Who we are?

How do we collect information from you?

We collect information from you when you visit the Shropshire Council website also when you contact us in writing, speak to us on the phone, by email or any other type of electronic communication, or talk to us face to face.

What types of information do we collect from you?

We collect different categories of information about you, depending on the service you want from us and/or the reason why we need to process information relating to you. This could be personal information (for example your name and address), or other more sensitive data that we would only collect and use in very particular circumstances that are set out in law.

Details of information obtained from third parties?

Council's school census for reception children and year 6 attending Shropshire schools and school nurse's measurement records.

How is your information used?

We may use your information to:

Include information about how the information will be processed for example;

- NCMP is a nationally mandated public health programme for local authorities and the delivery of the surveillance elements of the NCMP; completing the height and weight measurements and returning relevant data to NHS Digital; is a statutory function of local authorities set out in legislation. Public Health England have produced a operational guidance document - https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment_data/file/817417/NCMP_Operational_Guidance_2019.pdf
- The census for each school is uploaded into the electronic tool.
- School nurses access this tool to plan their visits and measure the children and enter these measurements on the national data collection tool.
- Once all data has been collected, the super user of the council electronically submits the data to the national child measurement team at public health England.
- The data tool contains the children's names, addresses, date of births, school, ethnicity, NHS number, whether they or their parents consented to take part, if not, the reason why, and if they did consent, their height and weight and body mass index and BMI category.
- The final data is validated by the national team and an anonymised national report is produced.

- After the data has been validated, the super user of the local authorities is able to access the full dataset for their authority for local anonymous analysis which can be used to inform planning of services.

Research and statistics

Anonymised and pseudonymised data may be used for research & statistical purposes. Any data collected may be used for research and statistical purposes that are relevant and compatible with the purpose that the data was collected for.

Who has access to your information?

We may share your information with the following third parties for the reasons detailed;

Provide details of any third parties that you share data with

- School nurses at Shropshire Community Trust so that they can send out letters to parents to inform them of the program and ability to withdraw consent from taking part; to plan visits to schools to measure children who have consented to take part; to correctly assign height and weight measurements to the child; and to be able to feedback the results of the measurements to the child's parents.
- National Child Measurement Program at Public Health England as all NCMP data must be shared with them.

We will not sell or rent your information to third parties. We will not share your information with third parties for marketing purposes.

What are your rights in relation the personal data we process?

Access – you can request copies of any of your personal information that is held by the Council.

Rectification – you can ask us to correct any incorrect information.

Deletion – you can ask us to delete your personal information. The Council can refuse to delete information if we have a lawful reason to keep this.

Portability – you can ask us to transfer your personal data to different services or to you in some circumstances.

Right to object or restrict processing – you have the right to object to how your data is being used and how it is going to be used in the future.

Right to prevent automatic decisions – you have the right to challenge a decision that affects you that has been made automatically without human intervention, for example an online form with an instant decision.

How long will we keep your information for?

We keep and dispose of all records in line with our corporate retention schedule. We will comply with Data Protection legislation in regards to how long we keep your data.

What security precautions in place to protect the loss, misuse or alteration of your information?

We are strongly committed to data security and will take reasonable and appropriate steps to protect your personal information from unauthorised access, loss, misuse, alteration or corruption. We have put in place physical, electronic, and managerial procedures to safeguard the information you provide to us. However, we cannot guarantee the security of any information you transmit to us. We recommend that you take every precaution to protect your personal information.
