On the 17^{th of} December, 45 Ukrainians plus volunteers and hosts attended the pantomime, Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs at Ludlow Assembly Rooms. It was the first pantomime that many of our guests had attended, and they absolutely loved it. There was a mixture of emotions, surprise, fear (the wicked Queen was rather scary for some of the younger children) bemusement around The Dame, and great hilarity throughout the show. Thank you to the Ludlow Assembly rooms who were such a help in organising tickets and the system for using tokens for refreshments. Also, thanks to Peter Higgins and Oksana for help before the event, and on the day.

Christmas Party (photos attached)

On December 22^{nd,} our annual Christmas party took place at Bitterley village hall, over fifty people attended, with a Ukrainian Father Christmas, who was transorted to the village hall by vintage tractor decked in Xmas lights, and accompanied by another five tractors decked out with sparkly lights. BBC Midlands Today filmed part of the party, and it was televised live that evening, I was interviewed and also Olena K who talked about the celebrations and the importance of feeling part of your community and having local support. Presents were given out by Father Christmas, for all children and teens. The food was brilliant, everyone brought food to share, and a volunteer made lots of trifle and Xmas pudding. The Ukrainians sang traditional Xmas songs and played party games. It was a great evening. A group of people contributed £180.00 towards the cost of the Christmas presents. Also, a big thank you to Colin Richards who organised the tractor run, and thanks to all from Brimfield Tractor group who really helped to provide a sparkling event.

2. Before we move onto our new activities for 2024 – Please Can You Help?

Storage space for Kitchen equipment, furniture etc

As you may be aware we have been receiving donated furniture and kitchen appliances, to pass onto refugees when they move into independent housing. We have stored these goods in a local village hall. The trustees of the hall had very kindly agreed for us to use the hall, as a storage point for nearly a year. However, there is a plan to renovate the hall, and therefore we need to find alternative premises, if we are to continue to receive these donated items. Ideally the space needs to be fairly close to Ludlow, as all of our volunteers who support this work live in the area. 3. New Year - New Activities

Ludlow Castle Tennis Club open session Saturday 27th January 12.00

All members of the refugee community in South Shropshire and North Herefordshire are welcome to visit Ludlow Tennis club to have a look around the courts and speak with Linda McMahon who is a Tennis coach. Through the Ludlow Refugee Support Group, Linda is going to provide free Tennis lessons to children and young people starting on Saturday 3rd February at 9.45.

We are aware that Chess is hugely important and popular in Ukrainian culture, with top players hailed as celebrities, and ranks eighth in the world. We also know that many local families play, and therefore thought, that it might be useful to identify any local clubs that people could join if they wished.
