Verbal update from Joe Bubb:

The Engagement Working Group met to discuss improvements to comms, both as individual organisations and collectively. The group also discussed public meetings and the need to consider regularity, purpose, format and attendance. For each project on the Projects List (shared with members), a delivery plan will identify the appropriate engagement level and stakeholder maps for each stage of each project.

Suggestion that those who commented on the Future Oswestry Plan could be contacted again for future consultations and that FOG council take expressions of interest for people who would like to be consulted in the future.

5. Update from Property and Development Team

Verbal update from Steve Law:

Cambrian Railway Building

Works are scheduled to be completed Spring 2023. SC has now taken over ownership of the building and Cambrian Heritage Railways will continue to utilise the building and report any structural issues as they emerge. The building is currently being surveyed to identify possible future uses (such as business incubator space) which will then undergo a viability analysis. SC will seek additional funding to address any viability gap due to concerns around condition. A Conservation Management Plan will apply to the building.

Castle View Building

SC are working to consolidate Council use of Castle View and are producing a brochure targeted at potential public sector partners (including OTC) as well as a prospectus for commercial users. Some spaces are being fitted out. FOG members asked to

Capital Grant Programme

 Property on Beatrice Street – work will be taking place in the spring as conservation officer has requested lime for the render

- Property on Church Street Terrazzo due for delivery any day now. Work is due to begin mid Feb and should be competed in March
- Red Lion works are ongoing and windows are on order
- Property on Cross Street. Have discussed moving the schedule of works to progress the shop front installation
- Shop front budget spent up with a small repurposing amount remaining. We are looking at other possible schemes that we can assist with to spend up that money.

Public Realm

- Clawdd Du Waiting on date for installation of bollards from highways. Works due to commence in April 2023. All businesses informed that they will need to remove their bins.
- Metal elements are slowly starting to get installed

Other

- Shopfront design guide meeting with the Civic Society went well and we are waiting to hear if they want to be involved.
- Cultural Consortium are putting the finishing touches to Love Oswestry.
- We are looking at how we can spend the flagship match which is a large part of our programme match.
- Bid in to UKSPF to carry out interim evaluation of the HSHAZ and its grant mechanisms and how we can roll out a shop front scheme across North Shropshire.
- Working on a film and a series of walk leaflets on the history of the town with the research group.
- Finishing EOI to The National Lottery Heritage Fund to look at repurposing BWise building.
- A public information board will be going up on the Harris fencing outside the Llwyd mansion in the next fortnight.

Discussion of FOG's potential involvement with a North Shropshire-wide shopfront scheme. Potential to deliver this post-2024 with the FOG partners working together to deliver technical expertise, project management and a small amount of funding.

7. Delivery Plan/ Projects List

Verbal update from Job Bubb:

The updated Projects List template has been sent to members and we now need to establish what the FOG priority is for each of these. Officer have started work on filling in the details in the project list. Once projects are scoped and agreed it will be possible to start putting together funding bids.

Suggestion that the 'Status' column have a percentage completion and there be milestones for each project. Agreed that FOG needs to keep returning to the project matrix to review priorities. Suggestion that it is important to schedule public consultation and feasibility work as early as possible so that this work is completed before funding becomes available.

Church Street	BID has written to Helen Morgan MP asking for support on the parking in loading bays issue on Church Street.
	Ffion Horton and Alex Edwards at SC are working with Adele Nightingale at the BID and their consultants to work up the final designs for Church St and the parklets. The topographical survey is due shortly and designs will follow. Severn Trent are planning to undertake works, so the resurfacing works and the implementation of the designs will need to follow possibly May/ June.
Cross Street	Adele Nightingale would like to look at getting together options and designs for Cross Street as the follow up step to Church Street. This would need to consider the LCWIP proposals being for cycling along Cross Street – Rose Dovey has put in a bid for feasibility work to progress the key LCWIP schemes within Oswestry.
Festival Square	The Bid has put in a bid for feasibility work to prepare options and designs for the use of the square.
20 mph	This is currently a high priority. To be discussed with WSP as part of Connectivity Plan (Item 7).
Signage declutter	Following conversations with SC Traffic Engineering, the BID is considering commissioning a consultant to survey the signs (broken, redundant, overgrown etc.) and their locations/conditions/height etc. This would then then inform which items would be picked up through existing contracts and what work could be undertaken by OTC or commissioned by the BID.
Sports Direct Alley	No one is claiming ownership of the alley so some research is needed to conclude ownership to look at options e.g. agreed licence to undertake works, or dedication to pass on responsibility.
Market Hall	OTC has bid for feasibility funding to look at options for the indoor market.
Improve bus facilities / service / routes	Call with Zoe Mortimer (SC Car Park Supervisor) RE the bus station to discuss opportunities to provide additionality.
Better walking and cycling links	Update from Rose Dovey: The draft LCWIP and appendices was due to go to the 15 Feb Cabinet meeting with the recommendation that is approved for public consultation, however the report has been deferred to the 8 March meeting. Subject to the approval of this report, a 6-week public consultation exercise will commence mid-late March. The six priority schemes for Oswestry – Phase 1 of the Oswestry Cycle Network – have been put forward for UKSPF funding for feasibility and optioneering work. If this hid is not successful, funding is
