Market Town Profile

Market Drayton

Market Drayton is a market town in north Shropshire, close to the Welsh and Staffordshire border. It is on the River Tern, between Shrewsbury and Stoke-on-Trent, and was formerly known as "Drayton in Hales" (c. 1868) and earlier simply as "Drayton" (c. 1695). The town is of Saxon origin and was referred to as Draitune in the Domesday Book. Market Drayton is on the Shropshire Union Canal and on Regional Cycle Route 75. The A53 road by-passes the town. The counties of Staffordshire and Cheshire are both close by. In 1245 King Henry III granted a charter for a weekly Wednesday market, giving the town its current name. The market is still held every Wednesday.

The town is famous for its gingerbread and has been home to gingerbread for 200 years, with its own recipe. In times gone by Market Drayton was famed for its damson fairs when the textile makers from the north would buy the damsons to make dye for their cloth. Nowadays damsons are in local jams, cheeses, pies and of course, gin. Adding to a strong food and drink culture, Muller Dairy, Palethorpes Pie factory and Joules Brewery are nearby and are large employers in the area.

The town also has some impressive architecture with half timbered and red brick buildings in the town centre and the skyline is dominated by the 14th century church which is built from local sandstone. At the centre of the town lies the Buttercross, a stone portico that was built in 1824 to act as cover for the local market stalls. Robert Clive (Clive of India) is the towns most famous son.

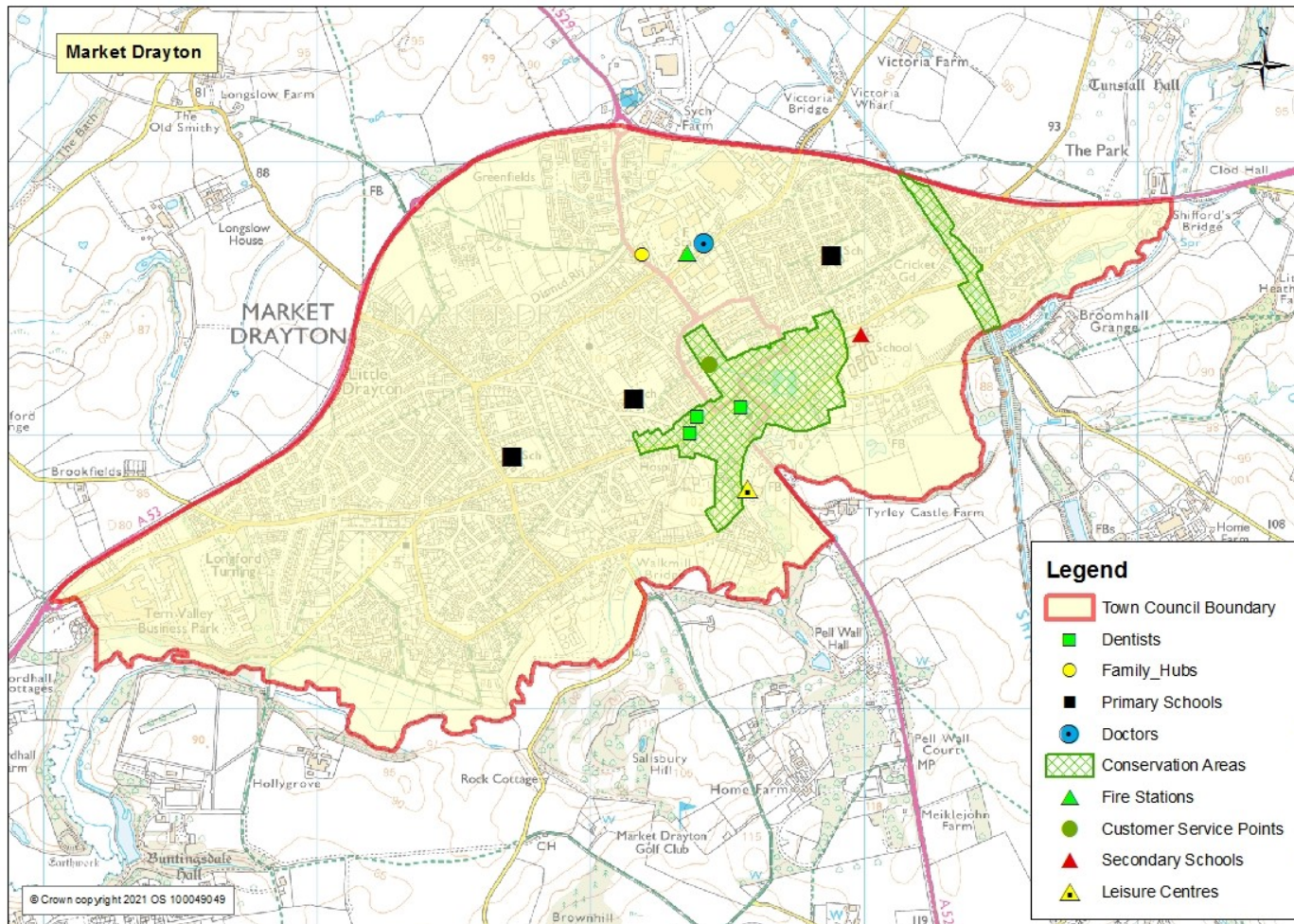

Market Drayton is the fourth largest town in Shropshire by population. The latest population of Market Drayton is 12,100 (Mid Year Population Estimates, ONS, 2015) covering 461 hectares. Market Drayton’s population density was 25.5 people per hectare, making it the most densely populated of all Shropshire Market Towns. Market Drayton’s population consists of 49% male and 51 % female. Market Drayton Parish Council population has increased since 1981 from 8,247 to 11,773 in 2011. This is an increase of 43% in 30 years.

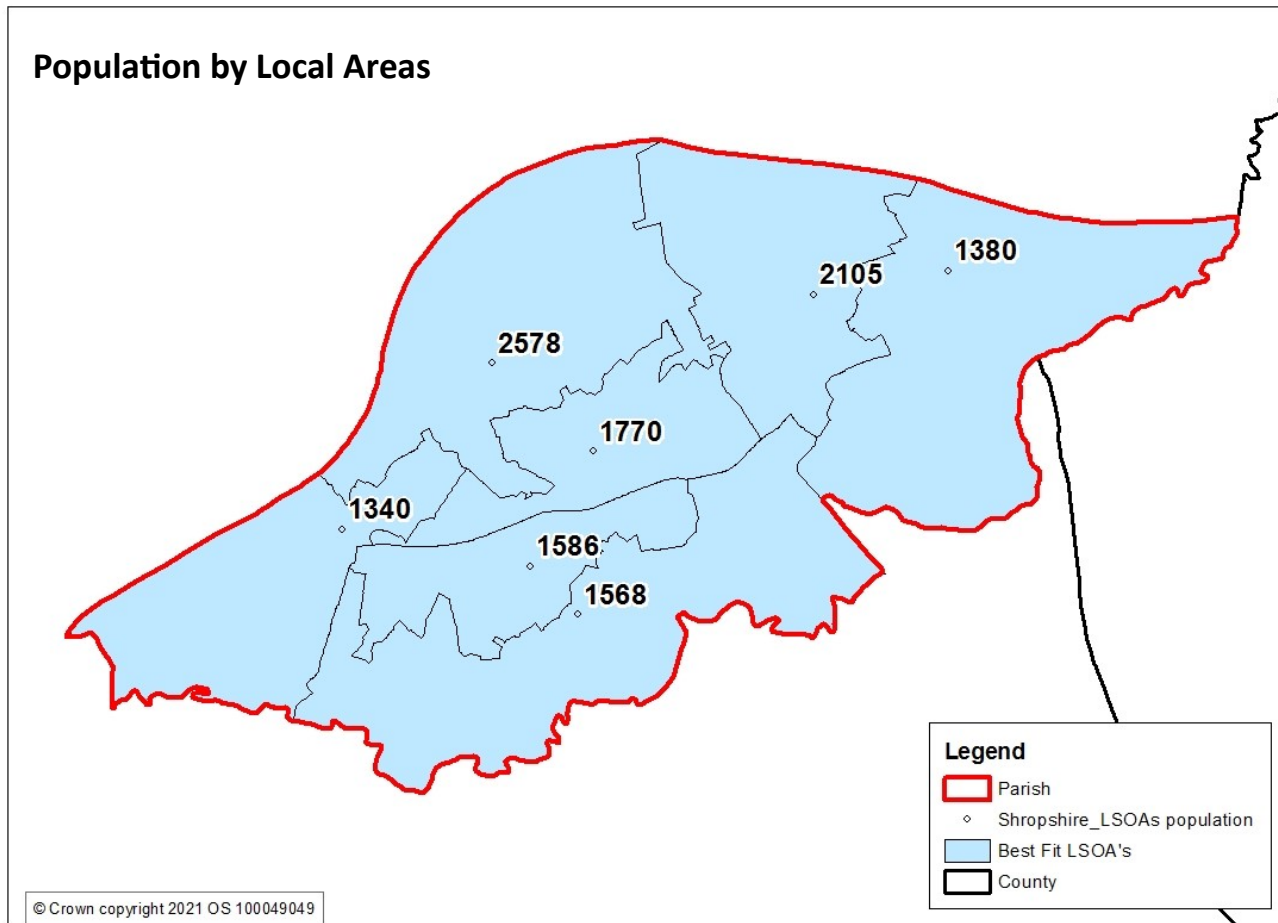
The population of Market Drayton area is forecast to rise from 11,800 in 2011 to 13,900 in 2026. This is a rise of 17.8% over this period. The largest part of this increase is expected between 2016 and 2026, when the population is forecast to rise by 1800 people or 15%.

The number of dwellings is also forecast to increase from 5,300 in 2011 to 6,200 in 2026. This is an increase of 17.4%. Similarly the largest part of this growth is forecast to happen between 2016 and 2026.

The number of households are forecast to increase by 17.7% between 2011 and 2026, in a similar manner to dwellings.

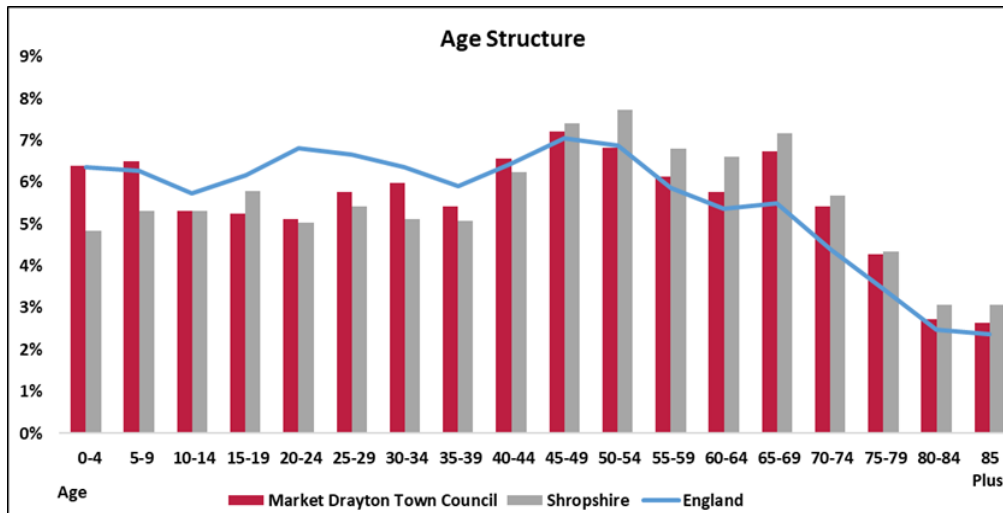
Population by Local Areas

The information in this market town is predominantly focussed on the town council area of Market Drayton. Due to the nature of national statistical data it is not always possible to fully replicate these boundaries. Statistics quoted in this profile will use the best fit to the town council area. If these are not available the next best fit is the use of Lower Super Output Areas. These small area figures are part of a national dataset which comprises of 32,000 areas of which there are 192 in Shropshire and 7 which cover most of the town council area.



Age Structure

- The age structure in Market Drayton shows that there is a younger age profile in the town when compared to Shropshire.
- Most of the age bands under the age of 44 show a higher percentage than for Shropshire.
- Conversely, Market Drayton has a lower rate of people in the age bands over the age of 50.
- Despite having a younger age profile than Shropshire, Market Drayton has an older profile when compared to England.
- Market Drayton has a greater proportion of young people aged 0 to 9
- There is a higher rate of people aged 20 to 40 compared to Shropshire, this could be due to the Tern Hill Barracks at the time of the Census.

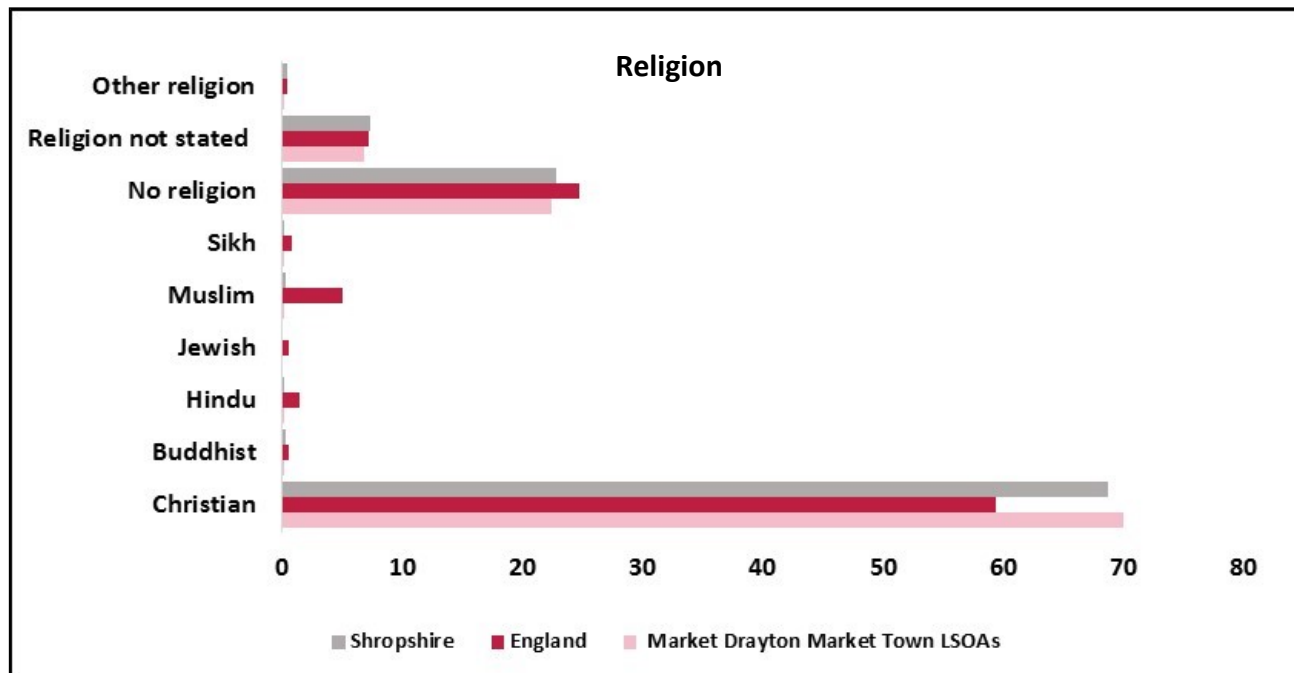
7,300 Market Drayton residents are of traditional working age (16-64) which is the equivalent of 59.0% of the population. This compares with 58.9% for Shropshire as a whole, 61.7% in the West Midlands and 62.5% in Great Britain.

Ethnicity and Religion

The total BME (black minority ethnic group) in Market Drayton was 1.6% or 183 of the total population at the time of the 2011 Census. The largest group was Asian/Asian British, 0.8%. Ethnicity levels in Market Drayton are similar to Shropshire but significantly lower than England.

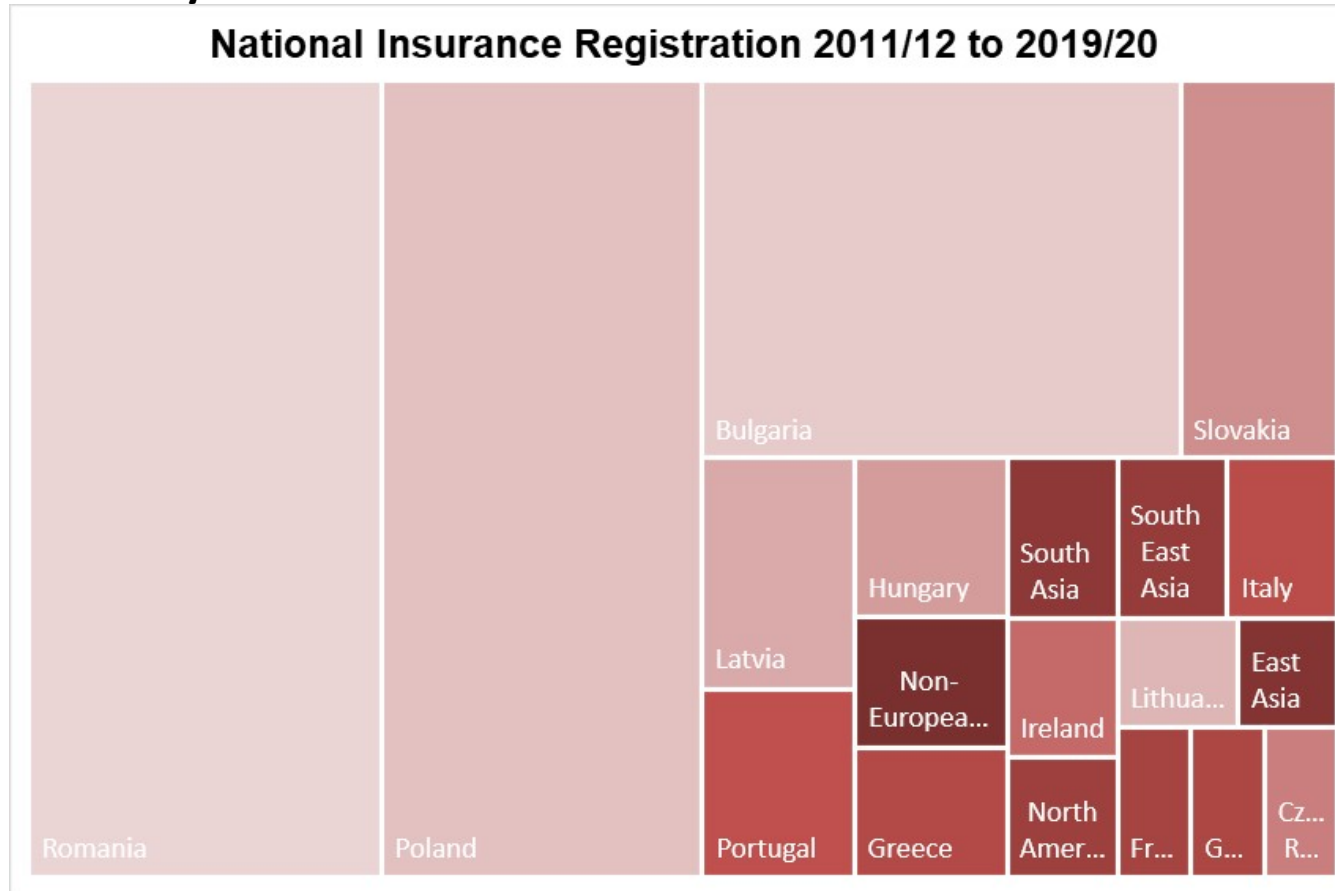

In 2011, more than two-thirds of the Market Drayton population affiliated themselves with a religion. This percentage is similar to Shropshire and England. As is the case county-wide and nationally, the vast majority classified their religion as Christian (70% of the population or 98.8% of those expressing any religious affiliation). Other religions represented in Market Drayton include Buddhism and Hinduism and Muslim.

Ethnicity



The latest ethnicity data is taken from the 2011 census. The next census is due in 2021 with the results likely to be published from 2023. To help provide an indication of changes to ethnicity data the number of National Insurance registrations to adult overseas nationals entering the UK are shown. These numbers should only be used as an indication of population changes. A registration does not mean that a national has made permanent residence or has remained in the Market Drayton area.

The numbers shown are based on Middle Layer Super Output Areas. These areas are larger than the lower layers described in the population map.

There is one middle layer that covers the Market Drayton town centre area, which closely matches the parish boundary. The total number of registrations made during this period has been 474 with the most numerous being 128 Romanian, 116 Polish and 82 Bulgarian nationals.

Ethnicity and Religion

Market Drayton is home to a number of churches and chapels which reflect the majority of the population who have a Christian faith.

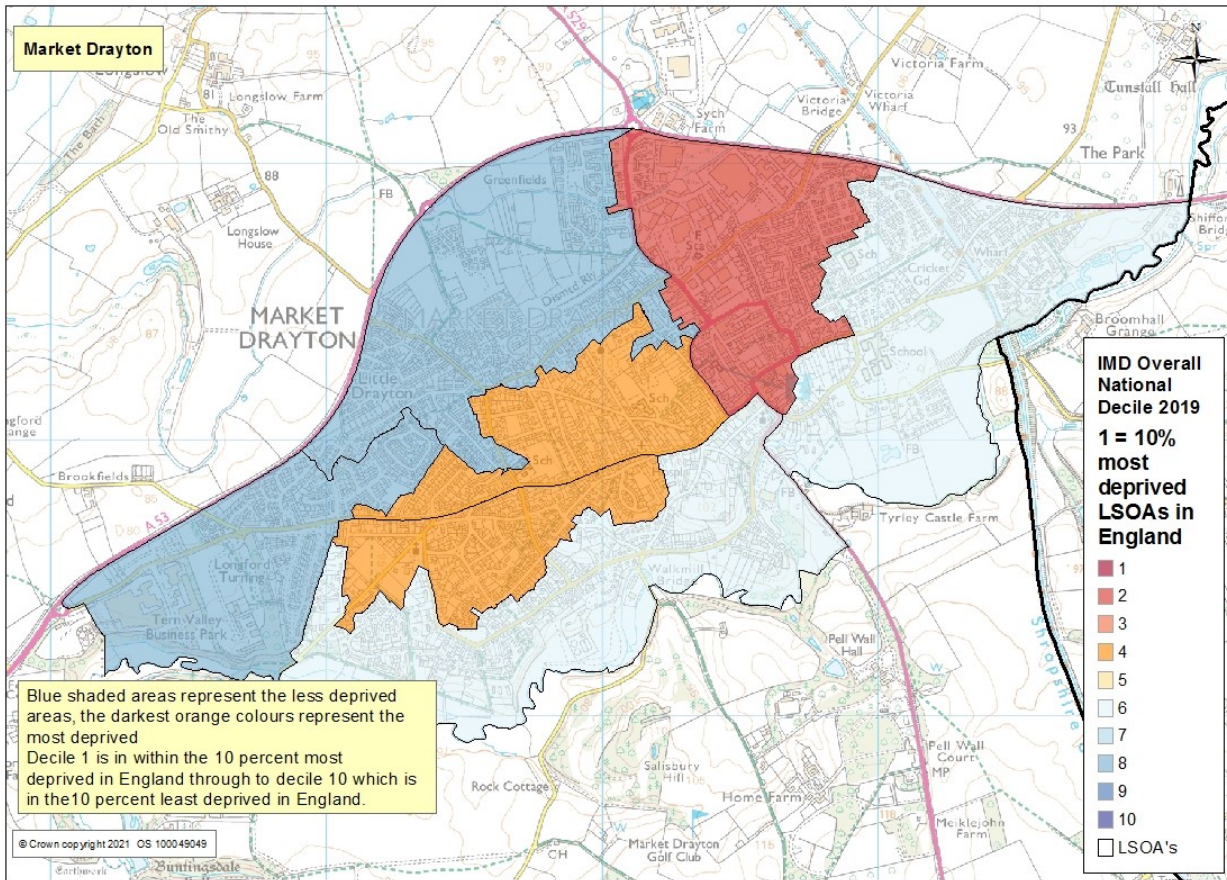

- Living environment deprivation

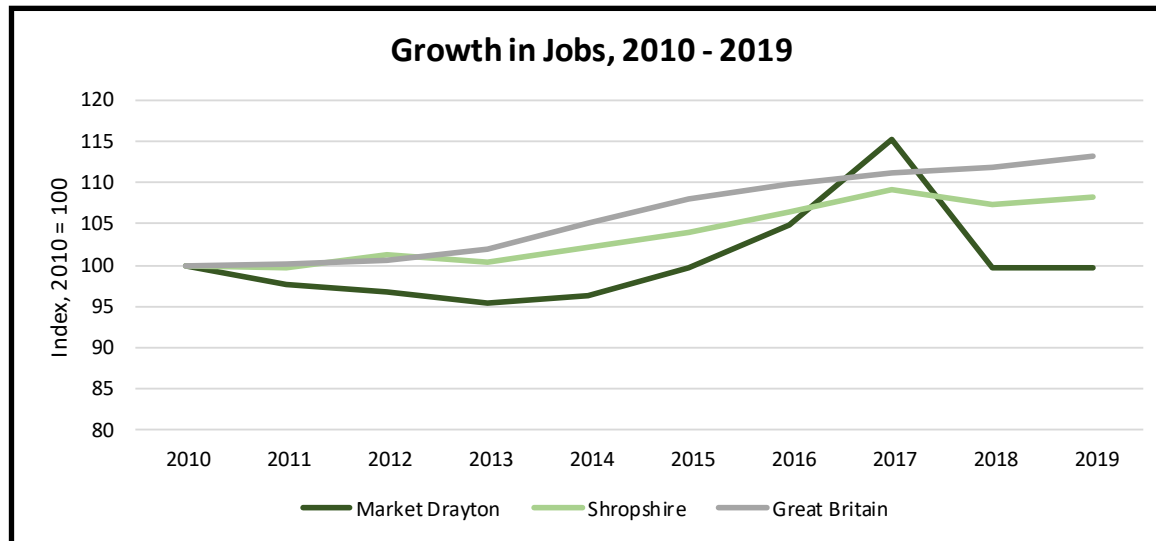

Economy

Market Drayton is the equal fourth largest employment centre in Shropshire (alongside Bridgnorth) and is the main location of businesses and jobs in the north east of the County. 437 businesses have registered offices in Market Drayton (Source: FAME (Bureau van Dijk), February 2021) which is 2% of the Shropshire total and approximately 4,800 people are employed in the town (3.8% of the Shropshire total).



Over the last nine years, the number of jobs in Market Drayton has fluctuated somewhat, with strong growth in 2017 offset by a substantial decline in 2018. Overall, the number of jobs in the town in 2019 remained unchanged compared with 2010. In comparison, the number of jobs in Shropshire rose by 8.3% over the same period while nationally, job growth of 13.2% was achieved.

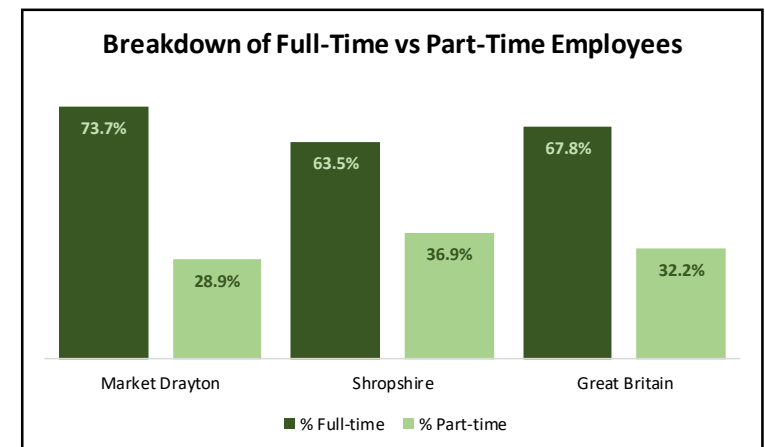
In addition, there are approximately 200 business proprietors/sole traders based in the town, taking overall employment levels to 5,000.

Breakdown Part/Full Time

Part-time employment is more common in Shropshire than it is regionally or nationally. However, in Market Drayton, full-time jobs dominate, accounting for 74% of the total compared with 64% in Shropshire and 68% nationally.

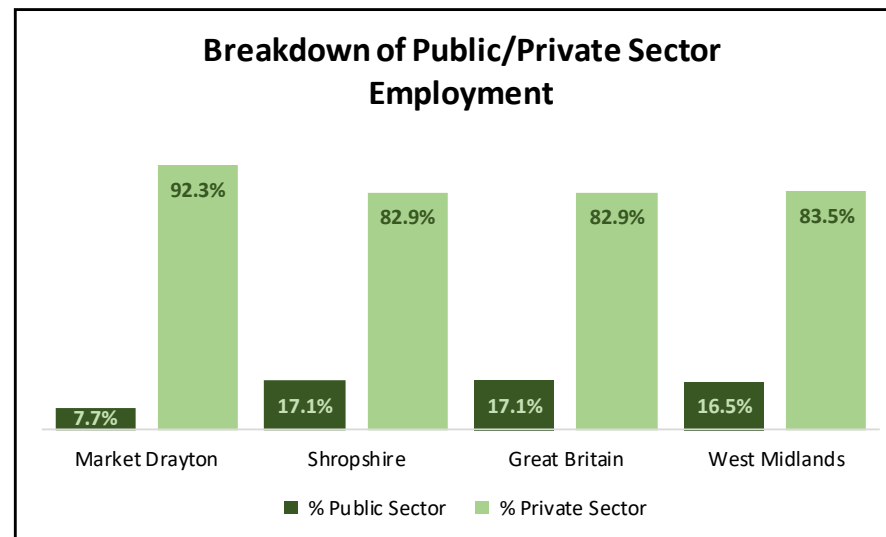

Public/Private Sector

Across Shropshire, the number of public sector jobs has fallen by 4,700 since 2010 (-18.2%) while the number of private sector jobs has risen by 17,800 (+20.9%). The share of all the jobs attributable to the public sector has declined from 23.3% in 2010 to 17.1% by 2019. Employment in the public sector has been largely stable since 2015, with the rapid decline in public service based employment occurring during the first half of the 2010's.

In Market Drayton, public sector jobs account for less than 10% of all employment, notably less than the Shropshire average. Public sector employment has fallen in the town since 2015 (-19.7%) while the number of private sector jobs has risen by +6.0%.



Employment Sectors

The four largest employment sectors in Market Drayton are manufacturing, wholesale, retail and transport & storage. Together these account for 52.6% of employment within the town. Manufacturing accounts for a 15.5% share of jobs (9.9% in Shropshire), while wholesale accounts for 16.5% of employment compared with just 4.4% county-wide. Retail is typically over-represented in towns, and is an especially important employment sector in Market Drayton, providing 10.3% of jobs. Transport & storage also accounts for just over one in ten jobs. Other sectors accounting for more than 5% of jobs include accommodation & food services, professional, scientific & technical, business administration & support, health and education.

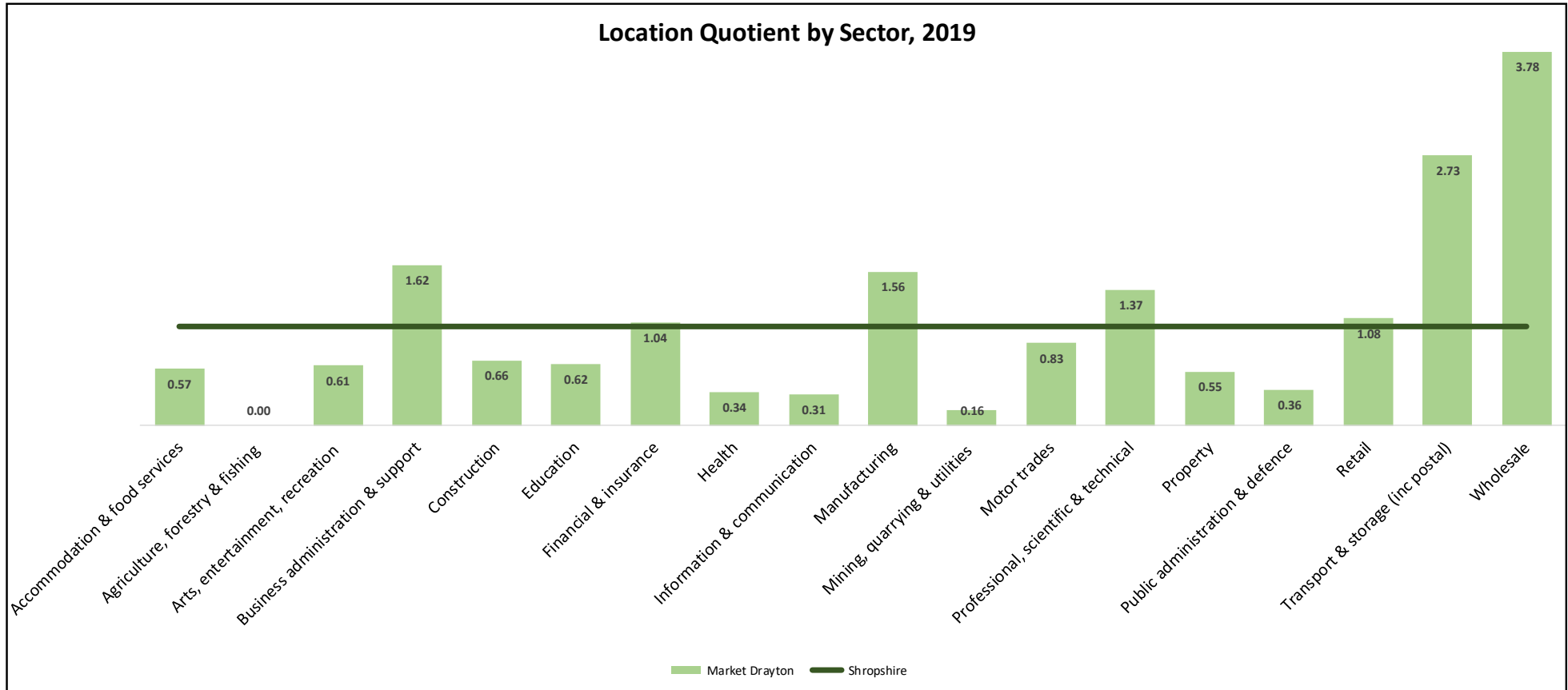

The adjacent table shows the breakdown of employment sectors in Market Drayton alongside the comparable breakdowns for Shropshire, the West Midlands and for Great Britain.

It shows that agriculture, mining & quarrying, construction, motor trades, information & communication, finance & insurance, property, public administration and defence and arts, entertainment & recreation employ relatively few people in Market Drayton (13.8% of the total), with none of these sectors accounting for as much as 5% of total employment.

The chart on the following page shows the relative importance of each sector in Market Drayton according to its location quotient. This measures each sector in relation to the Shropshire average, with any score over 1 reflecting a sector that is more important than the Shropshire average, and any score under 1 reflecting a sector that has less importance.

The following sectors are over-represented in Market Drayton compared with Shropshire: business administration & support, manufacturing, professional, scientific & technical, transport and wholesale. The location quotient for wholesale is particularly high (3.78).

Main Employers

The following organisations are identified by the business directory FAME as being the largest employers in Market Drayton. 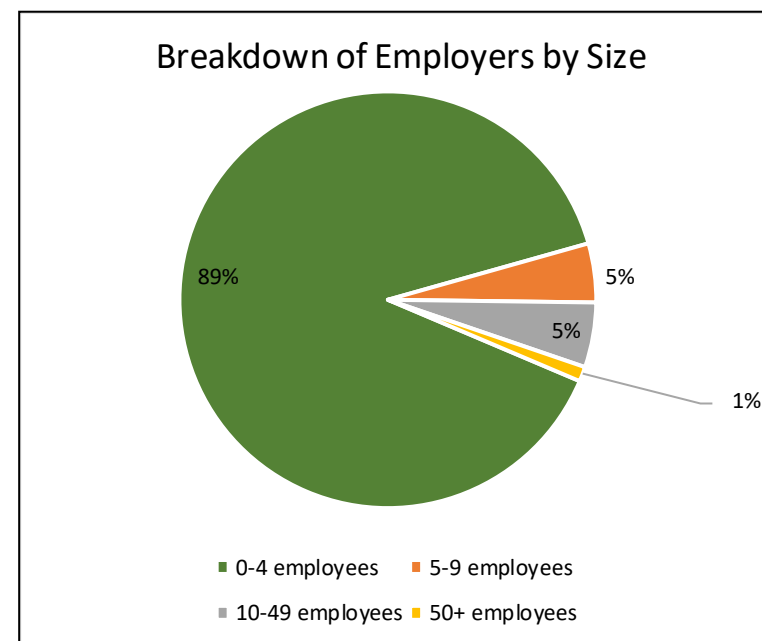
Large employers which are not included within the above table include national retail stores, of which there are several in Market Drayton. The largest retailers in the town include Asda, Lidl and Morrisons.

Almost nine out of 10 businesses in Market Drayton employ less than 5 people. An additional 5% employ between 5 and 9. 6% have a workforce of 10 or more.

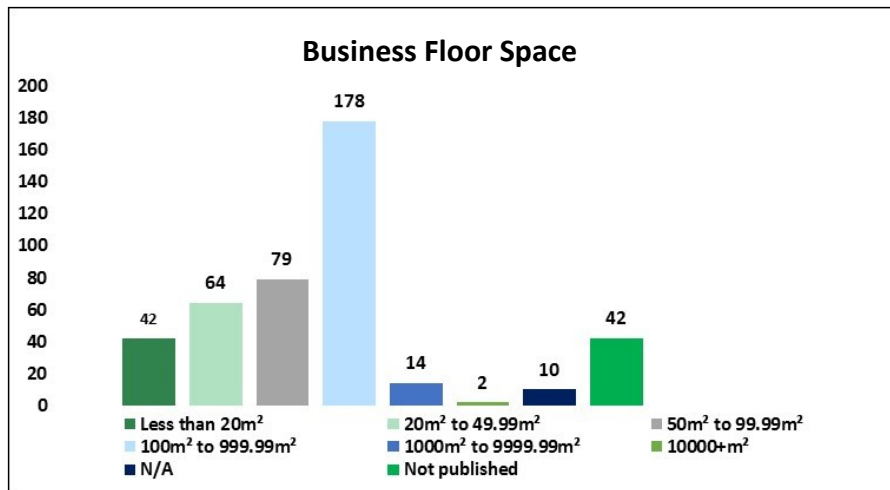
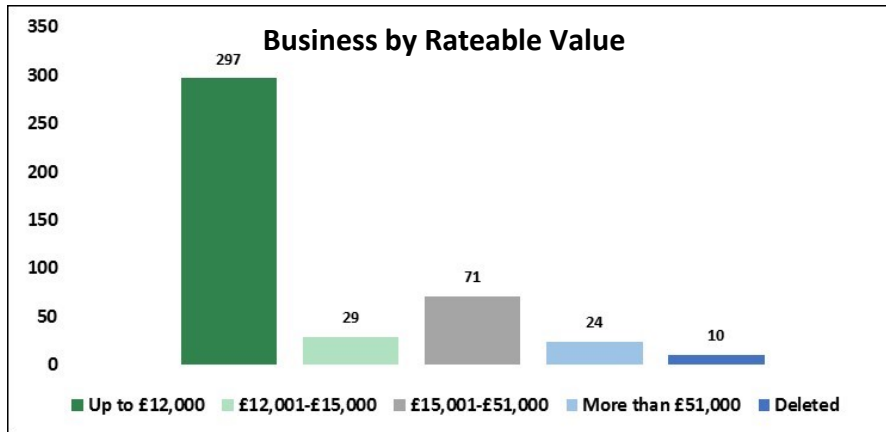

Business Rates

431 establishments have a rateable value in Market Drayton and the combined rateable value of these organisations is £8.8 million. This is the equivalent of 3.8% of the total rateable value of all businesses in Shropshire.

297 businesses have a rateable value of less than £12,000, which means that they are eligible for 100% small business rate relief. Just 24 (5.6%) have a rateable value of more than £51,000.



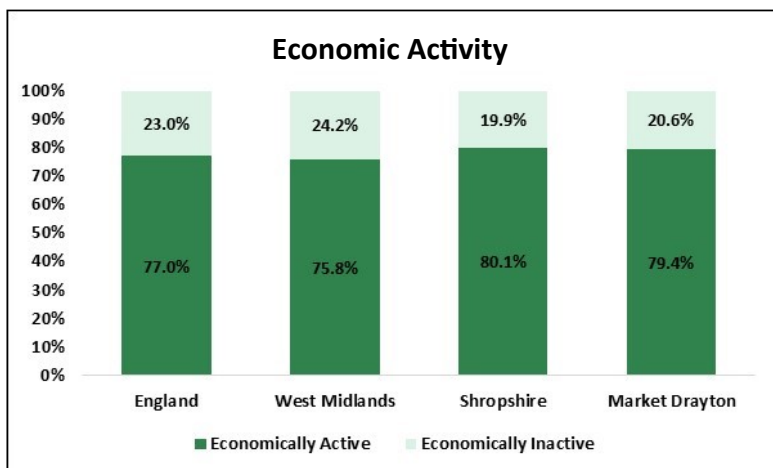

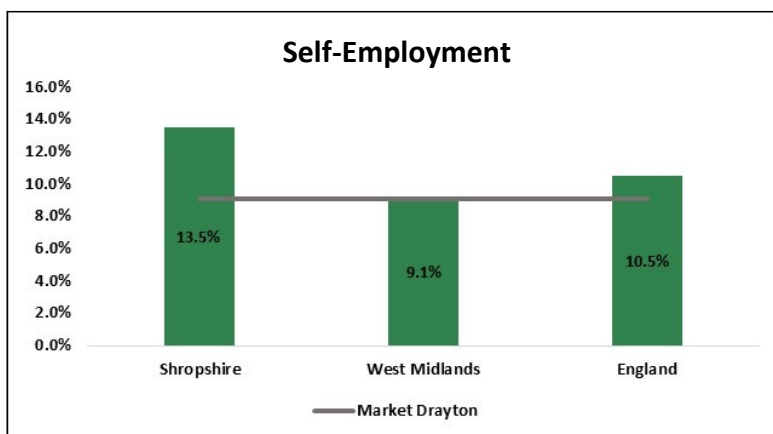
The majority of organisations on the Market Drayton business rates list are classed as commercial - primarily retail outlets and offices. These account for 76.6% of the total. Industrial is the second largest classification, accounting for 12.8% of the total.

Economic Activity

The status of Market Drayton residents aged 16-64 at the time of the 2011 Census showed 79.4% of residents were economically active, which includes people who are both employed and actively seeking employment. This is very slightly lower than the Shropshire figure of 80.1%. Economic activity rates in Market Drayton (and Shropshire) compare favourably with those in England (77%) and the West Midlands (75.8%).

Of those who were economically active, 73.9% were in employment while 5.5% were unemployed. This compares with 75.8% and 4.3% for Shropshire as a whole and with 71.2% and 5.8% for England. At the time of the Census, therefore, unemployment was a slightly greater issue in Market Drayton in relation to Shropshire but was broadly similar to the national average.

Of the 5,362 Market Drayton residents in employment, the majority are employees (87.7%) while the remainder are self-employed. 71.5% of employees work full-time compared with 72.9% of the self-employed.

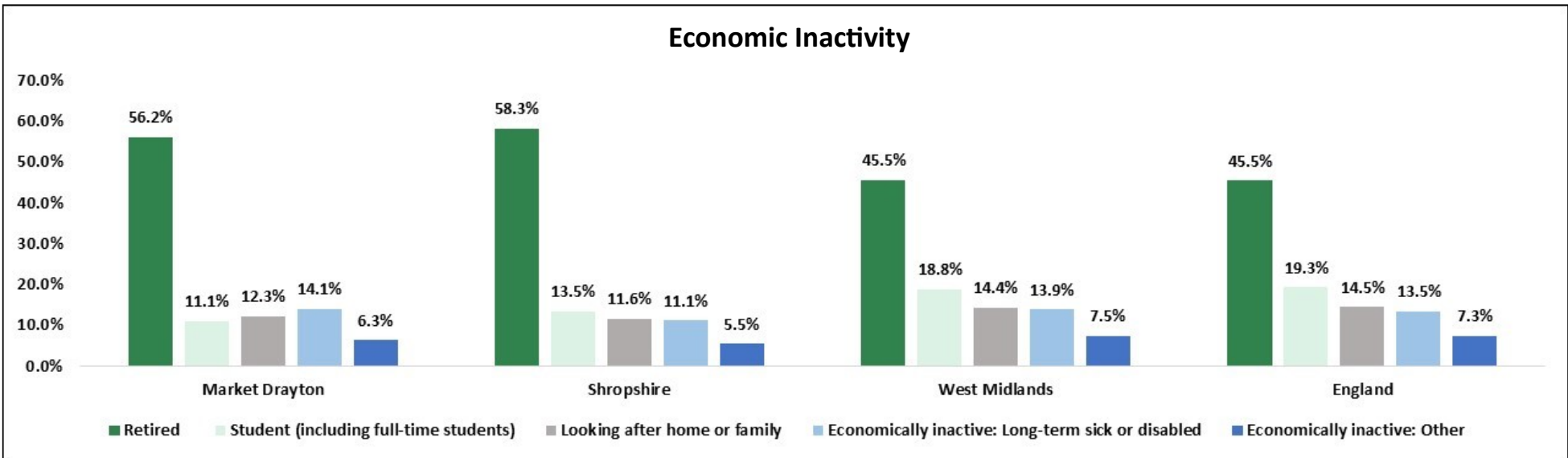
Self-employment is notably higher in Shropshire than it is nationally, accounting for 13.5% of 16-64 year old residents (10.5% in England). Typically, levels of self-employment are lower in the County's market towns, especially the main employment centres. This is the case in Market Drayton, where self-employment levels, at 9.1%, are on a par with the West Midlands average.

Economic Inactivity

1,495 Market Drayton residents aged 16-64 were economically inactive in 2011, which represents just over a fifth of the age cohort. These people – representing those who are neither working nor seeking employment – include those who are retired, full time students, those looking after family or the long term sick. The proportion of the Market Drayton population which does not participate in the labour market is marginally higher than the average for Shropshire.

The following chart shows the breakdown of the economically inactive population in Market Drayton, Shropshire, the West Midlands and England according to the reason why they do not participate in the labour market. These figures relate to the 16-74 population rather than to 16 to 64 year olds.

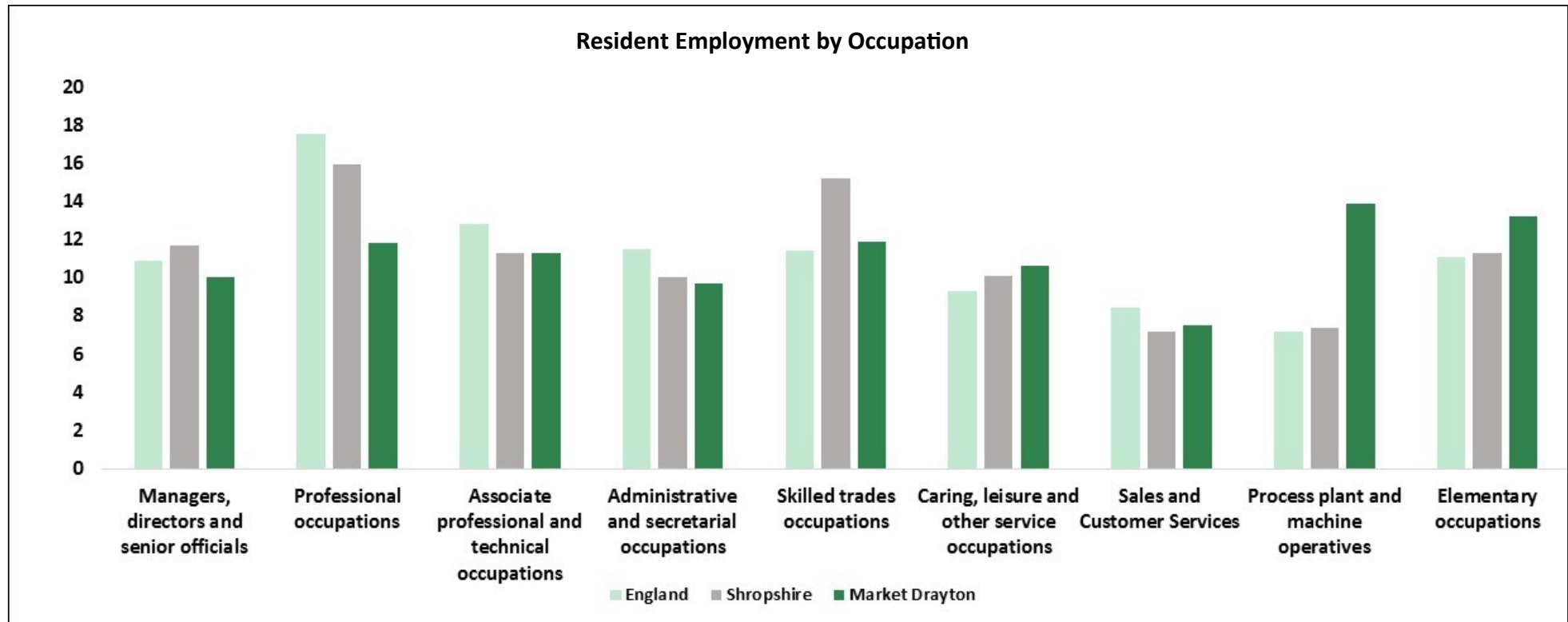
It is apparent that a lower proportion of economically inactive Market Drayton residents are inactive because they are retired than is the case across Shropshire although, at 56.2%, this proportion is higher than it is in the West Midlands and England. Compared with Shropshire, a higher proportion are long-term sick or disabled or looking after a home or family. A lower proportion are students.

Employment by Occupation

Market Drayton supports relatively low numbers working in the Standard Occupational Classification (SOC) groups 1 to 3 for the professions, with 33.1% of residents in work employed as managers, directors and senior officials, in professional occupations or in associate professional and technical occupations compared with 38.9% in Shropshire. 10.0% work as managers, 11.8% in professional occupations and 11.3% in associate professional occupations. A higher proportion are employed in lower level occupations, including elementary occupations (13.2% compared with 11.3% for Shropshire) and especially as process, plant and machine operatives (13.9% compared with 7.4% for Shropshire). Fewer Market Drayton residents work in skilled trades occupations.

Qualifications

According to the Census 2011, 22.7% of residents had a level 4 qualification or above, notably lower the Shropshire average of 29.4%. In contrast, greater numbers of people have no qualifications, at 18.9% compared with 14% in Shropshire.

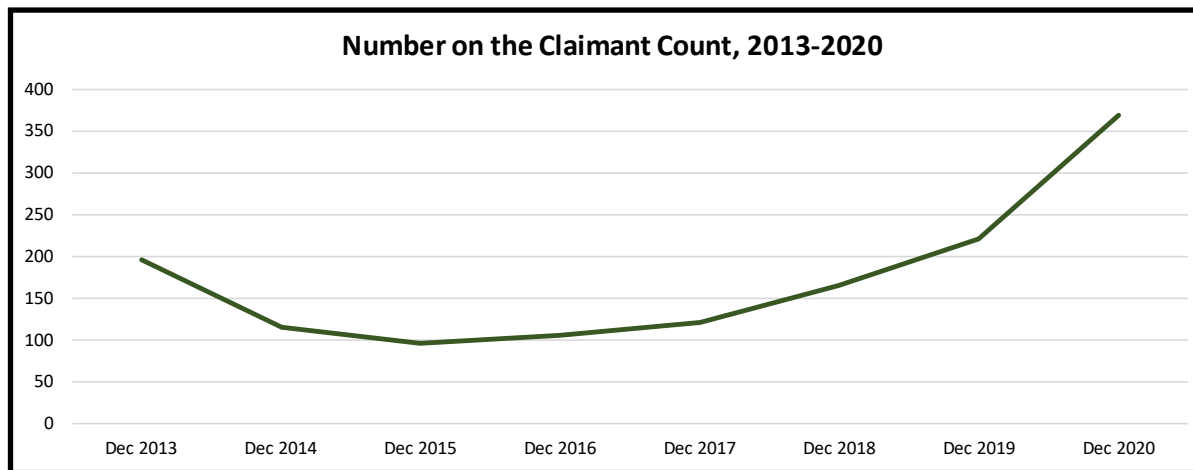

Unemployment

The claimant count is the main measure of people who are under pensionable age who are available for and actively seeking work and who are claiming out-of-work benefits (mostly Universal Credit but also Jobseekers Allowance). The chart below shows the number claiming this benefit in Market Drayton between December 2013 and December 2020.

Universal Credit

The following table shows the number of people claiming Universal Credit in Market Drayton in January 2021. It includes those who are out-of-work (and hence on the claimant count shown above), and also those who are on low incomes and entitled to in work benefits. The table also shows the number of households on universal credit in the town.

In December 2020, 370 Market Drayton residents were on the claimant count, which is almost four times higher than the 95 who were on the count in December 2015. The claimant rate in Market Drayton (the percentage of the 16-64 population which is claiming) is slightly higher than the average for Shropshire (5.1% compared with 4.4%). However, this rate is lower than in Great Britain (6.2%) and the West Midlands (7.2%). Claimant numbers everywhere were elevated throughout 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic.

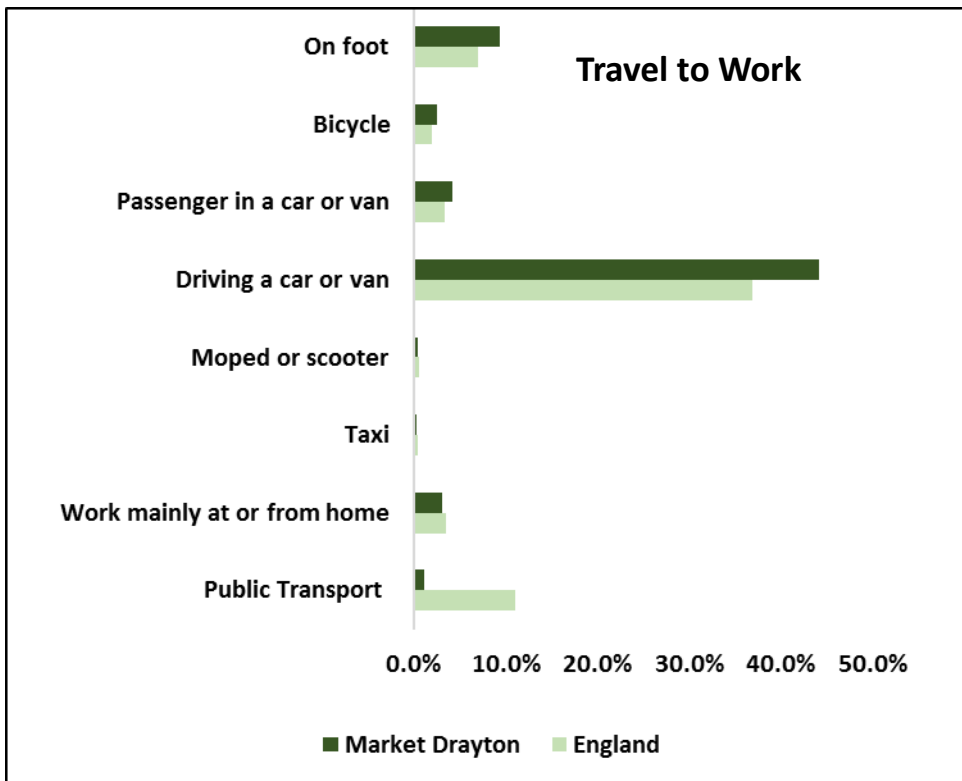
State Pensions

In Shropshire there were 75,688, people claiming state pension in August 2020. This is slightly lower than 76,250 in February 2017, which is attributed to changes in retirement age.

Claimants in Market Drayton total 2,726 or 3.6% of the state pension claimants in the county.

Travel and Commuting

The most commonly used method of transport to work for Market Drayton residents was to travel by car or van. 44% of residents drove to work, while an additional 4% were a passenger in a car or van. The same proportion of Market Drayton residents work primarily from home as the national average (3%), but this is much lower than the Shropshire average of 6%. A relatively high number walk to work (9% the same as Shropshire compared to 7% for England). There were considerably fewer people travelling by public transport than is the case nationally. This is a pattern familiar to many rural areas.

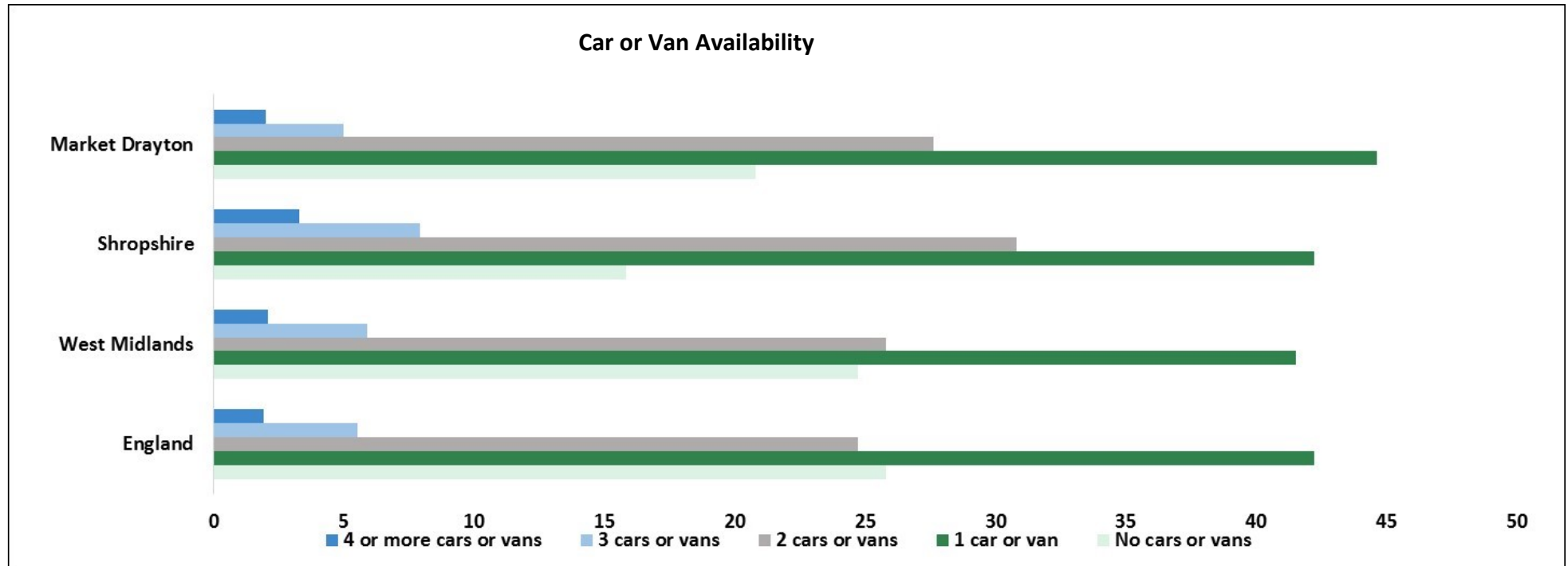

Car or Van Availability

Car ownership is high in Shropshire, which is typical of a rural area. Just 15.8% of households in the County do not have a car or van compared with 25.8% of households nationally according to the 2011 Census. The proportion of households without a car in Market Drayton is higher than it is in Shropshire, at 20.8%, but this is still way below what is usual nationally.

44.6% of households have one car, 27.6% have two cars while 7.0% have three or more. The total number of cars and vans owned by Market Drayton households stood at 6,369 in 2011.

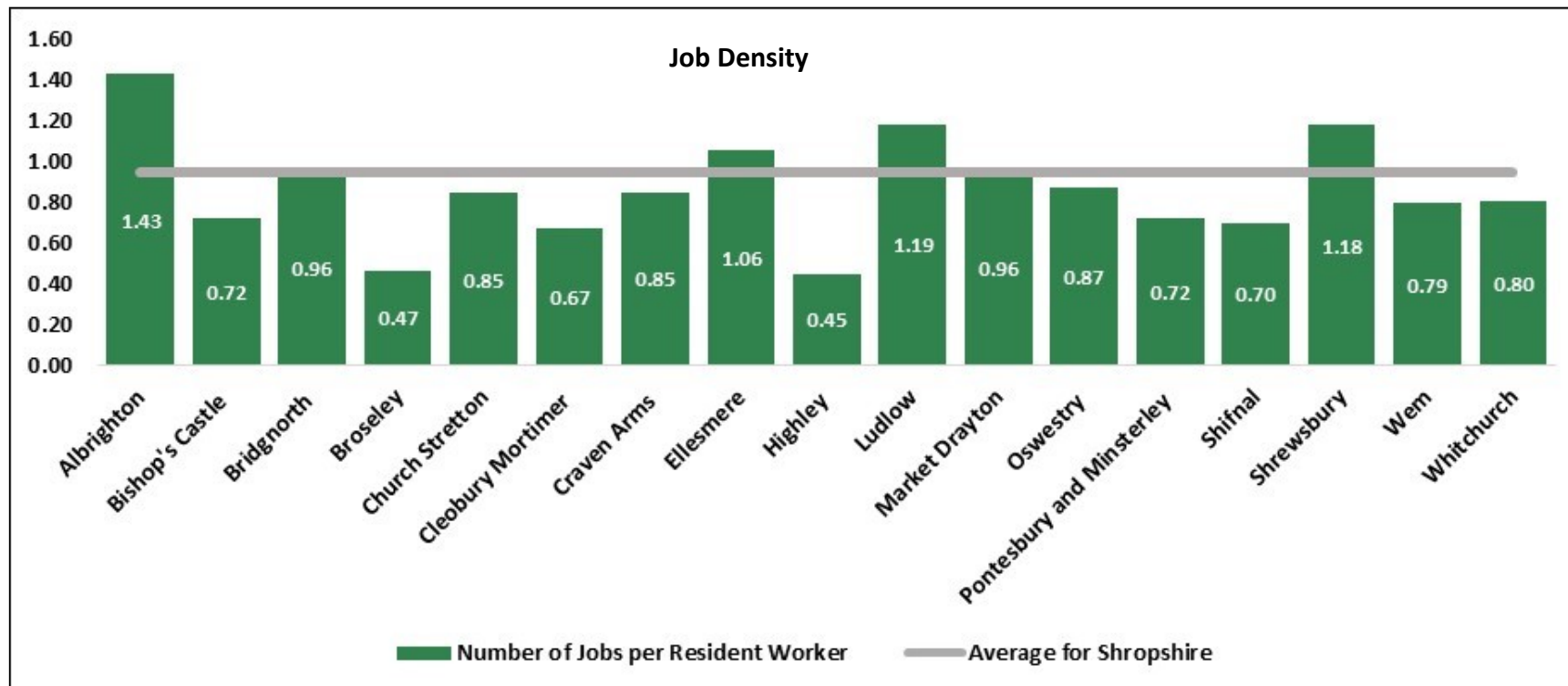

Commuting Patterns

Market Drayton (place plan area) supports a relatively high level of employment self-containment with only Shrewsbury, Oswestry and Ludlow showing superior self-containment rates. 47.5% of all Market Drayton jobs are filled by Market Drayton residents while 45.5% of working people who live in Market Drayton also work there, which gives an overall level of self-containment of 46.5%. The differential between the number of resident workers and the number of jobs is relatively small, with net commuting across the Market Drayton place plan border standing at -204. This equates with 3,874 people living in Market Drayton but working elsewhere and 3,580 people working in Market Drayton but living elsewhere.

Job density in Market Drayton is comparable with the County average, with 0.96 jobs per resident worker compared with 0.95 in Shropshire. As illustrated in the chart below, the only towns where the number of jobs exceeds the resident workforce are Albrighton, Ellesmere, Ludlow and Shrewsbury.



Origins and Destination of Workforce

Other than Market Drayton, the rest of Shropshire is the main source of workers for Market Drayton jobs, with significant numbers also commuting into the town from Telford and Wrekin, Cheshire East, Stoke on Trent, Newcastle under Lyme and Stafford. Likewise, a significant proportion of Market Drayton resident workers who are not employed in Market Drayton work elsewhere in Shropshire, with significant numbers also working in Telford and Wrekin, Cheshire East, Stoke on Trent, Newcastle under Lyme, Stafford and Birmingham.

Retail Economy

Retail accounts for 10.3% of total employment in Market Drayton, which makes it one of the largest employment sectors in the town. 4.2% of all retail employment across the whole of Shropshire is absorbed by Market Drayton.

Retail plays an important role in the economy of Market Drayton. Providing everyday amenities and shopping for local residents and serving as a shopping hub for the hinterland of the market town. The retail sector also assists in attracting visitors to the town by offering a mix of independent and national stores.

High Street Shopping, Market Drayton offers a range of high street shopping which are mainly based around the area of Cheshire Street, Frogmore Road, Shropshire Street and Stafford Street. There are a range of facilities including Banks, Building Societies, Post Office and Job Centre. Shops include a mixture of national chains along with independent local traders. There is a wide range of public houses, coffee shops, cafes and restaurants in the town centre.

Supermarkets, the centre of Market Drayton is well served with supermarkets that include; Asda, Iceland, Lidl, Londis and Morrisons. In addition local convenience stores include; Kwik Save, One Stop and Sainsbury's local.

Outdoor Market, the main market dates back some 750 years and is held every Wednesday in Cheshire Street from 9am to 3pm. There is also a smaller market held on a Saturday.

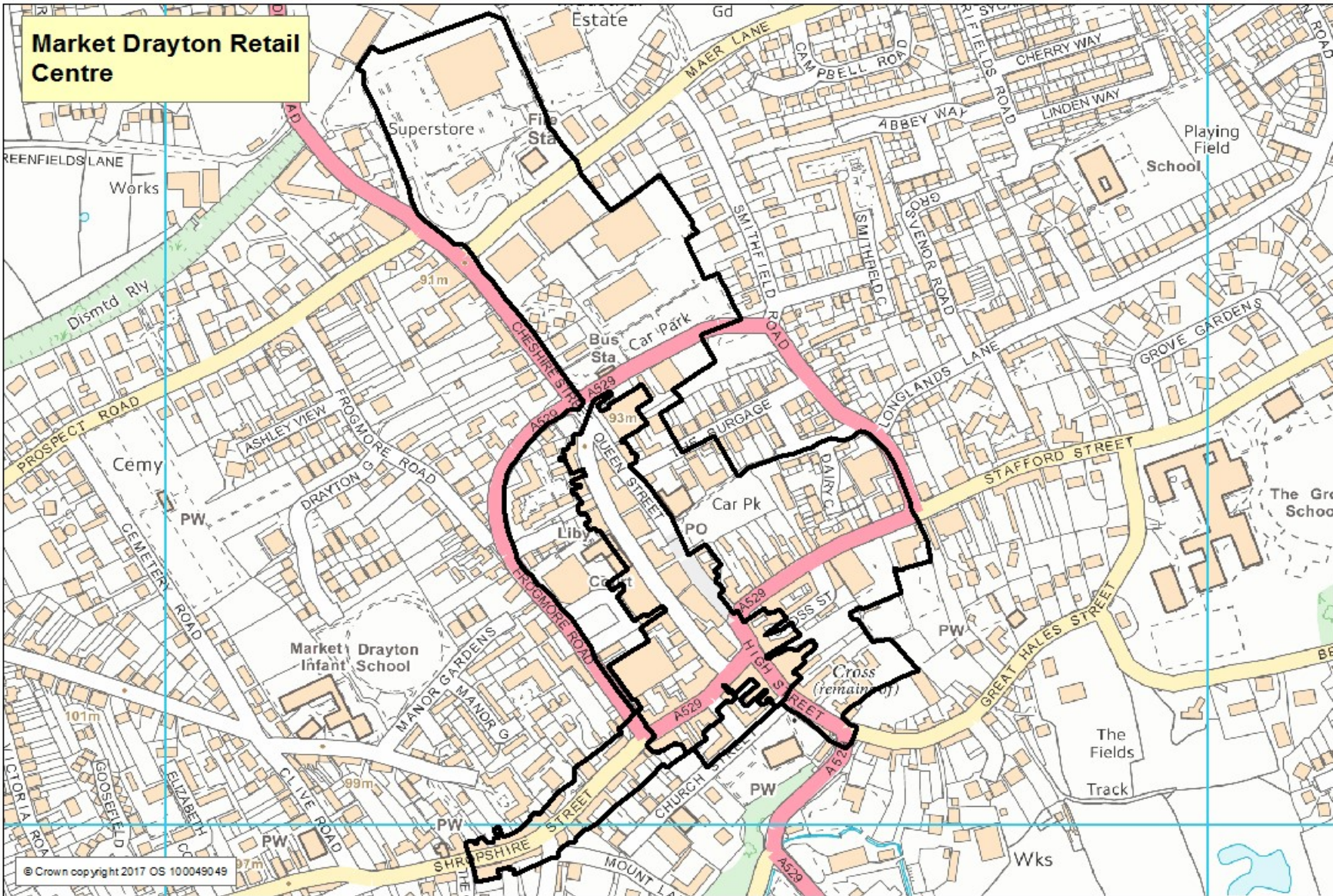

Household income table for Shropshire shows that 21% or 1160 households in Market Drayton earn less than £15,000 per year. At the other end of the scale 7% of households had an income exceeding £80,000 per annum. Household income rates in Market Drayton are lower than the Shropshire average.

Approximately 400 people are employed in the tourism sector in Market Drayton, of which around 300 are employed in accommodation and food services and 100 in arts, entertainment, recreation and other services. This is the equivalent of 8.6% of the total Market Drayton workforce which represents a lower share than for Shropshire as a whole (14.7%). 2.2% of total employment in the tourism sector in Shropshire is provided by Market Drayton.

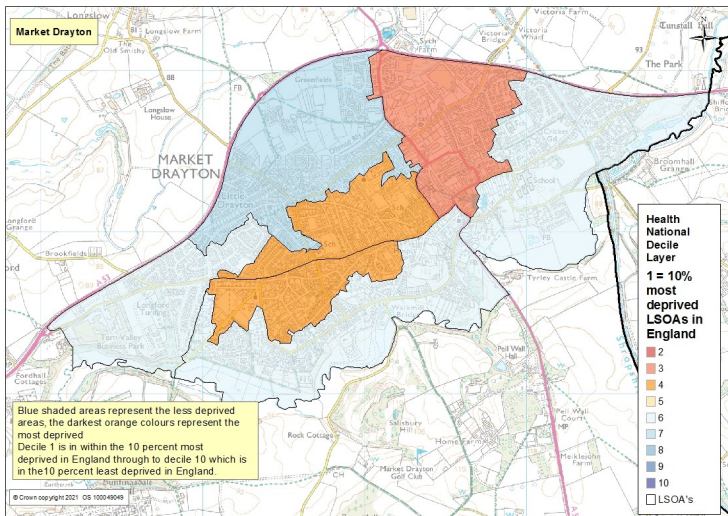

Health

Residents of Shropshire generally enjoy better health than across England as a whole with a healthy life expectancy being higher than average. Life expectancy in Shropshire is also higher than the national average. Life expectancy for births in Shropshire between 2016- 18 are 80.5 for males and 83.5 for females. This compares to an average of 79.3 and 82.9 for England. Despite this there are areas in Shropshire where health inequalities may exist. The index of deprivation, shown on the following map, highlights the areas where there are higher degrees of deprivation. The life expectancy variation between the least and most deprived health areas in Shropshire is equivalent to 4.2 years for men and 3.3 for women.

Market Drayton has one area of health deprivation within the most deprived 30% nationally. This area is located in Market Drayton division and covers the Fairfields estate area. There is also two areas within Market Drayton West which covers the town centre which fall into the 40% most deprived nationally.

Of the **11773** residents of Market Drayton in the last census reporting on their health conditions:

1103 reported that their day-to-day activities were limited a lot

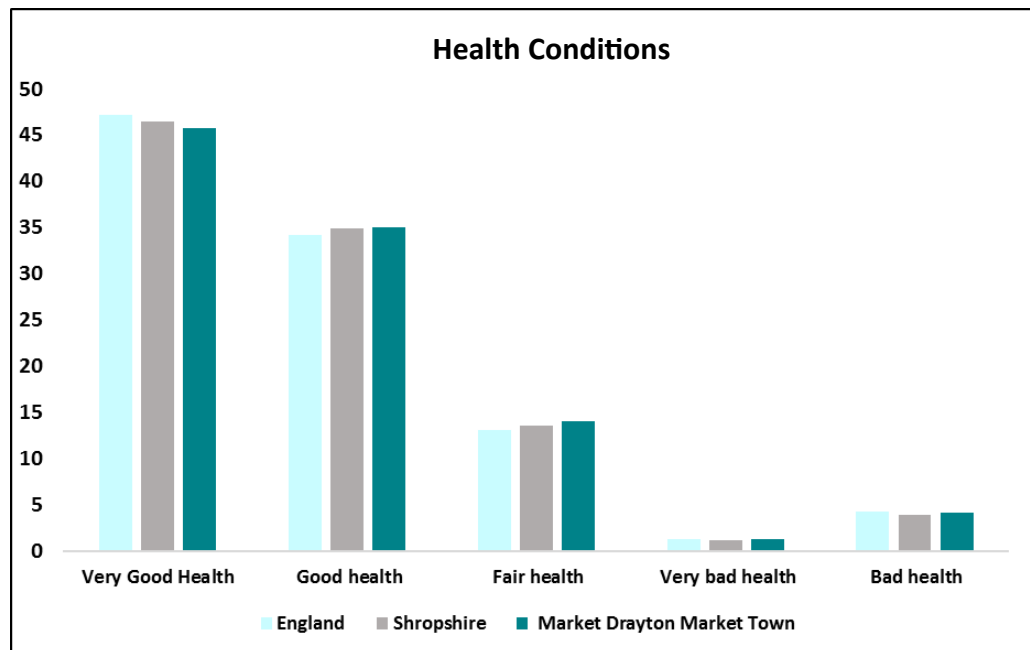
1201 reported that their day-to-day activities were limited a little

9,542 reported that their day-to-day activities were not limited

The rate of people expressing that their day-to-day activities were limited a lot was **8.6%** which is higher than the rate for Shropshire **8.4%** and England **8.3%**.

Health Conditions

At the time of the 2011 Census, 81% of residents in Market Drayton, said that they felt they were in very good or good health. This was similar to the Shropshire and England average of 81%. In contrast 4.1% of people said their health was bad and 1.2% said their health was very bad.

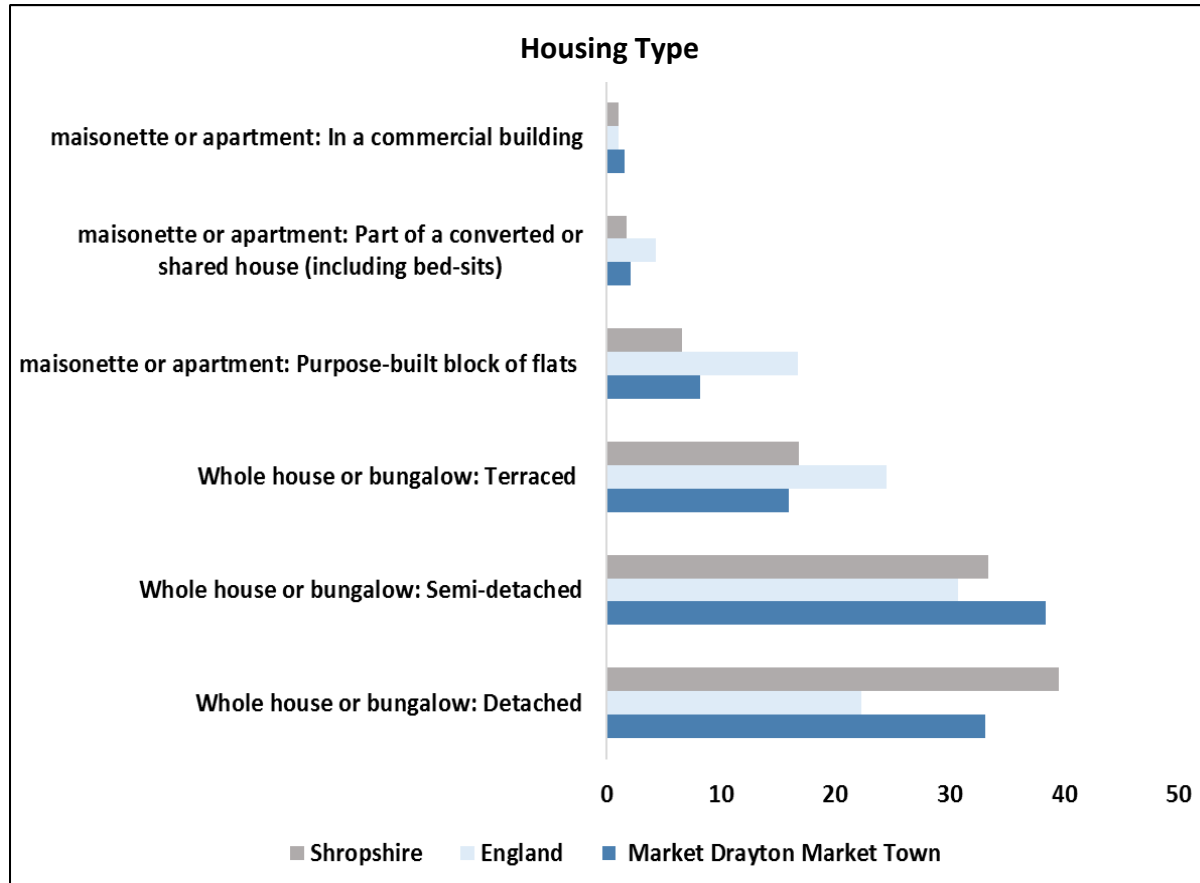

Housing

The town has a higher rate of semi-detached houses and flats than in Shropshire. This may explain the lower than average house prices which are lower than some parts of Shropshire.



Fewer Market Drayton household spaces were detached properties (33.1%) compared to Shropshire as a whole (39.5%).

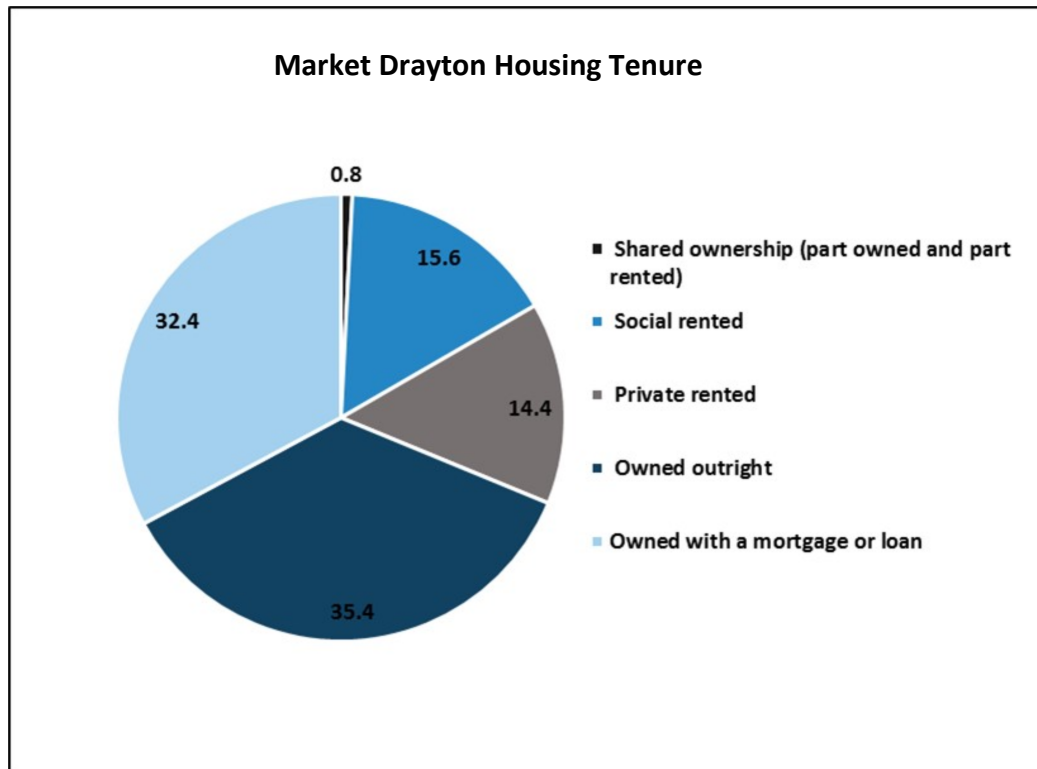
A larger percentage of household spaces were semi detached (38.4%) compared to Shropshire as a whole (33.4%). This is the largest housing type in Market Drayton as is the case nationally. In Shropshire the largest housing type was detached.

There were a greater proportion of household spaces which were flat, maisonette, or apartment: purpose built block of flats, (8.2%) compared to Shropshire (6.6%).

Housing Composition

- 30.6% of households were One Person Households greater than the Shropshire average (28.9%) and England (30.2%).
- 6.3% of households were Lone Parent with dependent children higher than the Shropshire average (5.2%) and lower than England (7.1%).
- 14.1% of households were One Person Pensioner aged 65 and over, similar to the Shropshire average of (13.9%) and England (12.4%).

In Market Drayton, at the time of the 2011 Census, there were 5,144 households, 5,323 dwellings and 7 communal establishments housing 81 people. The largest proportion (35.4%) of houses in Market Drayton were owned outright, less than the Shropshire figure of 39%. 15.6% of households were social rented housing, this was greater than for Shropshire as a whole (13.5%) but fewer than for England (17.7%).

There were slightly fewer houses privately rented 14.4% compared to 15% for Shropshire and 14% for England. In Oswestry there are 718 registered social landlord (RSL) homes. These homes are owned by a range of RSL's.

The table shows affordability ratios for housing in Shropshire. The income data relates to Shropshire Place Plan areas which are a slightly broader geography than market towns, and take account of hinterlands. The table shows that in Market Drayton a household with a median household income of (£29,144) would need 6.2 times this income to afford a median priced house (£180,000) as of year end 2020. This is lower than a ratio of 6.7 for Shropshire.

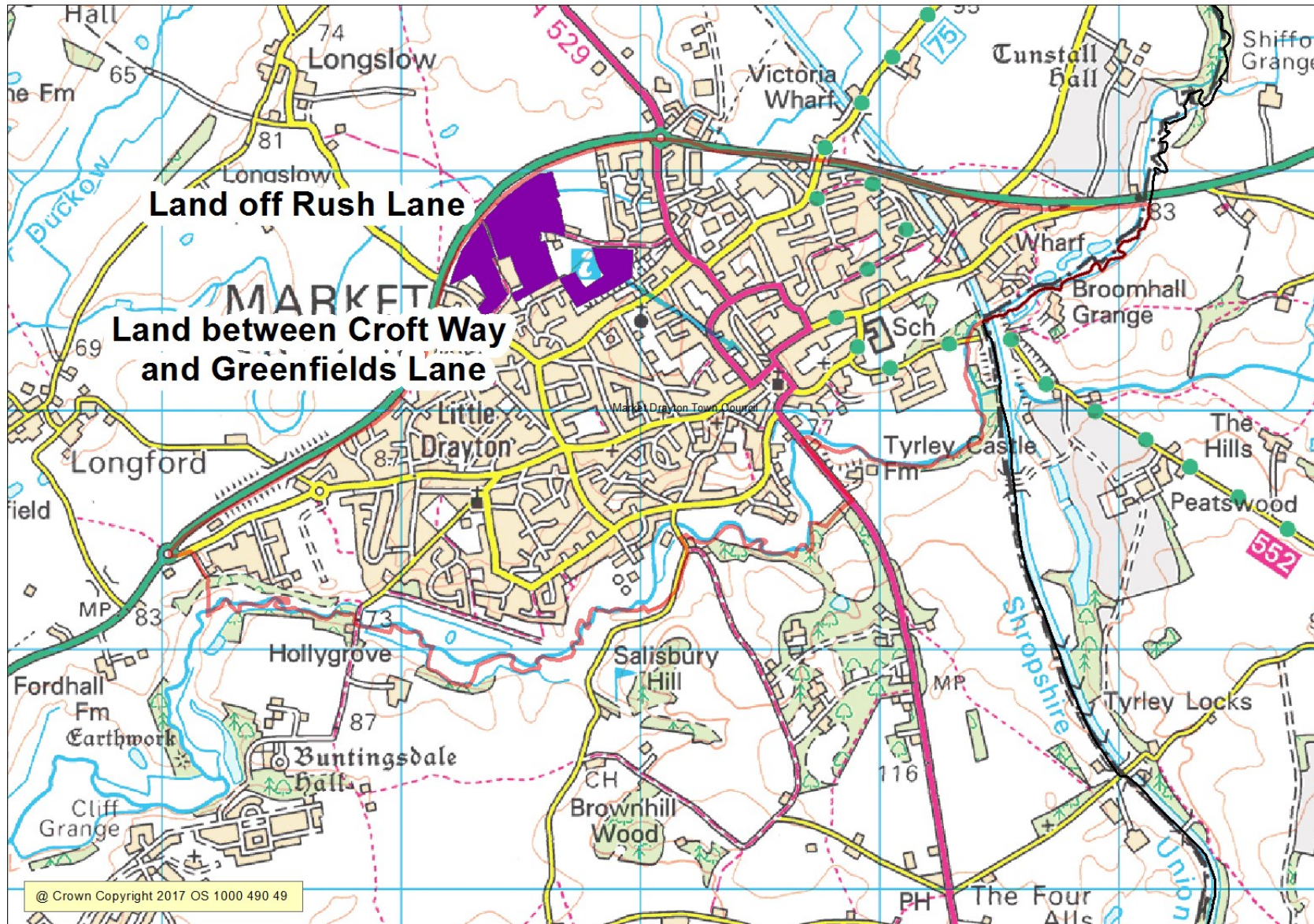

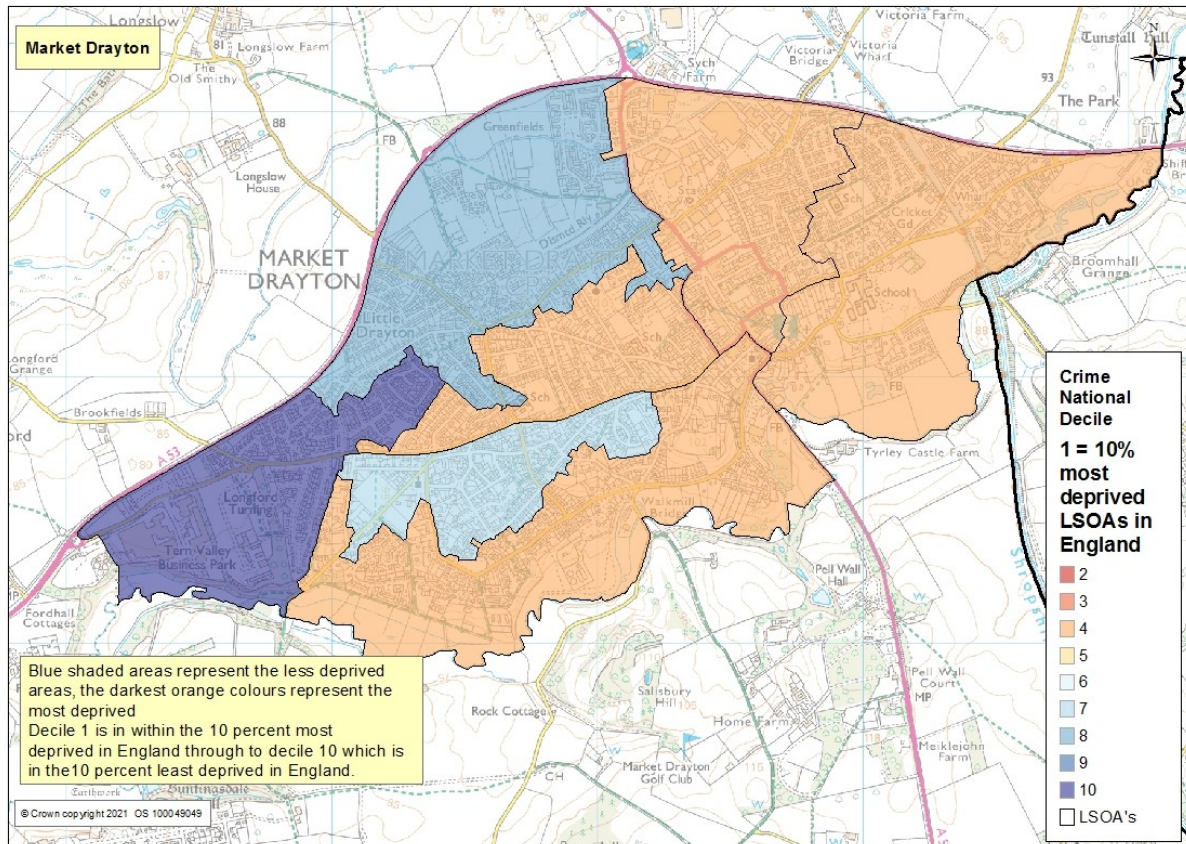
Market Drayton is close to the canal network with the Shropshire Union canal located to the east of the town centre.

Broadband

Digital connectivity is viewed as an increasingly important factor for business success, and nowadays broadband speed is a vital consideration when businesses are looking to relocate.

Superfast broadband is being rolled out across Shropshire, and nearly all premises in Market Drayton have access, or will have access within the next two years, to infrastructure that allows download speeds of at least 30 Mbps. 38 premises (0.7% of the total) are expected to have speeds that fall below this threshold. All premises in Market Drayton (and throughout most of Shropshire) are supplied by just one infrastructure provider.

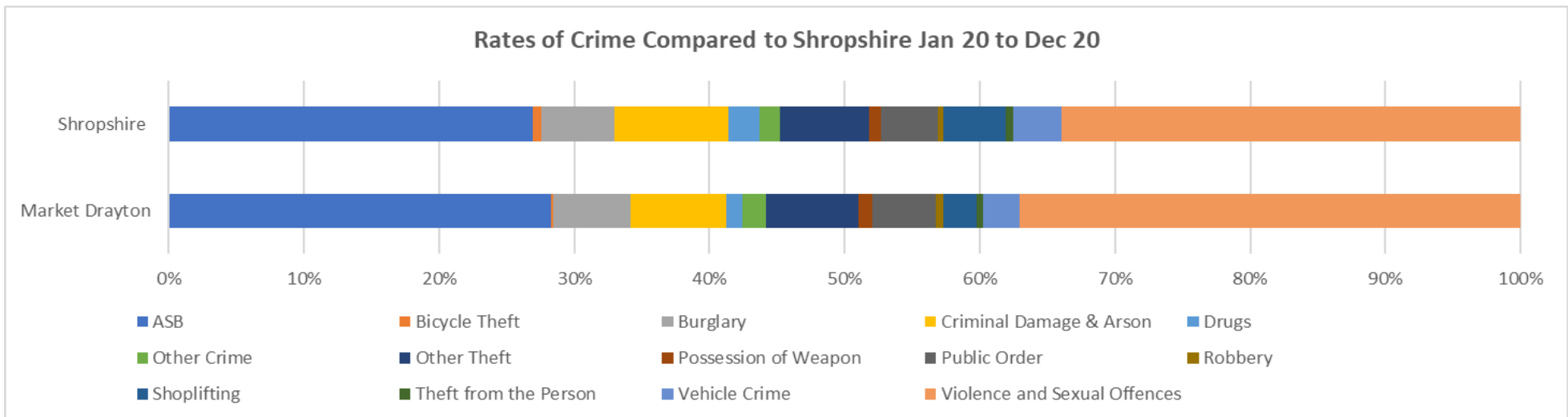
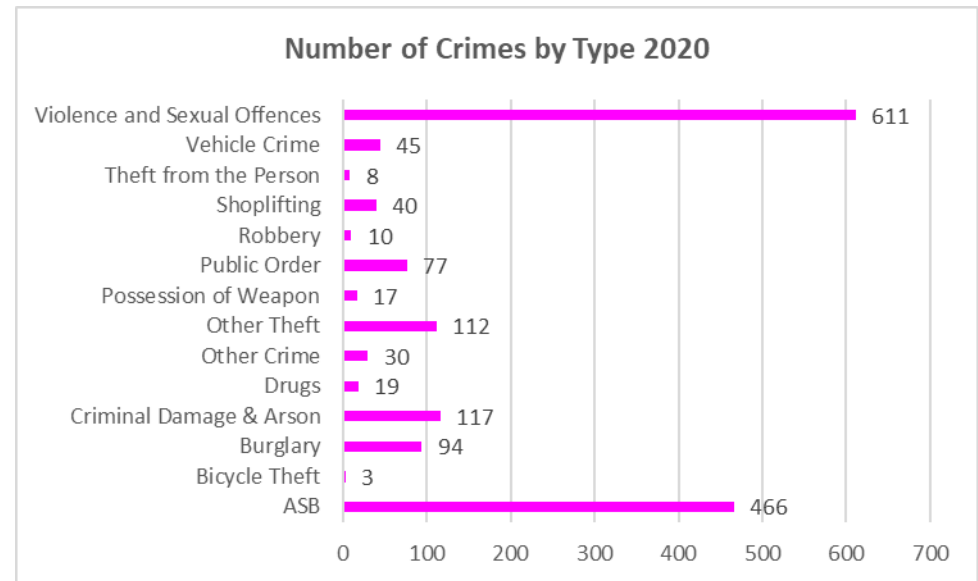
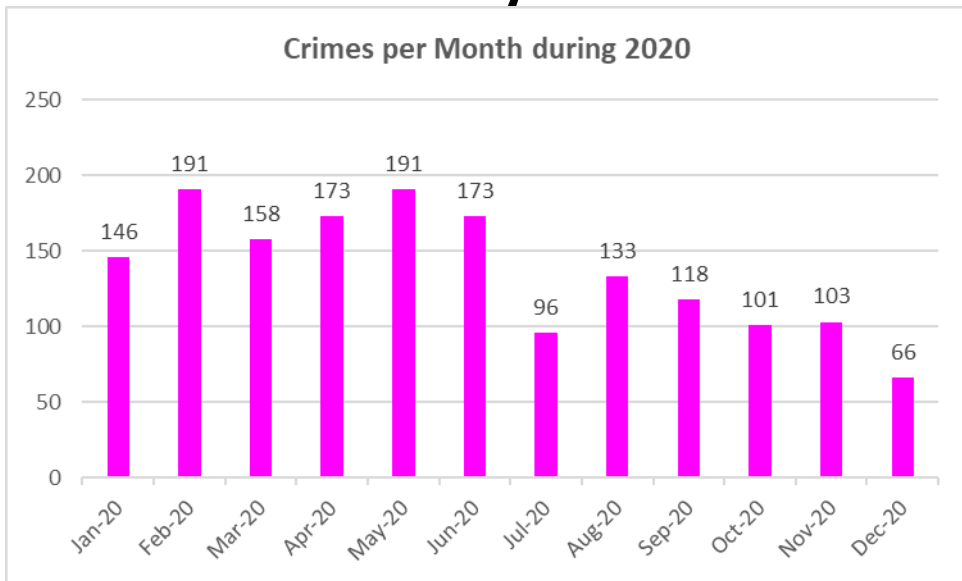
