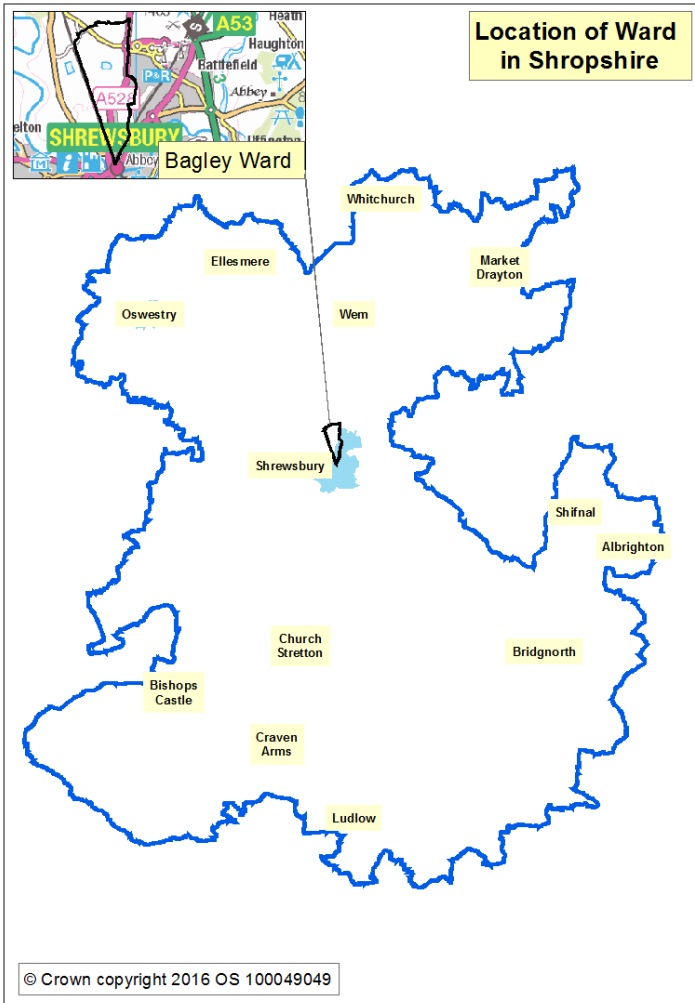

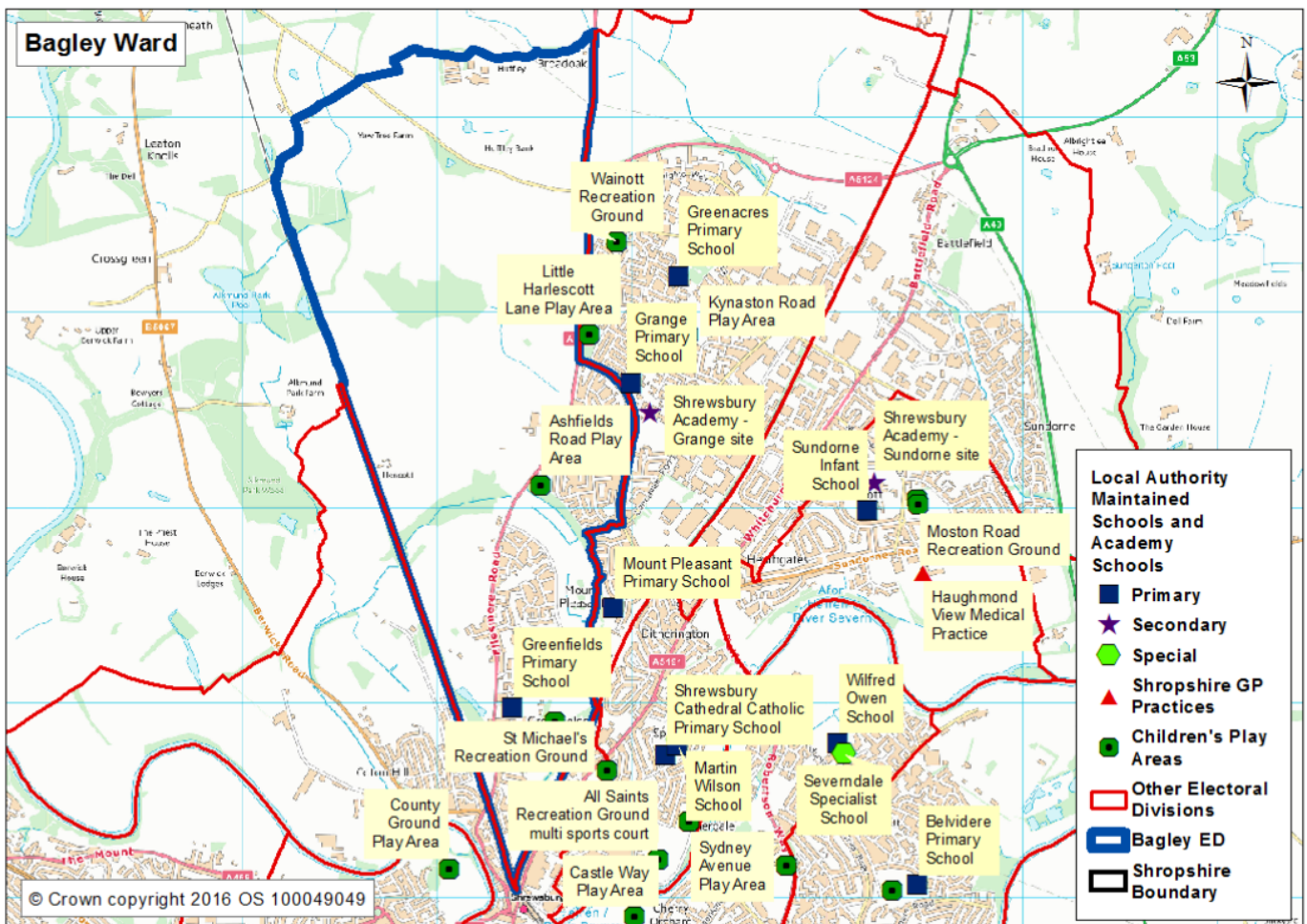

Bagley Ward is located in the north of Shrewsbury town. The ward is predominantly urban to its east and rural to its west. The ward has a younger age profile and is more densely populated than Shropshire as a whole. To the right of the ward there is good access to the A49 and the M54 towards the West Midlands. 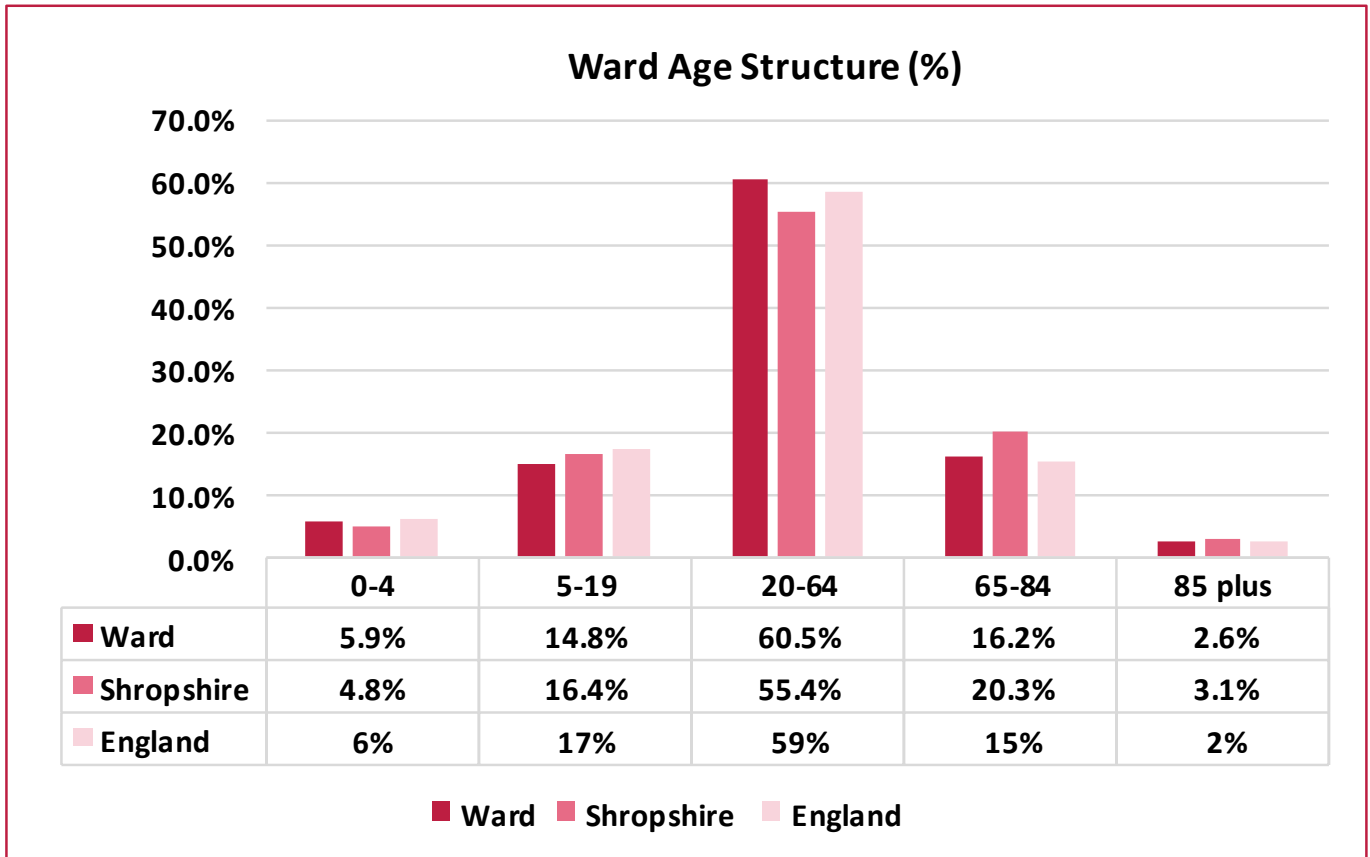

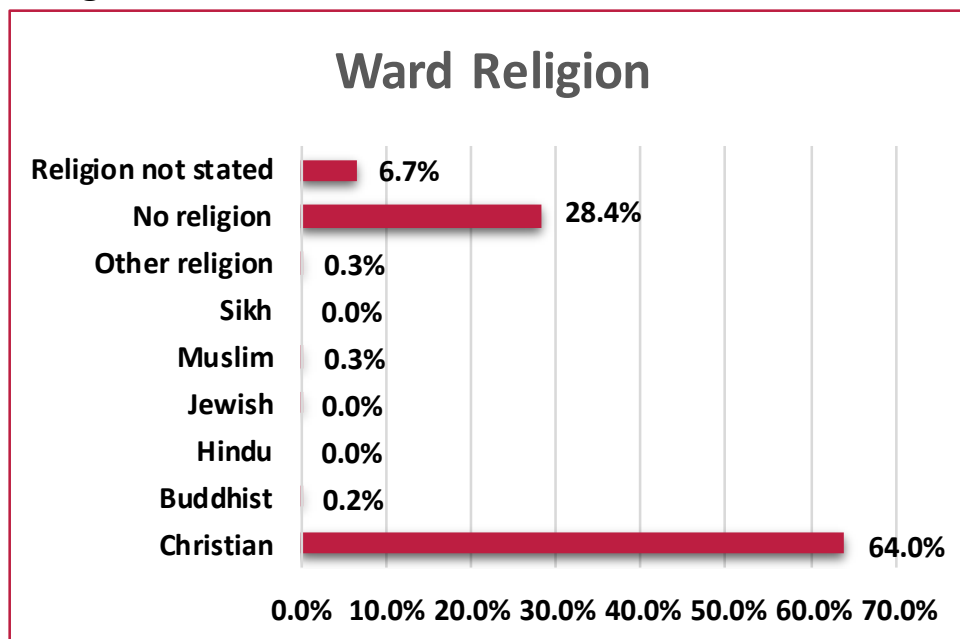
Mid year estimates for **2015**

Bagley Ward has **more people** aged **0-4** and **20-64** compared to **Shropshire** as a whole.

Bagley has a **lower rate of older people**, 65-84 and 85 plus, **compared** to Shropshire as a whole but higher than England.

Ethnicity

94.6% of People were White British, lower than Shropshire but higher than England.

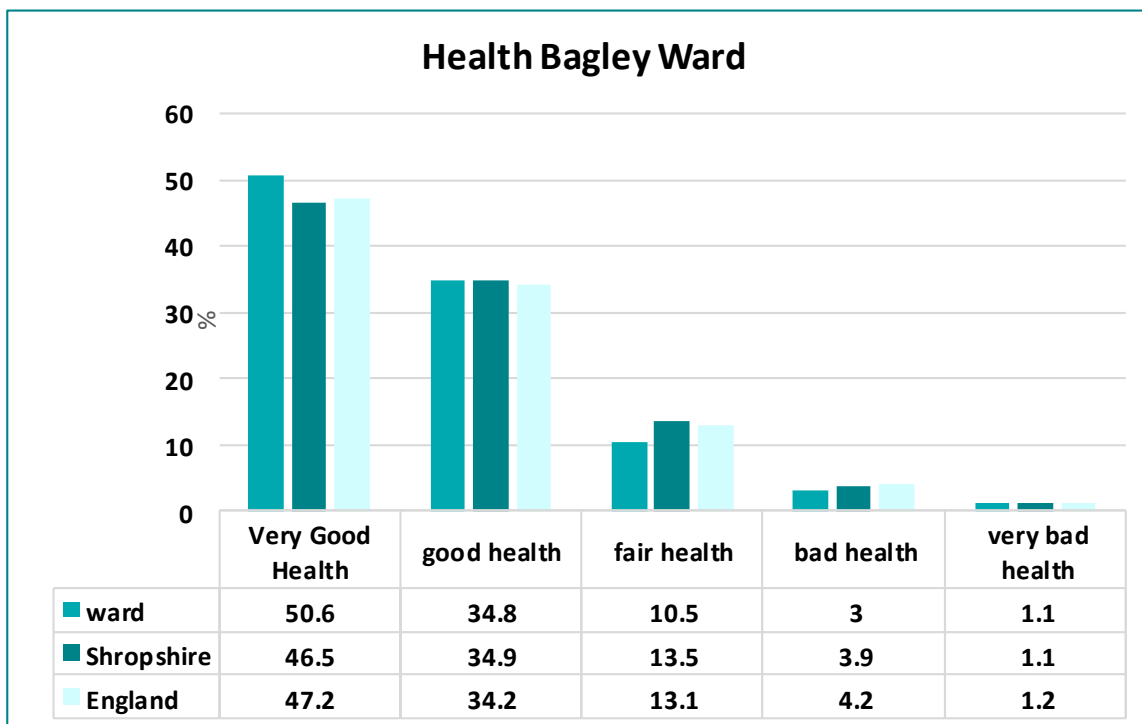
Health

Health Condition



At the time of the 2011 Census, **85% of residents** in Bagley Ward, said that they felt they were in **very good or good health**. This was **higher** than the Shropshire and England **average of 81%**.

6.1% of people provided in Bagley Ward **unpaid care for 1-19** hours per week, this was **lower** than **Shropshire as a whole**.

According to the Census 2011, **29.6%** of residents had a level 4 qualification or above, similar to Shropshire average of **29.4%**. There were more residents with low level qualifications than for Shropshire as a whole. **9.3%** had no qualifications compared to Shropshire figure of **14.0%**.

Economic Activity

The employment status of Bagley residents at the time of the 2011 Census showed **86.4%** of residents were economically active (this includes people who are both employed and actively seeking employment), this was greater than the Shropshire figure of **80.1%**. Of those who were economically active **82.4%** were in employment, **7.5%** were self-employed and **8.3%** were unemployed. This is compared with **75.8%**, **13.5%** and **5.4%** respectively for Shropshire.

13.6% of residents were economically inactive (these are people who are not seeking a job, and include those who are retired, full time students, looking after family or long term sick). This figure was lower than the Shropshire level of **19.9%**.

Unemployment

The Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) is payable to people under pensionable age who are available for, and actively seeking work. In October 2016 **0.8%** of resident people aged 16-64, were claiming JSA, this was slightly lower than the Shropshire figure of **1.1%** and **1.8%** for Great Britain.

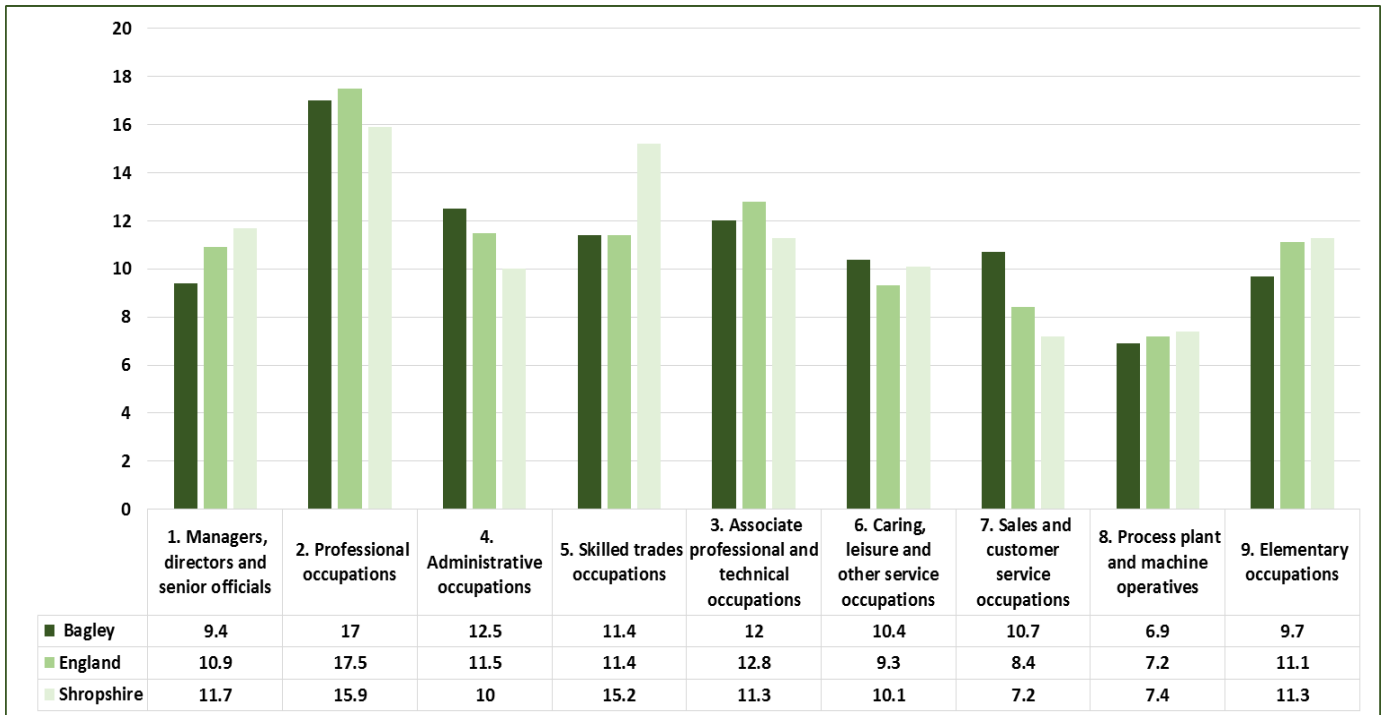

- Fewer people work in Skilled trades occupations roles, **11.4%** compared to **15.2%** for Shropshire

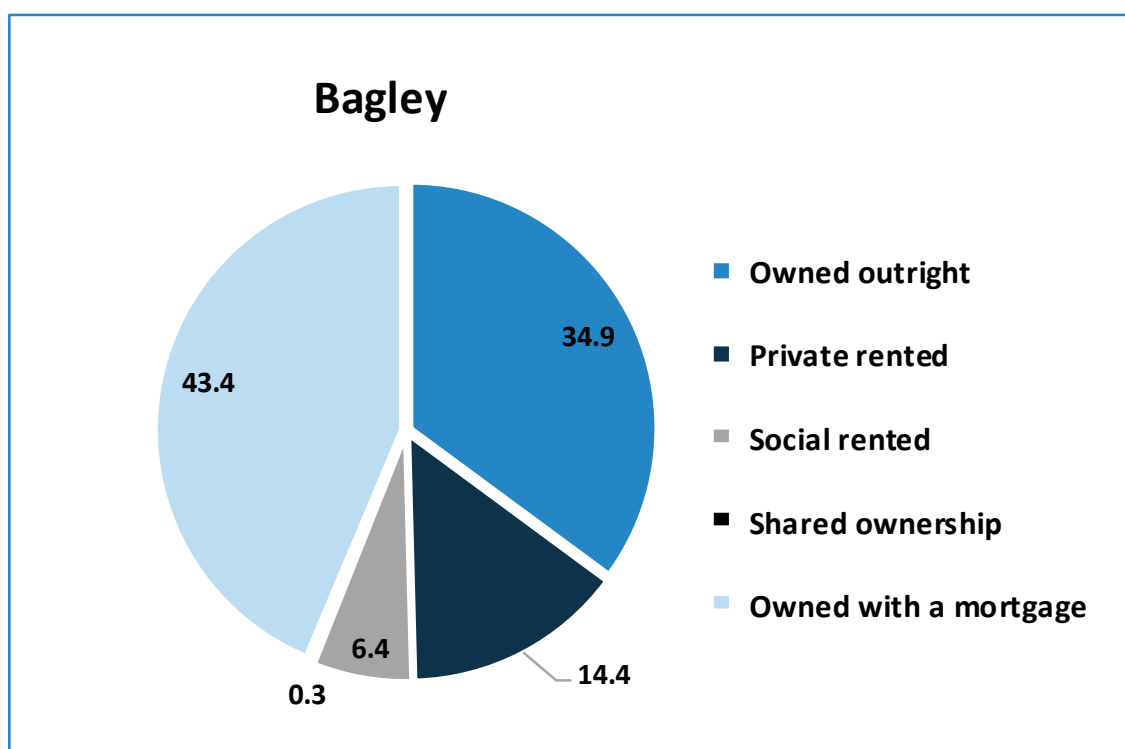
- **7.0%** of residents were self employed

The largest proportion (**43.4%**) of houses in Bagley Ward were owned with a mortgage or loan. This was greater than Shropshire (**30.6%**). **6.4%** of households were social rented housing, this was fewer than for Shropshire as a whole (**13.5%**) and fewer than for England (**17.7%**). Fewer households in Bagley Ward were private rented (**14.4%**) compared to **15%** for Shropshire.

Housing Type

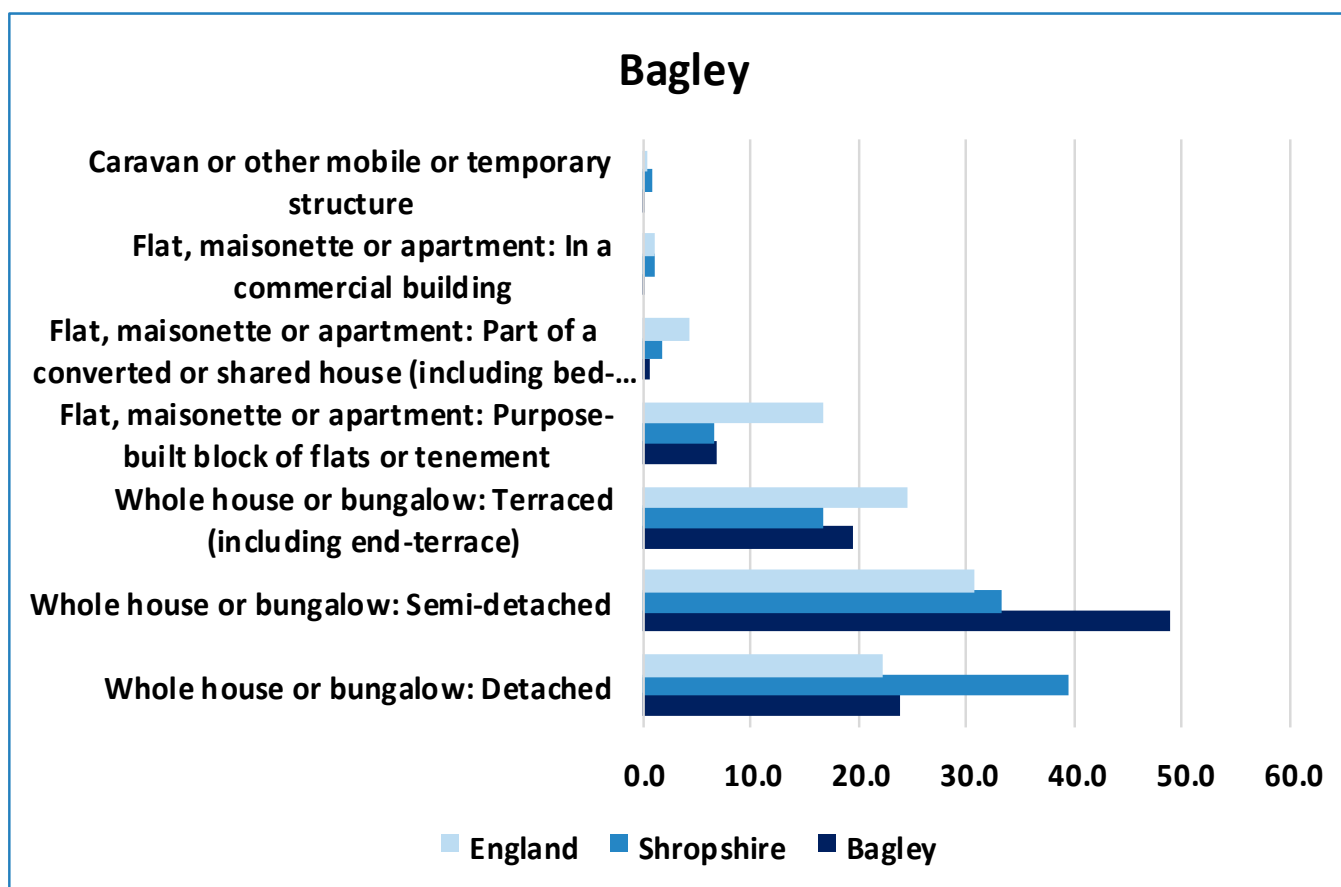
Fewer Bagley household spaces are detached properties (**23.8 %**) compared to Shropshire as a whole (**39.5%**).

A greater number of household spaces were semi-detached (**49.0%**) compared to Shropshire as a whole (**33.4%**).

A greater number of household spaces in Bagley Ward were terraced (including end-terrace) (**19.4%**) compared to Shropshire (**16.8%**).

Housing Composition

26% of households were One Person Households lower than the Shropshire average (**28.9%**) and England (**30.2%**).

6% of households were Lone Parent with dependent children higher than the Shropshire average (**5.2%**) and England (**7.1%**).

9.5% of households were One Person Pensioner aged 65 and over, lower than the Shropshire average of (**13.9%**) and England (**12.4%**).

16.8% of households were married couples with dependent children higher than the Shropshire average of (**14.9%**) and England (**12.3%**).

5.3% of households were co-habiting couples with dependent children higher than the Shropshire average of (**4.2%**) and England (**4.1%**).

Community Safety

Crime levels in Shropshire are **very low compared to national levels**. Crime and ASB are **low** in Bagley Ward. Relative to the rest of Shropshire, Bagley had the **53rd highest crime rate** per 1,000 population of all **63** Shropshire Wards.

Crime per 1000 Population in Bagley Ward was **25.8 lower than Shropshire average of 44.9**, and **lower than England and Wales 78.4**.

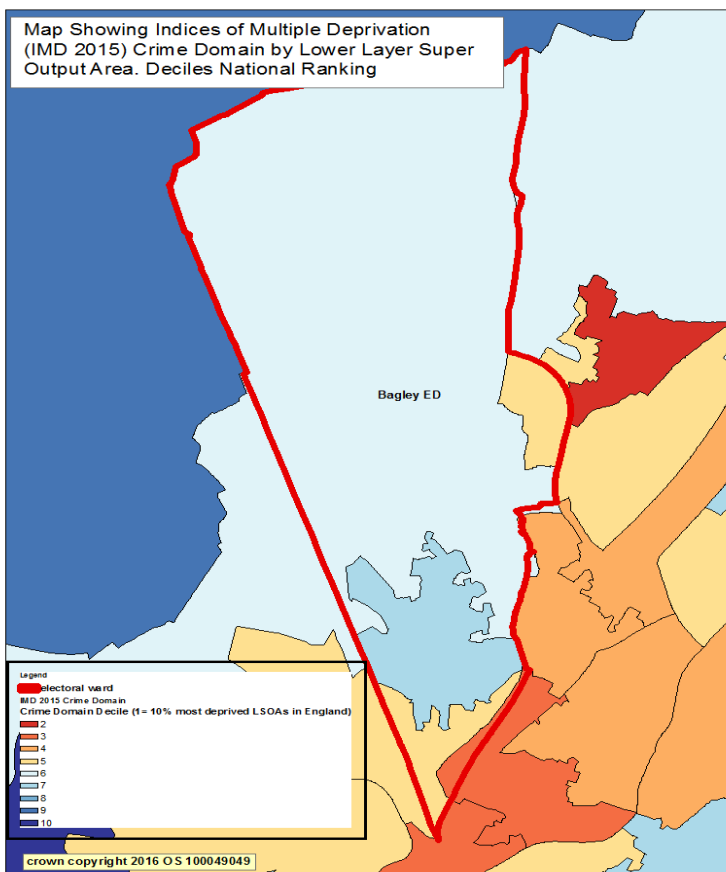

IMD 2015 Crime Domain

The **Crime Domain measures** the **risk** of personal or material **victimisation** at local level.

The indicators:

- The rate of **violence** per 1,000 at risk population
- The rate of **burglary** per 1,000 at risk properties
- The rate of **theft** per 1,000 at risk population
- The rate of **criminal damage** per 1,000 at risk population



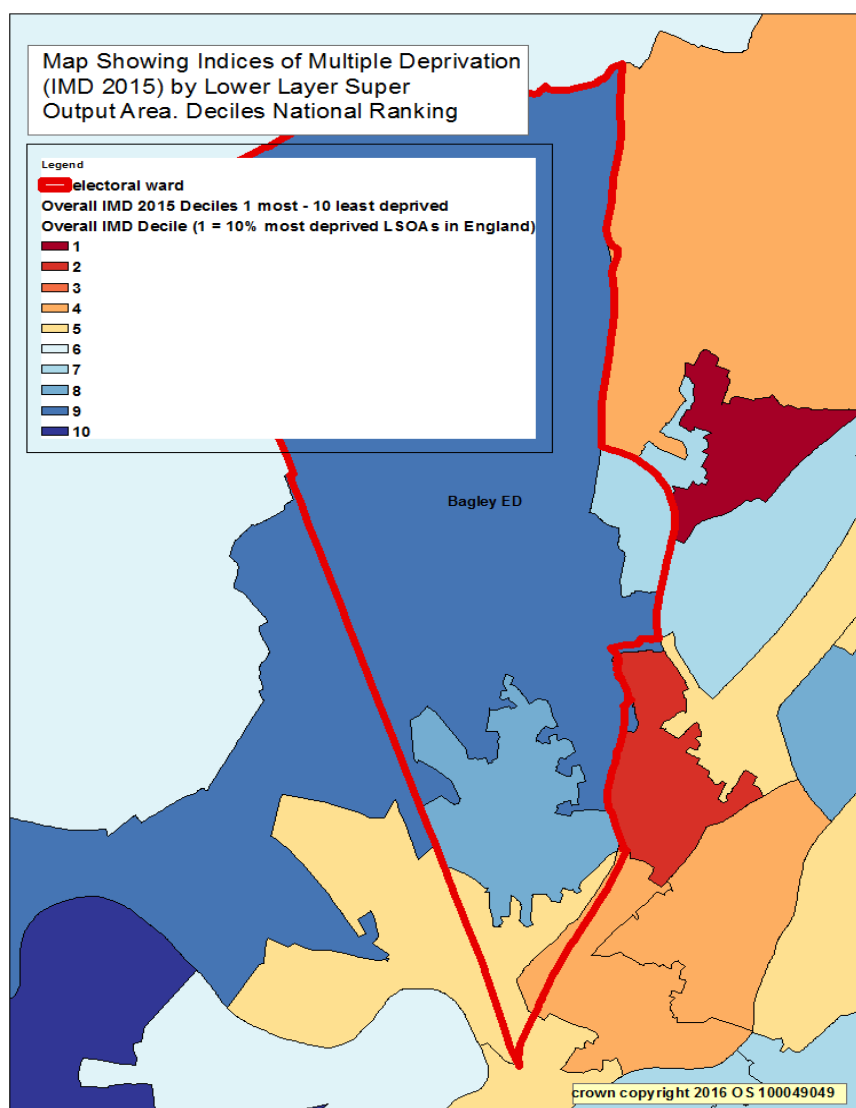
Bagley Ward has **low levels** of **crime** compared to national rankings.

When looking at the **four** lower super output areas (Iloa's) which cover the ward. Two of them are within the **decile 5** one of them is in **decile 6** and one in **decile 7** (decile one being the highest, decile 10 being the lowest) when compared with national levels.

Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD 2015)

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD 2015) is designed to identify areas where communities lack resources and are in need. To do this, seven factors are considered, which are:

- Income deprivation
- Employment deprivation
- Health deprivation and disability
- Education deprivation
- Barriers to housing and services
- Crime
- Living environment deprivation



There are 4 Lower layer Super Output Areas (LLSOA) which partially cover Bagley Ward.

These areas fall into the 5th, 7th and 8th deprived deciles nationally. The largest areas fall into the 9th and 8th deciles
