Turning to **local support for Jewish children during the Second World War,** the Archives Service have found a document containing the minutes of the Mayor of Shrewsbury's Committee for Jewish Refugee Children, detailing support and fundraising activities over the war years. It is in a small exercise book, and at 28 pages of densely packed writing offers a fascinating glimpse into the generosity of local people and local institutions such as the High School.

The minutes from the Mayor of Shrewsbury's committee are written in the copperplate writing style of the time, with pages reproduced below as an example.

The Archives Service would be happy to assist anyone wishing to know more about these efforts, which may be seen very much as a forerunner to the support given by communities across the county to help Syrian refugee families to settle here in the present day.
