## THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (FOOTPATH 6 (PART), PARISH OF CORELEY) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2019

The above named order made on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2019 by the Shropshire Council ("the Council") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will **divert** 

the full width of that part of Footpath 6 from point A on the order map (SO 6132 7494), running in a general north-north-easterly direction across a field to meet the County Road at point B on the order map (SO 6139 7506); a distance of approximately 138 metres; **onto a line** from point C on the order map (SO 6133 7483), running in a general easterly then north-north-easterly direction across a field following the line of a hedged field boundary to meet the County Road via a pedestrian gate at point D on the order map (SO 6144 7498); a total distance of approximately 196 metres with a width of 2 metres throughout.
