The designation of Bayston Hill as a Community Hub is supported.

However, Bayston Hill has a large population and an extensive range of public services and facilities, including primary and secondary schools. It has a population of over 5,000 people, and is larger than some of the settlements identified as market towns or key settlements.

Nevertheless, only 50 -60 dwellings are to be built in Bayston Hill in the plan period. This is as a result of local desire rather than any objective assessment of the capacity of the settlement to absorb a greater number. This will represent a waste of existing resources and mean that a fully sustainable settlement is not advanced in any meaningful way.

The possibility of Bayston Hill accepting a greater level of housing should be examined, and additional housing allocated if it is found to have appropriate capacity.

This would make for good and efficient use of existing services and facilities, and would make the settlement more sustainable.

The 50-60 dwellings indicated in the draft SAMDev DPD as being provided within the plan period are expected to take place within the development boundary. Finding sites within the boundary to accommodate even 50-60 dwellings is going to be difficult, but it should be appreciated that if Bayston Hill were to accept a level of housing more appropriate to its population level and services and facilities available, then development outside the current boundary would be essential. At present the village is constrained by an artificially drawn boundary and it would be more useful and assist the goal of sustainable housing if new sites outside the current boundary were to be examined – such as the land off Gorse Lane - to ensure sufficient land is made available to accommodate growth.
