Important news for the future of the group

It has been nearly a year since our community group came into being – with a simple mission - to support Ukrainian families fleeing the war in Ukraine, to enable them to be safe, settle, learn English and to feel part of the community.

Since that time we have got to know families, wonderful generous hosts, developed excellent working relationships with Shropshire Council teams, linked to other local support groups, been blessed with caring volunteers, and gathered links within the statutory and voluntary sector.

We have recently been given an opportunity to receive funding to develop the support that we offer to refugees/migrants and host families in South West Shropshire and North Herefordshire. This funding will enable the development of a wider range of targeted support, and provide greater coverage for the South West and North Herefordshire area.

We would like to offer some paid employment (on a self employed basis) to a refugee and a local person living in the South Shropshire or North Herefordshire area, to work very closely with families and host families in the area to move this help to the next level.

News for April, and a Fun event for May!!

1) Independent Living – Help is available.

The lack of social housing and private rented accommodation in the area is causing great worry and stress to both hosts and Ukrainian families. This is a problem affecting all people, not just refugees, as there is a local and national shortage of suitable, affordable properties.

If you are aware that a friend, colleague or neighbour may have a property to rent, even if rental may be for a relatively short period of six months, please do make contact. This could make all the difference to a family locally. We are also looking for additional host families, as, although the need has reduced, there are still Refugees looking for a safe haven.

Therefore to aid the transition from host family to independent housing we will offer:

• Support with completing Homepoint (the social housing register.) We will work with Ukrainian families and host families along with our colleagues in Shropshire Council, to provide as much support as if possible to make that difficult jump to living independently

- We can help with linking families to letting agents, help with providing references for landlords, and acting as an advocate, for local contact for refugees and host families.
- Providing donated household items to start families off in their new homes, we have found a temporary solution for storing donated items, at a local village hall. We also have two volunteers based in Ludlow who will manage the collection, storage, cataloguing and redistribution of items to families once they are needed.

If you think you may have items to donate, please can you ensure that all items are:

- In very good condition, in full working order and require no repair or maintenance.
- Items that are of practical value only, including beds, mattresses, bedding, dinner service, pots pans, towels, kitchen equipment, white goods, fridges/freezers, cookers, washing machines etc. If we receive donated electrical goods we will test all portable electrical appliances using a PAT test. 4) Grow your own food

There are lots of opportunities to start growing your own food by sharing a plot with friends. There are a number of organisations that have expressed an interest in helping refugees start growing. We will be able to provide simple hand tools to get you started, and maybe pots and seeds at the start of the growing season.

These are the some of the locations where a small plot may be available:

Ludlow Quakers Meeting House, St Marys Lane, Ludlow, SY8 1DZ

There is a lovely garden at the rear of the hub and the lower part could be used for growing veg, it could be shared by local refugees .

 Wigley Field Allotments – Organic Allotments (10 mins walk from Castle Square, by the Cliffe Hotel)

These are beautiful organic allotments that are placed in an idyllic place in Ludlow. There is a waiting list but if anyone is interested in sharing a half plot they can put their names down. As part of the conditions, plot holders need to be living within the town boundaries .

• Richards Castle (approx. 4miles from Ludlow)

For those living in North Herefordshire or outside of the Ludlow area, there are allotments in Richards Castle, that may be available.

 Rockspring Community Gardens (Sandford Road, Ludlow, SY8 1SX) Walking distance from central Ludlow.

A possible plot may be available for sharing .
