#### Guidance notes for the driver knowledge test

An online driver awareness course lasting approximately 1 hour will be held before the knowledge test commences.

The session will cover a wide variety of topics including an overview of the Shropshire Council Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy 2019-2023, Equality and disability awareness, the differences between private hire vehicles and hackney carriages, plying for hire, and vehicle requirements.

The knowledge test is online and applicants have 30 minutes to complete the test. There will be a 10 minute break between the driver awareness course and the start of the knowledge test.

It is strongly recommended that applicants read the Shropshire Council Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Policy 2019-2023 which is available at https://www.shropshire.gov.uk/media/12328/hcph-licensing-policy-2019-2023.pdf

There are a total of 28 questions in the test and you need to get 21 questions right (75%) to pass the test.
