To live in the village of Cheswardine a person will require transport as there is no public transport. The infrastructure is not sufficient to cope with the increase in use further, the roads flood in winter and summer causing erosion of the roads.

Market drayton is not a thriving town, many of the banks have closed, in fact Santandare is about to close. The shops consist of mainly charity shops and fast food shops which, already have emplyees, there are no NEW job opportunities.

Houses in the village are not selling at the moment despite the recent movement in the market.

People in the Market Drayton area are advertising for lodgers without success.

The spot shown on the map for development would appear to be a farm just off the main road. Here the road is very narrow and would require much work to make the road safe thus the change would not safeguard the landscape. There are no job opportunities in the village at all. Market drayton has few jobs, most in the village, and I include myself, traveo to work. I travel to Telford. Tis leads to increased use of the roads which are already in poor condition. This winter the roads flooded to the extent that diversions were put in place on two occasions to roads leading out of the village. The introduction of eleven houses would not foster economic development in so far as chewardine is concerned .it would simply add to the erosion of a small village further, by squashing houses into the village will destroy its character. Most households require two cars and the occupants will need to travel to work, there is no work in the village, again the infrastructure will not support this amount of movement. Houses should be built in built up areas where public transport both exhists and can be used or a person can walk to work. Most young people require assistance with costs of accommodation and transport and the most affordable way forward is to build in areas with public transport with already established infrasucture and close to a place of work. Affordable housing needs to be built in areas of work.
