Reasons why the Shropshire Local Plan Representation form Part B plan is not Legally Compliant, Sound and Fails to Comply with the Duty to Co-operate

Not Legally Compliant

Proposals to designate BLK008a, a greenfield site, as a preferred site, is opposite to the government's National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) document where Para 118c says "Give weight to the value of using suitable brownfield land within settlements for homes and other identified needs and support other appropritate opportunities to remediate despoiled, degraded, derelect, contaminated or unstable land". The use of brownfield sites, as stated in the NPPF, is supported in Shropshire Council's Local Development Framework paper. Shropshire Council includes these policies by placing BUCK001 on its Brownfield Land Register. Shropshire Council has completely ignored Paras 4.66 and 4.70 of its own Framework document. This document mentions a "bottom up" approach and a "community engagement" process. This is **Not Legally Compliant.**

Unsound

In preferred site consultations in 2017 and 2018/2019, greenfield site BKL008a was removed as a preferred site after talks with Bucknell Parish Council and comments by Bucknell residents. This was on the understanding that addditional housing could be placed on BUCK001. Site BKL008a was again included by Shropshire Council at the Regulation 18 consultation in 2020 at Para 5.38 implying that BKL008a would permit new housing to be built earlier than on BUCK001. This suggests that new housing on BKL08a will be granted before BUCK001 is developed. It is also different to Appendix 7 where development for BKL008a is forecast for 2035 to 2038 and makes this part of the Plan completely unsound. It is totally against Bucknell residents wishes.

Fails to Comply with the Duty to Co-operate

Around 2017, Bucknell residents unenthusiasticly agreed to becoming a 'hub'. By doing so, residents believed that they would get an improved infrastructure and villagers would be able to control the number of dwellings in the village and the location of them, along along with new shops, schools etc. Mr Peter Nutting, Shropshire Council's Leader, addressed a residents meeting in Bucknell in September 2019 when he reinforced his promise that the views of the village residents would be of utmost importance. BKL008a was removed from the SamDev Plan and that promises made previously were being adhered to. In Regulation 18 in 2020 the greenfield site BKL008a was reinstated and Bucknell residents were extremely upset by this decision. Bucknell Parish Council stated their objection as did the numerous comments along with a petition signed by 112 Bucknell residents. Documentation contained within the "summary of responses to Q4 comments" plainly shows the rejection of BKL008a as a preferred site. The Bucknell residents' comments seem to have been completely disregarded by Shropshire Council officers. This may be due to insufficient staffing of planning specialists able to read and understand the implications. This I interpret as "fails to comply with the duty to co-operate" with the residents of Bucknell".
