The modifications are not Positively prepared, justified or effective.

Para 4.120 makes specific reference to the river Clun SAC and the Nutrient Management Plan which was completed in October 2014. The NMP has errors in it, such as stating that employment numbers are the former garage site in Lydbury North will increase. The former garage site is LYD009, therefore it is reasonable to assume employment on the site will cease when it is redeveloped in line with the housing allocation for the site. Again the NMP has made no account of the proposed housing allocations in Lydbury North.

The NMP was published 9 months ago, however no mitigation measures have been proposed in the NMP, just various options.

As far as the writer is aware the action plan is yet to be published. The modifications in 4.120 anticipate that developers will be required to contribute to measures identified in the action plan. It is inappropriate for developers to contribute to upgrades to Severn Trent Water's sewage treatment works when the current treatment works do not meet the discharge target levels. Severn Trent Water is a publicly owned company which should bring the treatment works up to the required standards at their shareholders costs. Then only if further upgrade work is required to the treatment works to support the new development should contributions be sort from developers. Para 153 of the NPPF states that

"Each local planning authority should produce a Local Plan for its area. This can be reviewed in whole or in part to respond flexibly to changing circumstances. Any additional development plan documents should only be used where clearly justified. Supplementary planning documents should be used where they can help applicants make successful applications or aid infrastructure delivery, and should not be used Continue on a separate sheet if necessary

The supporting planning guidance states "Policies for seeking planning obligations should be set out in a Local Plan; neighbourhood plan and where applicable in the London Plan to enable fair and open testing of the policy at examination. Supplementary planning documents should not be used to add unnecessarily to the financial burdens on development and should not be used to set rates or charges which have not been established through development plan policy.

Planning obligations assist in mitigating the impact of development which benefits local communities and supports the provision of local infrastructure. Local communities should be involved in the setting of planning obligations policies in a Local Plan; neighbourhood plan and where applicable in the London Plan."

Para 204 of the NPPF states

" Planning obligations should only be sought where they meet all of the following tests:

necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms;

directly related to the development; and

fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development."

Therefore the proposal to identify additional measures to be funded by developer contributions does not meet the requirements of the NPPF for supplementary documents not to add to financial burdens on development and or to set rates or charges.

Reference to the NMP should be removed as the NMP does not reflect the allocations proposed in the draft SAMDEV.

If reference to the **published** NMP is to be retained then reference to the incorrect projections for Lydbury North in the NMP should be stated and a statement made that the council will work with the relevant authorities to correct the projections in line with the allocations within SAMDEV.

Clarification should be provided so that developer contributions will only be sought for upgrades to treatment works or other works which directly relate to the projected emissions generated by the proposed development.

The additional measures required to mitigate further emissions into the River Clun should be set out in the SAMDEV as required by the NPPF.
