

**NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION AND COMING INTO OPERATION OF
PUBLIC PATH ORDER AND DEFINITIVE MAP
AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER**

**HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCIL (BRIDLEWAY 18 (PART), PARISH OF UPTON MAGNA)
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2019**

On 17th October 2019, The Shropshire Council (the "Council") confirmed the above named order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981. The effect of the order as confirmed is to

divert the full width of that part of Bridleway 18, Upton Magna, from point A on the order map (SJ 5606 1327), running in a general south westerly direction for approximately 252 metres then turning to follow a general north westerly direction for a further 54 metres approximately to point B on the order map (SJ 5584 1313); a total distance of approximately 306 metres; **onto a line** to be created from point B on the order map (SJ 5584 1313) that part of Bridleway 18, Upton Magna, running in a general north-north-easterly direction for approximately 272 metres following a field edge path and passing the Hunkington Reservoir to the east to point C on the order map (SJ 5598 1335). From here the route turns to run in a general south easterly direction following a track for a further 110 metres to point A on the order map (SJ 5606 1327); a total distance of approximately 382 metres with a width of 3 metres throughout.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at The Shirehall, Abbey Foregate, Shrewsbury during normal office hours or via the Council's website at <https://shropshire.gov.uk/outdoor-partnerships/countryside-access-and-public-rights-of-way/current-public-path-orders/>. Copies of the order and map may be bought from the Council at the above address at the price of £6.50.

Shropshire Council certify that the order becomes operative on 17th October 2019; but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 17th October 2019 make an application to the High Court.
