High Streets Heritage Action	Matters Arising: HSHAZ Board has been set up and meets monthly.	Done

	19 Expressions of Interest received (9 shopfront & 10 Repurposing grants) which are eligible and have been discussed at the HSHAZ Board in January. These EOIs will be invited to come forward as full applications. Two application forms have now been received. Applicants will need to undertake conditions survey and permissions will be required. Anticipated that the applications will be presented to the HSHAZ Board in April.	
	Feasibility work to test the vision and business plan for the proposed flagship proposal for business incubation will consider a range of sites. Historic England require spend to be committed by mid-March. Discussed use of master plan consultants for the feasibility work to expediate the work. Meeting with agents planned – the discussion will feed into the planned work.	
	Valuations for buildings highlighted for potential flagship projects will be undertaken. Property Service group will undertake conditions surveys for properties identified.	
	Design ideas for the alleys to be explored. Any designs would be shared publicly for comments.	
	Community Engagement Plan in development and social media has been set up.	
	Cultural Consortium application for funding the 3 year cultural programme has been submitted to Historic England. Awaiting a response from Historic England.	

Indicative masterplan and movement / access strategy	The masterplan is still in the very early stages and draws on research and previous studies in addition to discussions, initial engagement with key partners and stakeholders and the promoted online survey. The masterplan presentation highlights areas of potential development; movement and access strategic thinking; and public realm opportunities. Ongoing discussions will help further shape potential proposals and actions that could and should be worked up in the short, medium and long term. The key stakeholder workshop (virtual) is to be held on 4 March 2021. Format to include break-out sessions around the key themes. Following the presentation, it is proposed that themed workshops will be held with key stakeholders and partners. A workshop with 30 students is also planned. Press coverage prior to workshop has given the perception that decisions have been made, with issues and concerns being raised as a result. Individual responses to these are being made.

An updated newsletter is in preparation which will be shared.</li> <li>The application for planning permission for the overbridge across the A5 linking the Oswestry Innovation Park with the Sustainable Urban Extension site is currently being considered as an addendum to the planning application for the road improvements.</li> <li>Work has been ongoing by the council to test the potential for prospective employment and commercial development usage on the OIP through feasibility and development appraisal work.</li> <li>The funding secured from the Marches LEP and Homes England's Housing Infrastructure Fund will support the wider programme of activities including the road improvements, bridge and other associated works to support the development of the Oswestry Innovation Park.
