

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION AND COMING INTO OPERATION OF PUBLIC PATH  
ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980  
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981  
THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 17 (PART) PARISH  
CHIRBURY WITH BROMPTON) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2019**

On 18<sup>th</sup> July 2019, The Shropshire Council (the “Council”) confirmed the above named order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The effect of the order as confirmed is to **divert**

the full width of that part of Footpath 17 from point A on the order map (SO 2329 9350), running in a general southerly direction for approximately 265 metres to point B on the order map (SO 2331 9324) at West Penyllan, then turning to run in a general westerly direction for a further 345 metres to point C on the order map (SO 2299 9327), a distance of approximately 610 metres; **onto a line** from point A on the order map (SO 2329 9350), running in a general WSW direction following a field edge path to a pedestrian gate (SO 2312 9340), then crossing a farm track to another pedestrian gate (SO 2311 9340) on the other side of the track and continuing in a general south westerly direction on a cross field path to a pedestrian gate at point C on the order map (SO 2299 9327) where it meets the county boundary with Powys; a total distance of approximately 375 metres with a width of 2 metres throughout.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours or via the Council’s website at <https://shropshire.gov.uk/outdoor-partnerships/countryside-access-and-public-rights-of-way/current-public-path-orders/>. Copies of the order and map may be bought from the Council at the above address at the price of £6.50.

Shropshire Council certify that the order becomes operative on 18<sup>th</sup> July 2019; but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 18<sup>th</sup> July 2019 make an application to the High Court.
