://shropshire.gov.uk/outdoor-partnerships/countryside-access-and-public-rights-of-way/current-public-path-orders/>. Copies of the order and map may be bought from the Council, at the above address at a cost of £6.50.

Any representations about or objections to the order may be sent in writing to Shropshire Outdoor Partnerships, Rights of Way Mapping and Enforcement Manager, The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury, SY2 6ND, or by email to outdoor.recreation@shropshire.gov.uk, not later than 8th March 2019. Please state the grounds on which they are made.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Council may confirm the order as an unopposed order. If the order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the order.
